#### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Municipal Office on Friday, March 13, 1903.

THE Council met this day at 3 P M., pursuant to notice dated March 7, 1903.

Present:—Mr. A. S. Pagden, Chairman; the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, C.M.G.; Mr. F. H. Grinlinton; Major A. W. de Wilton; Dr. C. W. van Geyzel; Dr. A. Perry; Mr. F. C. Allen; Mr. Chas. Perera; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. James Peiris; Mr. H. A. Jayewardene; Dr. Solomon Fernando; Mr. M. L. M. Zainudeen; the Hon. Mr. Stanley Bois; and Dr. W. H. de Silva.

The Minutes of February 13, 1903, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council. were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of February 13, 1903, be confirmed.

- 1. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera asked—When the notices of assessment, under section 133 of Municipal. Councils Ordinance, were issued this year, and moved for papers.
  - The Chairman replied that the notices were issued between January 16 and 21.
- 2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera asked—When the notices to taxpayers in regard of the tax on vehicles and animals, under section 9 of chapter IX. of Ordinance No. 16 of 1881, were issued this year, and whether the statement inserted at the foot thereof has been authorized by Council or the Ordinance, and moved for papers.

The Chairman replied that the notices were issued in January and some in February, and that the footnote was not authorized by Council or the Ordinance, and that Ordinance No. 7 of 1887 did not appear to require notices to

be issued.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera asked—Whether the Chairman has licensed, under section 7 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1901, all the electric tram cars now in use, and what extent of space in each car has been allotted to each passenger, and moved for papers.

The Chairman replied in the affirmative, and stated that the sitting space was ascertained by actual experiment,

and a reasonable amount of standing room allowed.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera asked - Why copies of the by-laws of this Council sent to the Clerk of the Legislative Council, in terms of section 7 of Ordinance No. 8 of 1901, were not circulated among the Members of this Council, in terms of the resolution No. 3 of this Council of March 14, 1902, and moved for papers.

The Chairman stated that it was due to an oversight, and that copies have been sent to Members since.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera asked-Whether all the papers laid on the Council table, unless such as for any reason may be marked confidential, are not available to the press, and moved for papers.

The Chairman replied that all printed papers which are circulated among Members are available to the press

after the items in the Agenda Paper are disposed of, unless for any special reason publication was not desirable.

- 6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera asked—Whether a book is kept as an index for reference to legal opinions received by the Council on matters in which it has consulted its legal advisers, and moved for papers. The Chairman replied in the affirmative.
- 7. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera asked.--Whether the Chairman receives monthly reports from the Superintendent of Works as to the general condition and maintenance of the tramway routes, and moved for papers. The Chairman replied in the affirmative.
- 8. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera moved That the said reports when received be laid on the table at the monthly Meetings of this Council.

The Chairman stated it would be done.

9. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera asked—Whether the electric main laid to Kollupitiya had been tested, in terms of the 7th section of the rules passed under section 25 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1902, before it was used for the supply of current, and moved for papers.

The Chairman replied that Boustead Brothers had assured him that such was the case.

10. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera moved—That in future when an accident occurring in the tramways is, under section 28 of 19 of 1901, reported to the Chairman, such report be laid on the table at the monthly Meeting of Council, and by leave of Council amended his motion by substituting the words "rule No. 28 of the rules framed under section 19 of Ordinance No. 9 of 1901," for the words "section 28 of 19 of 1901."

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

11. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera asked-What progress has been made with the town plan as regards the survey for assessment purposes, what amount has been spent thereon, and what work has been done, and moved for

The Chairman replied that the whole of the field work has been completed, with the exception of the Slave Island and Kollupitiya Wards, and that the cost up to date is Rs. 5,849.01.

12. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera asked-Whether for lighting the electric arc lamps in the Fort the current used is from the underground main laid from Galle Buck station, or from the overhead wire running from the central station at Gasworks street, and moved for papers.

The Chairman replied that Messrs. Boustead Brothers have informed him that the current used was from the

underground mains.

13. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera asked-Whether any person or persons have been appointed Electric Inspectors in terms of section 51 of the rules under section 25 of 7 of 1902, and moved for papers.

