PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir ROBERT CHALMERS, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

ROBERT CHALMERS.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated June 24, 1899, the provisions of section 31 and the six following sections of "The Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, 1895," as amended by the Ordinance No. 23 of 1900, came into operation within the town of Matale, as set forth in the schedule thereto:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Proclamation in the manner shown in the schedule hereto:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by the said Ordinance, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation amend the first aforesaid Proclamation, with effect from July 1, 1915, in the manner shown in the schedule hereto.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Eighth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Fifteen.

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SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

Central Province, Matale District. The Part of the Proclamation of The said Pa

The said Part as amended by this Proclamation. Matale Town within Local Board Limits.

Matale Town.

June 24, 1899, to be amended.

Boundaries.---A line beginning at a point on the Sudu-ganga river 200 feet east of the North road near the Diyabubula bridge and running 200 feet east of and parallel to the North road till it meets the Brachmana-ela, thence along the ela eastwards to a point where it touches the boundary of the land belonging to the Ceylon Government Railway, thence northwards along the boundary of the said railway land to a point where it touches the Periaddewatta drain, thence along the drain to a point where it meets the Molandapitiya path, thence along the path to a point where it turns eastward, thence along the eastern boundary of the garden called Makulgahagedarawatta belonging to Kana Runa Marikar till it meets the southern boundary of the garden called Gedarawatta belonging to K. T. M. Marikar Tamby, thence westwards along the southern boundary of the said garden and northwards along its western boundary to a point on the Godapola road 150 feet east of the Gongawala road, thence crossing the Godapola road and westwards along it to a point where the Gongawala path branches off, thence along this path to a point 200 feet east of the North road. From this point a line running 200 feet east of and parallel to the North road and the Rattota road to a point 17¹/₂ miles from Kandy, thence crossing the Rattota road to a point 200 feet north-west of it, thence southwestwards along the Rattota road (parallel and to the north of it 200 feet from it) to a point 200 feet east of the North road, thence parallel to and 200 feet to the east of the North road to a point 171 miles from Kandy, thence crossing the North road to a point 200 feet west of it, thence southwards parallel to and west of the North road, King street, and the Esplanade road and 200 feet from them till it joins the Brachmana-ela, thence westwards along the Brachmana-ela \mathbf{to} and including the Pannagama bathing place, thence to a point 200 feet west of the District Road Committee Office, thence southwards parallel to and west of the road past the Kachcheri and 200 feet from it to a point 200 feet from the Hulangomuwa road, thence 200 feet from and parallel to the Hulangomuwa road, and north and west of it to the Kumbiyangoda-oya, thence along the Kumbiyangoda oya to a point 200 feet south of the Nagolla road, thence south and east of the Nagolla road parallel to and 200 feet from it to a point where it meets the northern boundary of lot 3782 on preliminary plan 982, thence eastwards along the said northern boundary and the northern boundary of title plan 72,867, the southern boundaries of title plans 124,224, 124,227, 124,229 to the south-eastern corner of the cemetery, thence in a line east south-east till it reaches the Moysey Crescent road, thence across that road and along the eastern boundary of lot 5936 on preliminary plan 1,841 till it reaches the Sudu-ganga river, thence along the Sudu-ganga river to the point whence the line started, excluding all the land which does not lie within 200 feet of the circle formed by the Hulangomuwa, Nagolla, and Layard's roads.

