MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, February 26, 1915.

THE Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated February 19, 1915.

Present :—Mr. R. W. Byrde, Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; the Hon. Mr. R. S. Templeton; Mr. L. B. Fernando; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. H. L. de Mel; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; Dr. D. P. Banajee; Dr. E. V. Rutnam; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; Mr. J. A. Perera; Mr. F. R. Senanayake; and Capt. P. W. Matthew, R.A.M.C.

Mr. C. P. Dias, with leave of the Council, referred to the death of Mr. Muhandiram W. M. Fernando, late Head Overseer of the Works Department, and read a number of certificates testifying to his efficiency in the Council's service, and moved—That this Council place on record their appreciation of the valuable services Mr. Muhandiram W. M. Fernando had rendered to the Municipal Council and the rate-payers of Colombo, and that a vote of condolence be passed and that the same be communicated to the members of his family. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo seconded.—Carried unanimously.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of January 15, 1915, having been previously printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of the General Meeting of January 15, 1915, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman read the following:—

Statement re Plague.

It is a year since I made my first statement with regard to Plague. It will be a relief to all to hear that there have been only 4 cases since January 25. We have much to be thankful for, but must remember that plague is still in the City, and that there may be a recurrence in its intensity. The first case of plague was detected, as you remember, on January 25, 1914, at 77, Sea street. Up to January 31, 1915, there were 432 cases with 400 deaths. 262 were septicæmic, the death-rate being 99·6 per cent., 170 were bubonic with a death-rate of only 81·7 per cent. The striking point is the preponderance in the number of cases of the septicæmic type over those of the bubonic type. It is curious to note, however, that among the rats the disease is not as virulent as it is in Northern India. The maximum number of cases was in February, when 67 cases were recorded. The infection among the rats was then about its highest. There was a drop in April and May, but a rise in June, July, and August with a subsequent drop in September with a slight rise again in October, November, and December. The majority of cases occurred in a few localized areas, Kochchikadde, Sea street, Fish Market square, Gintupitiya street, Kehelwatta (San Sebastian), Union lane (Slave Island), and Symond's road, Dean's road, Maligakanda, and Dematagoda lane in Maradana Ward, the cases occurring chiefly in the insanitary areas.

Rat Plague.—Although Dr. Hirst had been examining rats since 1912, no sign of infection was found amongst them until after the outbreak among the human population. It was not till February 9, 1914, that the disease was first detected in a rat. Since the inauguration of the Rat Catching Department on a new basis by Dr. Milne, about March and April, 1914, up to January 31, 1915, 138,013 rats have been trapped and 434 found dead, making a total of 138,447. 16,691

dead rats have been examined. The rate of infection among them being 1·4 per cent., which is a low rate according to the experience in India; of late it has been lower still. The Flea Index, which was high in February last year, fell to only one per rat in August. Since when it has been steadily rising again giving about 3 fleas to each rat. 21,891,307 poisoned baits have been laid, of which 536,187 were removed and probably eaten by rats. The hand-claytons have been found to be extremely useful. The two which were obtained in May have been in constant use. The finances of the Council prevented my ordering the four additional ones which the Council authorized me to obtain. The situation is satisfactory, and we can compliment the staff of the Health Department upon the excellent work performed by them.

3. Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo asked the Chairman—

- (a) How many notices in Form E have been sent in respect of assessments of properties for this year in Wellawatta Ward?
- (b) In how many cases have there been objections received against such assessment?
- (c) How many cases have been instituted against the Council in respect of the alleged unreasonable assessment?

The Chairman replied to the above as follows:—(a) 2,388 notices; (b) 928 cases; (c) 5 cases.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene presented a petition from Cader Maricar of No. 35, Second Division, Maradana, complaining of his prosecution in case No. 1,141 of the Municipal Court, and moved that the petition may be considered and dealt with.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo seconded the motion and asked for permission to defer his remarks for a later period.

The Chairman ruled that Dr. Rodrigo should speak at the time of seconding the motion, and that he could not be heard at a later stage.

Mr. J. A. Perera moved as an amendment, that the matter be referred to the Law and Finance Committee. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded. On a show of hands being taken the amendment was declared carried.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene, who had to present a petition from the house owners and householders in the Municipal lane branching off the Dematagoda road to St. Anthony's Roman Catholic Chapel and leading to the Railway running sheds, did not present the petition, and, with reference to the following motions which stood in his name he withdrew, with leave of the Council, motions Nos. 1, 2, 4, and 5 and moved only No. 3:—

- (1) That estimates be called for for laying a water main along the said lane in order to enable the residents to obtain water services to their respective premises;
- (2) That thereafter a water main be laid along that lane; and
- (3) That a standpost be also erected in the said lane for the purpose of serving the residents; and
- (4) That until such time as the general facilities afforded by the water supply by the laying of a main along this lane are fully available to the residents of this lane, that the ratepayers of the said lane be exempted from the charges for water; and
- (5) That the consent of the Governor in Executive Council be obtained for that purpose.