The Chairman replied in the negative.

14. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera asked-Whether in all cases of the supply of electricity to the premises of private consumers reports have been received certifying to the due observance of the provisions of section 41 of the rules under section 25 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1902.

The Chairman replied that no reports have been received.

15. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera moved—That letter No. 147 of October 24, 1902, from the Colonial Secretary, be laid on the table, and made available to the press for publication.

The letter was laid on the table, and the Chairman stated that the letter was available to the press.

Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved his motion—That the Municipal Superintendent of Works be appointed to be the officer under section 21 of the by-laws regarding tramways under Ordinance No. 9 of 1901.

Mr. F. H. Grinlinton seconded.—Carried. Mr. C. Perera dissenting.

- 17. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—That this Council do authorize the Chairman to incur the necessary expense of getting the necessary analysis in connection with the septic tank experiment authorized by Council on October 10, 1902, done by Mr. Bamber, the Acting City Analyst not having the time to devote to it.

  Mr. F. H. Grinlinton seconded.—Carried.
- 18. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved—That with reference to the contract No. 652 of September 6, 1901, between the Municipal Council and the Colombo Gas and Water Company, Limited, the Chairman be authorized to incur an expenditure of Rs. 3,200 in causing the existing street lamps, some 70 in number, at present supported on brackets attached to private property, to be replaced by columns in the public streets, and that the necessary provision be made in the Supplemental Budget.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.-Carried.

19. Pursuant to notice, Dr. C. W. van Geyzel called attention of the Council to the imperfect notification of cases of typhoid, and moved, that the Sanitary and Law Committees be asked to re-consider section 3 of Municipal Ordinance, No. 3 of 1897, and the Regulation, part I., 22, framed thereunder, with a view to ensure in the future early and efficient notification of typhoid cases.

Dr. C. W. van Geyzel moved his motion, and with leave of Council added the words "with the co-operation of the Medical Officer of Health" after the words "Law Committees be asked" in line 4 of his motion.

The motion so amended was seconded by Dr. W. H. de Silva and carried.

20. Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. A. Jayawardene moved—That this Council do consider the desirability of opening a road from St. Sebastian Hill near Lock-gate to the court-house premises along the existing footpath, and that the matter be referred to the Works Committee.

The Chairman seconded.—Carried.

The following extracts from Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of February 18 and 27, 1903, Standing Committee on Municipal Works of February 26 and March 6, 1903, and Standing Committee on Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of February 27, 1903, were laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated :-

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of February 18, 1903.

(6) Papers with reference to conveyance allowance to special Inspectors.

The Committee approve of payment of such conveyance allowance to Inspectors when engaged on inspection work, as the Medical Officer of Health considers desirable, the total not to exceed Rs. 150 a month.

(32) Application from contractor for 1903, Mr. P. D. S. Wijeyratne, for expenses incurred on account of

neglect of night soil contractor for 1902.

The Standing Committee approve of the payment of the claim of Rs. 588. They note that fines to the extent of some Rs. 250 have been levied on the old contractor, and that the new contractor has worked very well, and by his action in January has ensured the success of his contract, which will result in a saving of some Rs. 13,000 to the Council during 1903. Approved the expenditure, subject to the approval of the Standing Committee on Sanitation. To be provided in Supplemental Budget. (See No. 7 of Standing Committee on Sanitation of February 27, 1903.)

(22) Estimate for repair of drain, Cemetery street, Kotahena, Rs. 153.

Approved. To be provided in Supplemental Budget. (Passed by Works Committee, No. 14 of February 26, 1903.)

(26) Papers with reference to lake fly nuisances, Rs. 123.37.

Approved the expenditure if necessary for trying the experiment suggested by Superintendent of Works in one lamp (see letter of February 6, 1903, from Manager, Gas Company). To be provided in Supplemental Budget.

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of February 27, 1903.

(7) Letter No. 24 of February 16, 1903, from Medical Officer of Health, with reference to whitewashing public latrines. The Committee are of opinion that the latrines should be whitewashed monthly.