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Boundaries .- A line beginning at the railway bridge over the Sudu-ganga river east of the North road and running north-east and parallel to the North road along the Railway road till it meets the bridge over the Brachmana-ela, thence along the Brachmana-ela eastwards till it meets the Sudu-ganga river, thence along the Sudu-ganga river till it meets the Godapola stream, thence along the Godapola stream northwards and passing to the east of the Godapola spring until it reaches a point 100 yards east of the North road at Mandandawela, from this point a line running 100 yards east of and parallel to the North road and Rattota road to a point 171 miles from Kandy, thence crossing the Rattota road to a point 100 yards northwest of it, thence a line running southwest 100 yards north of and parallel to the Rattota road to a point 100 yards east of North road, thence a line running north parallel to and 100 yards to the east of the North road to a point in line with junction of the North road and Aluwihare road, thence a line crossing the North road to a point 100 yards west of it, thence a line running southwards 100 yards from and parallel to the North road to a point 100 yards north of the pansala path, and thence north-west-wards 100 yards from and parallel to the pansala path to a point 100 feet north of Harasgama bathing place, thence a line running westwards 100 feet from and parallel to the dam of the Harasgama bathing place and across the paddy fields till it reaches a point 100 yards beyond and on the west of the Harasgama path, thence a line running southwards and westwards 100 yards west of and parallel to the Harasgama path till it reaches a point 100 yards to the north of Agalawatta path, thence a line running southwards and westwards 100 yards west of and parallel to the Agalawatta path till it reaches a point 100 yards west of the reservoir, thence a line running southwards 100 yards to west of and parallel to the Ponamada path crossing the Wiltshire road to a point 100 yards to the west of the Wiltshire road, thence a line running southwards 100 yards west of and parallel to the Wiltshire road to a point 100 yards from the Hulangomuwa road, thence southwards 100 yards to the west of and parallel to the Hulangomuwa road to the Kumbiyangoda-oya, thence along the Kumbiyangoda-oya to a point 100 yards south of the Nagolla road, thence northwards 100 yards east of and parallel to the Nagolla road to a point 100 yards from the Moysey Crescent, thence eastwards 100 yards south of and parallel to the Moysey Crescent till it meets the southern boundary of lot 6001 in preliminary plan 1,871 which belongs to the Crown, thence eastwards along this boundary and till it crosses the Sudu-ganga river, and thence along the eastern bank of the Sudu-ganga river till it meets the railway bridge, and thence along the railway bridge to the point at which the line started.

PROCLAMATION.

ROBERT CHALMERS.

HEREAS it is desirable further to amend Our Proclamation in pursuance of the said "The Necessaries of War • Exportation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1914," dated the 9th day of April, 1915, and published in the *Government* Gazette No. 6,709 of the 16th April, 1915 :

Know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, do hereby amend the said Proclamation as follows :----

- 1. Item No. 13 :--
- IN SCHEDULE A.
- (a) For the heading "Salicylic acid and salicylate of soda" there shall be substituted the heading "Salicylic acid, salicylate of soda, and methyl salicylate." (b) For the heading "Thorium nitrate" there shall be substituted the heading "Thorium oxide,
- thorium nitrate, and other salts of thorium."
- (c) The following heading shall be substituted immediately after the heading "Thymoi and its preparations " :-
 - "Toluol and mixtures containing toluol."
- 2. Item No. 37 shall be deleted and the following item substituted therefor :-
 - 37. Lubricants, the following :-
 - (1) Mineral.-Including mineral oils, jellies, or greases of all kinds, pure or compounded; graphite, natural or artificial.
 - (2) Vegetable.—Including vegetable lubricating oils and fats of all kinds, and resin greases, and their mixtures.
 - (3) Animal.—Including all animal oils and fats for use as lubricants, and their mixtures.
 - (4) Fish.—Including whale oil (train, blubber, sperm), seal or shark oil, and fish oil generally; and mixtures or compounds of any of the foregoing.
- 3. Item No. 39, after the heading "Aluminium and alloys of aluminium " there shall be inserted the heading " Alunite."
 - 4. The following item shall be inserted immediately after item No. 42 and numbered 42 A :---
 - 42 A. Neat's foot oil.
 - 5. Item No. 45 shall be deleted.
 - 6. Item No. 56 shall be deleted and the following item substituted therefor :-
 - 56. Rubber (including raw, waste, and reclaimed rubber, solutions containing rubber, jellies containing rubber, or any other preparations containing rubber), and goods made wholly of rubber; including tyres for motor vehicles and for cycles, together with articles or materials specially adapted for use in the manufacture or repair of tyres.
 - The following item shall be inserted immediately after item No. 57 and numbered 57 A :---7. 57 A. Sheepgut.
 - 8. For item No. 59 there shall be substituted the following :---

59. Sheepskins, whether woolled or not.

9. For item No. 73 there shall be substituted the following :-

73. Vessels, boats, and craft of all kinds, floating docks, and their distinctive component parts.

- 1. The following item shall be inserted immediately after item No. 4 and marked 4 A :---4 A. Binder twine.
- 2. The following item shall be inserted immediately after item No. 9 and numbered $9 \, \text{a} :=$ 9 A. Cotton, raw.
- 3. Item No. 13 shall be deleted.
- 4. The following item shall be inserted immediately after item No. 18 and numbered 18 A:---18 A. Lacs of all kinds, including shallac, gum lac, seed lac, but not including lac dye.
- 5. The following item shall be inserted immediately after item No. 20 and numbered 20 A :-20 A. Machinery, metal working.

