MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on February 20, 1915, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with notice dated February 16, 1915.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; Mr. C. A. LaBrooy; Dr. Allan de Saram; and Mr. H. F. Tomalin.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on January 16, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.
2. The following documents were submitted:—

- (a) Statement of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1914 to January 31, 1915, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting) and (No. 2) Water-rate accounts.
- (b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for January.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of January.
- (e) The Reservoir Readings for January.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during January.

4. Correspondence:—

(1) Letter No. 1 of January 13, 1915, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, forwarding certificate vesting in the Council land acquired for a public latrine in Katugastota.—Read.

(2) Letter No. 2 of January 15, 1915, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that steps are being taken for the acquisition of land required for widening Cemetery road.—Read.

(3) Letter No. 3 of February 16, 1915, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, *re* Revised Estimates for 1914-15.—Read.

(4) Letter No. 33 of February 18, 1915, from the Hon. the Government Agent, Central Province, requesting that the Council will nominate another Unofficial Member to serve on the Excise Advisory Committee for the Kandy Municipal area in place of Mr. L. H. S. Pieris, who ceased to be a Member of the Municipal Council on January 1, 1915.

Mr. Beven moved that Mr. LaBrooy be nominated. Mr. Weerasooriya seconded.—Carried.

(5) Letter No. 20,399 of February 13, 1915, from the Superintendent of Police, Central Province, asking for payment of the additional sum of Rs. 1,614·32 on account of the amended bill for Police supplied for the first half of 1914.

Mr. Beven moved that representations be made to Government regarding the demand of the additional sum of Rs. 1,614·32 in question, which cannot be regarded as annual expenses of the Police, which the Council are liable to pay under section 215 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910. The Council would further point out that the bill had been paid as tendered, and are of opinion that the additional charge cannot be demanded retrospectively. Mr. Ratwatte seconded.—Carried.

(6) Letter of February 12, 1915, from the Manager, Colombo Gas and Water Company, *re* renewal of the electric lighting contract.

Resolved—That the Company be informed that the Council cannot enter into a contract without the sanction of Government, and that the period of the proposed new contract should therefore be regarded as indefinite for the present.

(7) Letter No. 3 of January 18, 1915, from the Superintendent of Works, asking for authority of Council to meet the excess of Rs. 2,756·93 on estimates for 1914 out of the savings on estimates amounting to Rs. 3,054·84.

Resolved—That sanction be allowed.

(8) Letter No. 4 of January 18, 1915, from the Superintendent of Works, asking for re-votes of unexpended balances on the following estimates:—

Superintendent of Works.**Health Officer's Report, February, 1915.**

I have the honour to submit the report of the Public Health Department for the month of February, 1915.

Births.—The total births registered in the town of Kandy in February, 1915, were 59 (4 Burghers, 38 Sinhalese, 5 Tamils, 9 Moors, 2 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population to the middle of 1915 by intercensal increase, viz., 31,840) was 24·16, as against 25·58 in the previous month.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 70 (1 European, 2 Burghers, 33 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 4 Moors, 2 Malays, and 1 Afghan), of which 19 were non-residents. The death-rate (crude) on 51 (excluding 19 non-residents) per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population to the middle of 1915 by intercensal increase, viz., 31,840), was 28·67, as against 30·75 in the previous month.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the total 70 deaths, 12 were of infants under one year of age, as against 19 last month.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the month was 4, as against 6 last month.

Principal Causes of Death.—Four deaths were registered from Phthisis, of these, 1 was from the Police barracks and the other 3 from hospital of non-residents, 2 from Immaturity, 2 from Dysentery, 4 from Diarrhoea, 1 from Enteric Fever, 3 from Pneumonia, 4 from Tetanus, 2 from Smallpox 2 from Bright's Disease, 8 from Debility, 8 from Anchylostomiasis, 2 from Execution, 2 from Accidents, 1 from Worms, 1 from Bronchitis, 5 from Convulsions, and 19 from Other Causes were registered.

Infectious Diseases.—Eight cases of Smallpox, 6 cases of Chickenpox, 1 case of Measles, and 4 cases of Continued Fever were reported during February, as against 15 cases of Smallpox, 2 cases of Chickenpox, 4 cases of Enteric Fever, and 5 cases of Continued Fever reported during the previous month.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of the air was 77·1, as against 75·3 F. in the previous month.

The total rainfall in the month was 3·76 inches, as against 8·75 inches during the previous month.