(8) Daily reports of Sanitary Inspectors sent to Ward Members (Resolution of Council, March 11, 1902). The Committee recommend to Council that the reports should be sent out after working hours, and

returned by the Member at the time the office opens the following day, otherwise the work of the Medical Officer of Health is likely to be impeded.

(11) Letter No. 34 of February 27, 1903, from Medical Officer of Health, with reference to St. John's

fish market. The Committee strongly support the Medical Officer of Health's proposal to secure this market from vagrants at night, and would ask the Superintendent of Works to frame an estimate to provide for it.

(12) Papers with reference to Edinburgh market.

The Committee approve of the construction of a temporary shed opposite the new gala, to provide for the overflow of the Edinburgh market. Superintendent of Works should furnish estimates.

Advertisements as annexed marked X and Y recommended to Council. The Committee advise that the selections be left to Mr. Cooper, in the same way as was done in the case of the Medical Officer of Health by leaving them to Dr. Perry

Approved.

(7) Estimate for improvement of stables, dog pound, &c., Rs. 6,150.95. Approved.

The Chairman moved—That the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of February 18, 1903, be adopted.

The Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper seconded.—Carried. Mr. C. Perera dissenting as regards item 32.

The Chairman moved—That the recommendation of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of February 27, 1903, be adopted.

The Hon, Mr. F. A. Cooper seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman moved-That the items and recommendations of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of February 26, 1903, be adopted.

The Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman moved-That item 7 (estimate for improvements of stables, dog pound, &c.) be passed, and that item No. 5 (estimate for erecting a cadjan shed for a temporary market) be referred to the Committee on Municipal Works for the purpose of ascertaining inter alia whether galvanized roofing should not be substituted for

Major A. W. de Wilton seconded.—Carried.

With reference to item 3, the Chairman moved that Council do go into Committee.

Mr. James Peiris seconded.

The Chairman moved-That Council do resume, and that the advertisements be approved, and that Mr. F. A. Cooper be asked to be good enough to report on the applications and forward them to the Council with his recommendations, and that in the event of any of the candidates selected by the Council being resident in the United Kingdom, Mr. F. A. Cooper be authorized to enter into the necessary agreements with the candidates so selected on behalf of the Council, and further, that during the currency of the agreements Mr. Dassenaike's position as First Assistant to the Superintendent of Works remain unaltered.

Major A. W. de Wilton seconded. Carried.—Mr. C. Perera dissenting, and Mr. C. P. Dias also dissenting as

regards the salaries only.

Extracts from Minutes of Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of February 27, 1903.

As regards item 8, Dr. Allen Perry moved as an amendment that in future Ward Inspectors' diaries be not sent to Members, unless a particular diary is called for, in which case a copy of it should be sent.

The Chairman seconded—Carried. Mr. C. Perera dissenting.

The Chairman moved.—That remaining items in the recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted. The Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper seconded.—Carried.

23. The Council next proceeded to hallot for the election of one Member of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment in place of Mr. Walter Shakspeare, resigned. The result of the ballot was declared by the Chairman to be in favour of Mr. F. C. Alleu, who was accordingly elected as a Member of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment.

Items 24 and 25 in the Order of the Day were disposed of in connection with the recommendations of the Standing Committee previously.

With reference to the question of appointment of City Analyst and Gas Inspector and Mr. Bamber's scale of charges and report of the Medical Officer of Health, the Chairman moved that the Government be asked to obtain for the Council, through the Crown Agents, the services of a Gas Inspector at a salary not exceeding Rs. 4,000 per annum, with the usual horse allowance of Rs. 600 per annum, preference being given to a person who knows analytical work as well, if such a person could be secured; that the duties be those enumerated in Mr. Cockerill's report of April 10, 1901; and that the Chairman be authorized to cause the necessary analysis for the present to be done for the Council by Mr. Bamber on the scale of charges furnished by him. 27. Dr. Allen Perry seconded.—Carried.

28. Report of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment regarding the exemption of untenanted buildings.

The Chairman moved—That the matter be dealt with at the Special Meeting to be held on Friday next.

Major A. W. de Wilton seconded.-Carried.

- Mr. C. P. Dias moved-That steps be taken as opportunity occurs in accordance with the recommendations of the Medical Officer of Health, to mitigate the nuisance.