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W HEREAS by Our Proclamation dated the 6th day of January, 1915, published in the Government Gazette No. 6,693, dated the 8th January, 1915, certain articles were declared to be Contraband of War:

And whereas by Our Proclamation dated the 26th day of March, 1915, published in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,706 of the same date, certain additions and amendments were made to the said Proclamation :

Know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, do hereby proclaim that by a Proclamation issued by His Majesty the King on the 27th day of May, 1915, the articles contained in the schedule hereto were added to the list of Absolute Contraband in Our Proclamation dated the 6th day of January, 1915, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,693 of the 8th January, 1915.

And further, that by the said Proclamation His Majesty the King has amended item 4 of Absolute Contraband in Our Proclamation of the said 6th day of January, 1915, by the omission of the words "and all other metallic acetates" after the words "calcium acetate."

And further, that by the said Proclamation His Majesty the King has amended Our Proclamation dated the said 26th day of March, 1915, by deleting the words "other than linseed oil" and adding "linseed oil" to list of Conditional Contraband published therein.

We, therefore, the said Governor, do hereby declare that the said Proclamation of His Majesty the King is in force in the Colony of Ceylon, and do call upon His Majesty's subjects and all other persons being in the said Colony to govern themselves accordingly.

"THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE, No. 13 OF 1896."

Kataragama Pilgrimage.

IN terms of rule No. 12 of regulations framed under Ordinance No. 13 of 1896 for the conduct of the Kataragama pilgrimage, it is hereby notified for general information that any person proceeding to Ruhunu Maha Kataragama Dewale at Kataragama during Ehela and Ilmaha Kachchi Festivals without first obtaining a permit from the Government Agents or Assistant Government Agents of the respective districts will be liable, under section 2 of the aforesaid Ordinance, to a fine not exceeding Rs. 1,000, or to rigorous or simple imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year.

"THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE, NO. 13 OF 1896."

THE following rules and orders made by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under Ordinance No. 13 of 1896, entitled "An Ordinance relating to Pilgrimages," for the conduct of the Kataragama pilgrimage and festival, where special precautions have been and are necessary, are published for general information, in lieu of the rules promulgated annually for several years.

Rules.

 For sanitary reasons the duration of the Kataragama festival and of the stay of pil(rims at Kataragama shall be and it is hereby limited to 16 days, namely, from July 12 to 27, 1915, inclusive. Pilgrims arriving before the day first named or staying beyond the period here prescribed shall be guilty of an offence.
 It shall be lawful for the Police authorities or any Police Magistrate at any

2. It shall be lawful for the Police authorities or any Police Magistrate at any place on the line of march to prohibit from proceeding all persons who, by reason of disease, infirmity, weakness, advanced age, youth, want of supplies, or other sufficient cause, are considered unfit to undertake the journey, or who appear likely to fall ill and endanger the health of others; and to require such persons to find security to ensure their obedience to the orders so given. In default of such security being found, it shall be lawful for the said Police authorities or Police Magistrate to detain such persons in custody for a period not exceeding three days.

Magistrate to detain such persons in custody for a period not exceeding three days. 3. In the event of an epidemic breaking out at Kataragama during the festival, it shall be lawful for the officers appointed to enforce the observance of orders to declare the festival at an end, and to direct pilgrims at once to leave the village and proceed to their homes, and to prescribe the roads they have to travel.

4. The officers appointed to enforce the observance of orders shall have power on the line of march to and from Kataragama and at Kataragama—

> (a) To appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water and drinking, and for natural offices.

- (b) To appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims.
 - (c) To prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims.

(d) To regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims.

(e) To fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them, and to detain them if unfit to travel.

Any person disobeying an order given by the appointed officers shall be guilty of an offence.

5. The Police are empowered and required to seize and destroy all food condemned as unwholesome on the march or in camp by the Medical Officer, or, if there be none, by the Chief Officer of Police ; and any person resisting or obstructing the Police in the discharge of this or of any other duty prescribed by these rules shall be deemed guilty of an affence.

