Australia, South-Tasmania, South Coast-Cape Bruny-Alteration in Light.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 277, dated September 27, 1902, issued by this office, the British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 154 of 1903) that on April 1, 1903, a white flashing light about every twenty-two seconds, thus: flash, three seconds; eclipse, nineteen and a half seconds, will be established on Cape Bruny, D'Entrecasteaux channel; it will be elevated 346 ft. above high water, and visible in clear weather from a distance of 22 miles. The light is dioptric of the second order, and shown from the same tower as the former light.

The provisional white revolving light will be dis-

continued on the same date.