Dr. W. H. de Silva seconded. - Carried.

30. Papers regarding the land adjoining the front porch of the Grand Oriental Hotel were laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

The Chairman moved—That the Colombo Hotels Company be informed that the Council is unable to entertains

the application.

Mr. James Pieris seconded.—Carried.

31. Papers with reference to the proposed tax on bicycles were laid on the table.

32. Letter No. 127 of February 17, 1903, from the Superintendent of Works, with reference to Maradana

drainage, was laid before the Council.

The Chairman moved—That the Council approve of the work being carried out under the provisions of section 190 of the Ordinance 7 of 1887, and that Mr. Rajapakse be approached in the first instance in order that an agreement be arrived at if possible as regards easement and compensation.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman moved that the action, if brought, be defended by the Council.

Each of the persons appointed will be required to enter into an agreement to serve the Municipal Council for a period of three years.

#### ANNEXURE.

From the ACTING GAS INSPECTOR to the CHAIRMAN, MUNICIPAL COUNCIL, Colombo.

No. 180.

Gas Inspector's Office Colombo, April 10, 1903.

-WITH reference to your letter No. 367 asking for particulars of the work performed by me during my term of office as Acting Gas Inspector, I have the honour to send you the following details:-

1. I had to analyze the gas according to the terms of the gas contract. The following solutions and material had therefore to be prepared, specially as they cannot be bought :- Standard solutions of potassium hydroxide, sulphuric acid, sodium hydroxide, ammonia, and barium chloride.

Sulphur in any form had to be carefully looked for in the gas and estimated. When a doubt exists as to the quantity of ammonia present in the gas, a careful analysis must be made. The time taken for the test has extended over a period of 15 hours, and the graduated apparatus had to be carefully tested. It is necessary that these

analysis should be done, as bad gas would affect the lamps owned by the Council and the private consumer.

2. The gas had to be examined photometrically. This test is mainly for the benefit of private consumers, and under the new contract it will have to be very carefully and frequently done.

Before doing this, and to prevent disputes between the Gas Company and myself, I carefully standardized all the apparatus in the testing room. This should be done at least twice a year. The work consisted of the following details:—

The testing of the standard burner.

Do. do. meter. Do. do. bar. Do. do. candles. Do. do. candle balance. Do. barometer and thermometer. do.

I took sets of records and calculated the percentages of errors of the instruments, or, where possible, repaired them.

Then the candle power of the gas was taken.

Under the new contract it will be possible to maintain 60 candle power in the street lamps, but at the same time lower the candle power of the gas itself. The private lighting of the Municipality would thus suffer with the lighting of the private consumer. It will thus be more important then ever it was to see that this candle power is often and accurately made. This should be done twice a week. The 60 candle power can be maintained in the street lamps with an inferior gas or with a gas of less than 14 candle power.

3. Incandescent Lighting.—It must be clearly understood that there is very little relation between the candle power of the gas and the 60 candle power to be obtained in street lamps. The work of the Gas Inspector will be very much increased, because the candle power must be taken as above mentioned, and also the candle power of any doubtful mantle in any street, and he must so adjust his various pressures in the testing room to the exact

same pressure as the lamp from which the mantle was removed.

The method of procedure which I adopt is as follows:—In case a lamp gives a doubtful candle power, the mantle is brought to the testing room and its candle power taken under precisely the same conditions as it would be in the street. I need not go into details further. Then, if the mantle was bad, the Gas Company would be compelled to change it, and not before. I need hardly point out that the Gas Company would not accept the word of any person, because it is simply impossible for any one to say accurately whether a mantle is giving 45, 50, or 60 candle power. There would of course be no difficulty in reporting a lamp as small flame. I have not been able to complete all my experiments under this head, but I have done a good portion of them and prepared some records, and when in London in December, 1899, I spent some time in the testing room of the Welsback Mantle Company.

I would repeat that it is exceedingly important for the Municipality that this work be thoroughly done, and the testing placed on a proper basis, or the general result will be that the Council may not get the 60 candle power in

the street lighting, nor the 14 candle power gas for private consumers.