6. Any person bringing any cattle or cart bulls within three miles of the camp shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

7. Any person selling meat in camp in any other place than that assigned for the purpose by the officer in charge of the camp, and any other person selling food condemned as unwholesome by the Medical Officer, or in his absence by the Chief Officer of Police, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

8. Any person who shall, during the occupation of the camp, use any other place for offices of nature than that provided for the purpose by Government, or failing to cover the deposit with earth or sand, and any person who shall during the same period bathe in or enter the river above the spot appointed by the officer in charge of the camp, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

9. Any person suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and not reporting the same to the Medical Officer, or in his absence to the Chief Officer of Police, and any person abetting or assisting in the concealment of such disease, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

10. All persons shall take up the quarters assigned to them by the Chief Officer of Police at the halting places and in the camp, and any person declining or neglecting to do so shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

11. The number of pilgrims for the pilgrimage of the year 1915 is restricted to 1,750.

12. No person shall proceed on the pilgrimage in the year 1915 without having first obtained ticket from the Government Agent of the Western Province for the Colombo band, or from the Government Agent of the North-Central Province for the Anuradhapura band, or from the Government Agent of the Southern Province for the Galle band, or from the Government Agent of the North-Western Province for the Batticaloa Band, or from the Government Agent of the Eastern Province for the Batticaloa Band, or from the Government Agent of the Northern Province for the Jaffna band, or from the Government Agent of the Province of Uva for the Badulla band, or from the Government Agent of the Province of Sabaragamuwa for the Ratnapura band, or from the Government Agent of the Central Province for the Kandy band.

13. Every person proceeding on the pilgrimage shall show his ticket when required to do so by any officer of Police, or by any officer appointed to enforce the observance of orders under the Ordinance aforesaid.

14. The transfer of a ticket by the person named in it and the use of it by any other person are forbidden.

"" THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTRATION ORDINANCE, 1895."

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BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. Board to keep a Register of all Dairymen and Milk Vendors.—The Board shall keep a register of the names and addresses of all dairymen and milk vendors selling or supplying milk to any person or persons resident within the limits of the Board, and of all dairy premises and milk stores used from time to time by each of them for the production, deposit, or distribution of such milk.

2. To strike off the Register all who are disqualified.—The Board shall strike off such register the names and addresses of all persons who shall have ceased, or become disqualified as hereinafter provided, to carry on the business of dairymen or milk vendors.

3. To cause Dairy Premises to be inspected.—The Board shall cause to be inspected all such dairy premises and milk stores, and the cattle, appliances, and utensils therein used for the production or distribution of milk.

4. Powers of the Government Agent to enter Dairy Premises or Milk Stores.—The Government Agent shall be at liberty to enter or authorize the entry of any person at all reasonable times into or upon any dairy premises or milk store for the purpose of making any inspection, and to take away or authorize the taking away of samples of the milk there found, and of the water of any well or other source of water supply therein or thereon, for the purposes of examination or analysis only.

5. Dairymen to keep Dairy Premises in & sanitary condition.—The Government Agent may require any dairyman or milk vendor, by notice in writing, to cleanse and maintain in a sanitary condition his dairy premises or milk store and any utensils therein used as aforesaid. Failure on the part of such dairyman or milk vendor to act in accordance with such notice shall constitute an offence punishable under section 107 of "The Local Boards Ordinance, 1898."

6. Dairymen to close Well, &c., if the Water is unwholesome.—The Government Agent shall require any dairyman or milk vendor, by notice in writing, to close any well or other source of water supply in or on his dairy premises or milk store, or used in connection therewith, which is so polluted or unwholesome as to be unfit for human consumption, and to wholly discontinue the use of the water thereof for any purpose whatsoever, for such period as the Government Agent shall direct, or to fill up the said well or source of water supply, and keep the same so filled up. Failure on the part of such dairyman or milk vendor to act in accordance with such notice shall constitute an offence punishable[°] under section 107 of "The Local Boards Ordinance, 1898."

7. Dairymen and others to apply for Registration.—(a) Every dairyman and milk vendor engaged or intending to engage in the sale or supply of milk to any person or persons within the limits of the Board shall apply to the Board to cause to be entered on the register his name and place of residence and the situation of every dairy premises and milk store used or intended to be used by him, and thence-forward from time to time any change of such residence or discontinuance by him to use any former, or commencement by him to use any other dairy premises or milk store.

(b) Immediately upon such registration, and whilst the same continues in force, every such dairyman and milk vendor shall in some conspicuous place affix to and maintain in legible letters his name and the words "Registered Dairyman" or "Registered Milk Vendor," as the case may be, upon every dairy premises or milk store in respect of which he is so registered, and to and upon every cart or other yehicle used by him for the distribution of milk.

8. Dairy Premises, &c., in an insanitary condition will not be registered.—The Government Agent shall refuse or cancel the registration of any dairyman or milk vendor in respect of any dairy premises or milk store which is in an insanitary condition, or in which the provisions for lighting, ventilation, drainage, lavatory, and privy accommodation, or water supply are not such as are necessary for health, or for the cleanliness of the appliances and utensils used therein, or for the protection of any milk therein against infection or contamination.