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

The Chairman moved, as an amendment, that the matter be referred to the Works and Finance Committees. The Hon. Mr. R. S. Templeton seconded. On a show of hands being taken the amendment was declared carried.

6. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene called the attention of the Chairman to the want of latrine accommodation for the use of the inmates of the Ceylon Government Railway cooly lines at Drieberg's lane no privies or water-closets whatever being now provided for the use of the said inmates—so that he may take steps to have sufficient accommodation provided.

The Chairman stated that he would communicate with the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, with a view to having a latrine erected on the site.

7. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. P. Dias moved that this Council request the Chairman to cause such steps to be taken as would enable him to control the price of food stuffs and check its rise. Dr. E. V. Rutnam seconded.

Mr. J. A. Perera moved, as an amendment, that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets to investigate the causes of the increase of the price of articles sold in markets or places controlled by the Council, and to suggest means to effect a reduction. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.

The Chairman said that there had been no extraordinary increase in the price of food, in some cases it had even dropped. There had been an increase of price in sugar, mutton, matches, tinned milks, butter, and flour. This rise was due to valid causes which were known. He quoted the prices of various food stuffs from lists furnished by the Financial Assistant and the Medical Officer of Health. On a show of hands being taken the amendment was declared carried.

At this stage Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader left the Meeting.

8. Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo presented a petition from the Colombo Water Boat Company, the Cargo Boat Despatch Company, and the Oriental Boat Company, and moved that the petition be referred to the Finance Committee for consideration. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.

9. Pursuant to notice, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved for a return showing the number of cases instituted by the Council's officers during the last two years for filthy premises, giving in detail the number of the case, number of premises, name of the accused, result and amount of fine where a conviction has been secured. Dr. E. V. Rutnam seconded.

The Chairman stated that the Medical Officer of Health reports that there were 2,949 prosecutions in respect of filthy premises entered during the last two years, and that he regrets he is unable to supply the further particulars required in time for the Council Meeting, as these further particulars would entail the analyses of some five or six thousand entries, and would take about a week to prepare a statement such as is asked for. Personally, the Chairman said that he could not quite see the use of such a statement.

The motion was put to the Meeting and, on a show of hands being taken, it was declared carried, 7 voting for it and 6 against.

10. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved that a standpost be erected at Drieberg's lane near the Railway Cooly lines for the purpose of supplying water to the residents of this locality. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

The Chairman stated that it is estimated that the cost of providing and erecting the standpost will be Rs. 160. Funds are available on vote K. 16, Extension and Improvement of Water Service. On a show of hands being taken the motion was declared carried.

11. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene presented a letter from the Honorary Secretary, Tamil Union Cricket and Athletic Club, praying that a site for a tennis court for the use of the said club be allotted to them, and amended his motion so as to read "that the matter be referred to the Works and Finance Committees." Dr. E. V. Rutnam seconded.—Carried.

12. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. V. Rutnam presented a petition from Mr. W. Ambrose de Alwis praying that he be compensated for the loss suffered by him by the refusal, for a period of five months, to grant him a certificate of conformity for the occupation of his new building No. 25, St. John's road, and for the occupation of which a certificate of conformity has now been issued to him, and to move that his petition be considered and disposed of. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene spoke in favour of the motion.

The Chairman then traced, step by step, the action which was taken from time to time with regard to the encroachment at No. 25, St. John's road, and explained how he came finally to grant a certificate of conformity, remarking that Mr. Ambrose de Alwis was solely to blame in not coming to him or the Works Engineer and getting the encroachment pointed out.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved, as an amendment, that the matter be referred to the Works and Law Committees. Mr. J. A. Perera seconded.—Carried.

Mr. H. L. de Mel moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider item No. 13 on the agenda. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

(Council in Committee.)

13. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works, combined Committees of Municipal Works and Finance, and Finance Committee, having been previously printed and circulated, were laid before the Council in Committee :—

Extracts from Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of February 18, 1915.

(2) To consider a proposal by the Provincial Engineer to raise the level of the Jawatte road, the cost of which will be borne by Government.

Recommended that the application be granted, provided that the road is raised for the length set out by the Works Engineer, and that proper provision is made for the drainage of the water from the one side of the road to the other and along the road on both sides.

(3) To consider the question of amending rule No. 27 with regard to the width of heavy motor vehicles.

Recommended. Provision being made that the rule should only apply to motor vehicles imported after the passing of the rule.

(4) To consider the petition to Council of Mr. Ambrose de Alwis.

Report to Council that the petition has been considered, and that the certificate has been granted to the petitioner by the Chairman.