4. Meter Testing.—All meters are required to be stamped and tested by a duly qualified Gas Inspector under the Meter Ordinance.

For this purpose I had to test the gas-holder, which is used for the verification of the measurement of gas meters as follows :-

-The vertical descent of the holder while its contents are being discharged.

- -The adjustability of its operating weight, so that it shall deliver gas at any pressure equal to 3 in. of water.
- (c)—The uniformity of its pressure, whatever it may be, throughout the descent of the holder. (d)—Great accuracy in its measurement.

Meters have to be tested for soundness, for percentage fast, for percentage slow, corrections must be made for temperature, the test meter must be accurately standardized.

I need hardly point out the importance of the Inspector's duties in this respect, as he must have the

qualifications to satisfy a court of justice or an arbitrator that his test is correct.

I found it necessary that the Gas Inspector should have a knowledge of accounts, and, in addition to having had

a scientific training, he should have a knowledge of Mechanical Engineering.

I have not touched upon the question of the Fort arc lighting, because that is a question for an Electrical Engineer, as will be seen from the correspondence I have had during the last twelve months, and the settlement of some of the questions during the tenure of office of the late Mayor, the Hon. Mr. F. R. Ellis.

5. The remaining work which has fallen to me has been :-

The testing of the automatic pressure recorder.

The preparation of the lighting tables.

The preparation of the diagrams.

The preparation of daily pressure reports.

The daily inspection of lighting in markets, latrines, and streets.

The ordering of repairs to lamps. The removal of lamps.

The preparation of the gas contract.

The preparation of the specification for the gas extension.

- 1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on January 17, 1903, were read, confirmed, and signed by the Chairman.
- 2. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1902 to January 31, 1903, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue, (No. 2) Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting), and (No. 3) Water-rate Accounts; Progress Report of Works done brought up to the same date; Health Officer's Report for, and Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during, the month of January, 1903.

month of January, 1903.

Resolved – That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

- 3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries inspected during January.
- 4. Correspondence.—(a) Read letter No. 2 dated January 16 and No. 3 dated January 26, 1903, from the Colonial Secretary, intimating the sanction by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council to the levy during 1903 of certain taxes enumerated in schedule to Chairman's letter of December 22, 1902.
- (b) Read letter No. 4, dated February 7, 1903, from the Colonial Secretary, stating, in reply to the request of the Council, that the payment of the instalments of the loan obtained for improvement of road round the lake be reduced to Rs. 2,000 instead of Rs. 4,000; that the Secretary of State approves of the proposal; and inquiring how it is proposed to expend the additional Rs. 2,000 thus placed at the disposal of the Council.

It was proposed by Mr. E. Beven, seconded by Mr. C. Vanderwall, that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on "Municipal Works."

- (c) Read circular No. 14, dated January 28, 1903, from the Colonial Secretary, stating that His Excellency the Governor has directed that in future the usual commission should be paid to the employés of Government Departments for collecting road Tax from the staff of the Department.
- ments for collecting road Tax from the staff of the Department.

  (d) Submitted memorandum E 2, dated February 11, 1903, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, forwarding draft by-laws for registration of dogs, which have been approved of, and requesting to be furnished with translations in Sinhalese and Tamil.

Resolved—That Mr. Poovimanesingham (Police Court Interpreter) be asked to furnish the Council with a translation, payment being made for his services.

5. In lieu of appointing a Special Committee to deal with questions in connection with water supply, it was resolved that all such matters be referred to the Standing Committee on Municipal Works.

6. Read report by the Secretary, in accordance with Minute 2, Meeting of January 17, 1903, on space available in the market, with respect to the proposal to have separate stalls for sale of buffalo meat.

Mr. Beven gave notice that he would bring forward a motion on the subject at the next Meeting. The

Secretary was instructed to send him the report.

7. Proposed by the Chairman, that a Special Committee consisting of Messrs. Beven, Vanderwall, and himself be appointed to draft out rules for the regulation of the proceedings of each Standing Committee, defining the limits and scope of work as provided under section 104 in Amended Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1902. This was seconded by Mr. Jonklaas and carried.