9. Unregistered Persons forbidden to sell Milk.—It shall not be lawful for any person to sell milk to any person or persons within the limits of the Board if his name and place of residence and dairy premises and milk store used for the purpose of the production, deposit, or distribution of any such milk are not entered upon the register of the Board.

10. Infectious Disease in Dairy Premises, &c., to be reported immediately.—On the appearance of any case of infectious disease in man or beast in any dairy premises or milk store, the occupier and also the medical practitioner'attending the case shall immediately report in writing such case to the Board.

11. Dairymen to supply Names and Addresses of Customers.—Whenever it shall appear to the Government Agent, or be certified to the Board by any medical practitioner, that the spread of infectious disease is in his opinion attributable to the milk supplied by any dairyman or milk vendor, the Government Agent may require such dairyman or milk vendor wholly to discontinue such supply, distribution, and sale of milk, and to furnish forthwith, upon demand, a full and complete list of names and addresses of all his customers, and to give such assistance to discover the residence of all or any of them as the Government Agent may deem necessary. Failure on the part of such dairyman or milk vendor to act in accordance with such notice shall constitute an offence punishable under section 107 of "The Local Boards Ordinance, 1898."

Persons suffering from Infectious Diseases or having been recently exposed to Infection not to take part in Dairy Operations .- No person following the trade of a dairy farmer, cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or being the occupier of a milk store or milk shop, shall knowingly allow any person suffering from any infectious disease, or having recently been exposed to infection from a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk, or in any way to take part or to assist in the conduct of the trade or business of the dairy farmer, cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or occupier of any milk store or milk shop, as far as regards the production, distribution, or storage of milk, until he shall have shown to the satisfaction of the Government Agent that all danger of communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

Sale or supply of unwholesome Milk forbidden.-It shall not be lawful for any 13. person selling milk to any person or persons resident within the limits of the Board to store, keep, or deposit any milk in any room used for sleeping or dwelling in, or in any other place or way calculated to render such milk unwholesome or injurious to health, or to sell any milk which shall have been produced from any diseased animal, or which shall have been in any place or way exposed to infection from any person suffering from any infectious disease, or which shall have been upon or in any dairy premises or milk store from which the sale of milk has been directed to be discontinued on account of infectious disease as provided in section 11.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 19, 1915.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 96 (4 Burghers, 58 Sinhalese, 16 Tamils, 13 Moors, 4 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1915, viz., 247,397) was 20.2, as against 17.3 in the preceding week, 22.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.2 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 140 (4 Europeans, 7 Burghers, 67 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 22 Moors, 6 Malays, and 7 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.5, as against 28.7 in the previous week, 26.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26.7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 140 total deaths, 35 were of infants under one year of age, as against 32 in the preceding week, 28 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.---The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

Principal Causes of Death.—Nineteen deaths from Phthisis were registered, as against 13 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 8 were in Maradana (including 5 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 4 in St. Paul's, 2 in Slave Island, 1 in Pettah, Lin Kotahena, 1 in New Bazaar, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta.

2. Sixteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 18 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Maradana (including 2 deaths of hon-residents in hospitals), 4 in St. Paul's, 2 in Kotahena, 2 in Slave Island, 1 in Fort and Galle Face, 1 in New Bazaar, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta. Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

3. One death from *Enteric Fever* was registered (in Kotahena), as against 5 in the previous week and 2 the ψ weekly average for last year.

4. No deaths from *Smallpox* were registered either in this or in the preceding week. No cases were reported.

5. No deaths from *Plague* were registered during this or the preceding two weeks. No cases were reported this week.

6. Seventeen deaths from Debility were registered, 8 from Infantile Convulsions, 6 from Diarrhaa, 6 from Worms, 6 from Enteritis, 4 from Dysentery, 1 from Tetanus, and 53 from Other Causes.

7. Three cases of *Chickenpox* were reported, as against 1 in the previous week. One case of *Measles* was reported. There were none in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was $82 \cdot 1^{\circ}$, against $83 \cdot 6^{\circ}$ in the preceding week and $80 \cdot 2^{\circ}$ in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was $29 \cdot 805$ in., against $29 \cdot 755$ in. in the preceding week and $29 \cdot 828$ in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was $2 \cdot 34$ in., against 0.45 in. in the preceding week and $3 \cdot 90$ in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