Resolution.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of February 18, 1915, be adopted.

Extracts from Minutes of the combined Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance of February 18, 1915.

(3) To consider (1) the question of the payment of five days' salary to Mr. F. van Houten, a daily-paid Surveyor of the Waterworks Department, owing to absence through illness contracted while on duty; and (2) the general question of payment in such cases.

Recommended—(1) That the application be allowed if the Chairman so decides; (2) that as a general rule, daily-paid men should be paid only the days on which they work, except in exceptional cases where a man is incapacitated by the result of his duty.

(4) To consider the acceptance of the offers for scavenging tips.

Recommended that the offers of No. 6, A. A. M. Saleem; No. 4, D. A. de Silva; No. 2, A. L. M. Mohideen be accepted.

(5) To sanction the payment of Rs. 583 made on account of Mr. D. C. Watson's return passage to London.—Recommended.

(6) To consider (1) a letter from the Controllers of Messrs. Freudenberg and Company *re* the removal of blood; and (2) to consider the tenders for the new contract.

Recommended that the Controllers be informed that the Council must claim the payment of the Rs. 500 liquidated damages.

Recommended that the contract be granted to L. M. Silva, provided that he make a deposit of Rs. 500 in advance and enter into an agreement similar to that entered into with the previous contractors.

(7) To consider an offer of Rs. 420 from Messrs. Walker, Sons, and Co., Ltd., for the re-purchase of six steel joists.—Recommended.

(8) To sanction an application for leave from Mr. Hallock Wijenathen.—Recommended.

(14) To sanction an estimate for re-thatching the emergency sheds at the plague camp, Rs. 600.—Recommended.

(15) To consider the proposed street lines for Kynsey road.—Recommended.

(16) To sanction the transfer of a sum of Rs. 1,500 from vote I. (g) 36 to vote I. (h).—Recommended.

(19) (a) To adjust the conditions of the contract with Mr. D. D. W. Samarakone for trench-cutting on the 30-inch Labugama-Colombo main.

Recommended that payment be made from time to time up to 90 per cent. instead of 75 per cent.

(22) To consider an application from the Anglo-Persian Co., Ltd., for permission to erect an oil installation on the British India Steam Navigation Company's land in Korteboam street, Kochchikade.

Recommended, on condition that all the rules and regulations are complied with and payment made for way leave.

(26) To consider the question of calling for tenders for general supplies to the Municipality for the financial year, commencing on July 1, 1915.

Recommended that tenders be invited for the supply of material, &c., for six months from the end of the current financial year.

(27) To sanction the agreement with regard to the use of electric fans at the Works Engineer's Office, Maligakanda.—Recommended.

(28) To consider an application from the Acting Resident Engineer, Drainage Works, for telephone connection to Polwatta pumping station.—Recommended.

(30) To consider the application of the Local Boards of Matale and Nuwara Eliya for the building and supply of special carts by the Municipal Workshop.

Recommended that the Works Engineer be authorized to make (in the Municipal Workshop) carts for removal of silt, rubbish, &c., for local bodies.

(31) To consider the audit query with regard to bicycle allowances paid to Overseers of the Sanitation Department.—Recommended that the payment be sanctioned.

(32) To sanction a pension of Rs. 94 to Simon Perera, late peon of the Works Department.—Recommended.

(33) To authorize the Chairman to ask Mr. Tickell to select suitable candidates for the post of Assistant Waterworks Engineer; or in the event of his being unable to do so, to ask the Crown Agents to make the selection.

Recommended that Mr. Tickell may be requested to select candidates with a knowledge of Municipal duties in general and in particular of waterworks, and that in the event of his declining, the Crown Agents be requested to make recommendations.

Resolutions.

With reference to item No. 30, it was resolved that the matter be referred back to the Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance.

Resolved that the remaining items of the recommendations of the combined Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance of February 18, 1915, be adopted.

- (18) To re-consider the question of the pension to be paid to Head Overseer, V. S. Kitchillan, in view of the Acting Colonial Auditor's report.—Recommended that the pension paid to Kitchillan be Rs. 486.
- (19) To sanction the payment of the allowance of the Municipal Bacteriologist till February 23, 1915.—Recommended.
- (20) To sanction the payment of Rs. 42 on account of legal expenses in D. C. case No. 2,380, land acquisition.—Recommended.
- (21) To sanction (1) the increase of the cost amounting to Rs. 3,167 on account of land acquisition (I. 52 and J. 52) for widening of Stewart street; (2) a supplementary vote of Rs. 9,357 (to be included in the supplemental budget) on account of land acquisition for widening Stewart street.—Recommended.

15. To sanction the excess leave of 2 days over 42 days granted to Mr. N. Schokman, Sub-Inspector, Public Health Department.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the excess leave granted by the Chairman be approved. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.
