### MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on March 20, 1915, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated March 16, 1915.

*Present*:—The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman; Mr. V. M. Saravanamuttu; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte; Mr. D. E. Weerasooria; Mr. C. A. LaBrooy; and Dr. Allan de Saram.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on February 20, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

- Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1914 to February 28, 1915, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting) and (No. 2) Water-rate accounts.
- Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.
- Health Officer's report for February.
- Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of February.
- The Reservoir Readings for February.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during February.

4. Correspondence:—

- Letter No. 4 of March 3, 1915, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that His Excellency the Governor has ordered that a reduced grant of Rs. 1,500 be allowed for the year for the conservancy of the lake.—Read.
- Letter of March 5, 1915, from the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, re railway facilities.—Read.
- Letter of December 22 from the Superintendent of Works re the stopping of the leak in the reservoir.

Proposed by Mr. LaBrooy—That this Council do accord a vote of thanks to Mr. H. F. Tomalin for the invaluable advice given and the assistance rendered by him in the recent repairs to the Kandy Reservoir and for the great interest taken by him in the execution of the said work. Mr. Wijegoonewardene seconded.—Carried unanimously.

The Chairman remarked that credit was also due to the Superintendent of Works for showing such a large saving (Rs. 796·64) on the vote.

(4) Petition of March 10 from Perumal, a dismissed kangany, praying that his case may be reconsidered. It was agreed to leave the matter in the hands of the Chairman.

(5) Letter of March 12 from M. M. Salgado asking that the sunshade he has put up in premises No. 33-34, Castle Hill street, may be allowed to remain.

Resolved—That the sunshade be allowed to remain on payment of Re. 1 a year on a ticket of occupancy.

(6) Letter of February 22 from the Medical Officer of Health suggesting the acquisition of land in the immediate vicinity of the segregation camp and the infectious diseases hospital.

Resolved—That a Special Committee consisting of Messrs. Beven, LaBrooy, Tomalin, Dr. de Saram, and the Chairman be appointed to consider the matter.

5. Papers re the subsidy of Rs. 100 a month to the Kandy Public Band.

Proposed by Mr. Wijegoonewardene—That the subsidy be withdrawn at the end of March, 1915. Seconded by Mr. Weerasooria.—Carried.

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. Wijegoonewardene asked—(i.) Are there any limits fixed for street watering? (ii.) How many watering carts are now in use?

The Chairman replied—(i.) The limits fixed before the streets were tarred were as follows:—Brownrigg street up to Cross street; Castle Hill street; Colombo road; Colombo street; Cross street; Hill street; King's street; Victoria Drive from Ward street to Lake Spill; Pavilion street; Malabar street to junction of Lady Longden's; Trincomalee street; Market street; Victoria Drive from Library to Mr. R. W. Jonklaas's house; Ward street. Since the streets commenced to be treated with tar such streets as have been so treated have been dropped and the street watering extended along Peradeniya road. Last year the watering along this road was carried out to near the 71st milestone. This year it has been extended as far as Siebel place (70½ miles). (ii.) The number of watering carts available is three. An estimate for four more carts is before the Standing Committee on Municipal Works.

7. Pursuant to notice Mr. Wijegoonewardene moved—That a sum of Rs. 2,000 be voted for extension of drainage along Peradeniya road to enable the work to be taken in hand at once.

The Chairman explained that the price of cement was too high at present, and suggested that the matter be brought up again at the June meeting of Council.

This was agreed to and the motion was accordingly withdrawn.

8. To obtain the following votes:—(i.) Outbreak of epidemics, Rs. 4,000; (ii.) charges on account of vagrants, Rs. 500.—Resolved that the amounts be voted.

9. Recommendations of Standing Committees:—

#### *Law and General Subjects.*

(1) That the following rickshaw stands be proclaimed:—(i.) In Torrington road facing Queen's Hotel; (ii.) near post box at junction of Railway Approach road with Peradeniya road; (iii.) near post box at entrance of Ampitiya road; (iv.) inside the Kandy railway station premises; (v.) Hill street pavement near Town Hall gate.

(2) That two out of the four nuisance watchers be discontinued after a month's notice.

Resolved—That the recommendations be adopted.

#### *Markets and Sanitation.*

(3) That D. H. Kanangara be allowed to keep a vegetable stall in Trincomalee street on payment of Rs. 50 per annum for the privilege.

Resolved—That the license be allowed till the end of the year on payment of Rs. 37·50.

#### *Finance and Assessment.*

(4) That a sum of Rs. 60 be paid to Messrs. Wickramasinghe and Thyalnayagam for preparing a correct list of fines erroneously credited to revenue.

(5) That a sum of Rs. 39·47 be remitted to the Principal Civil Medical Officer, being the cost of Railway warrants issued to the Sanitary Probationers while under training in Colombo.

(6) That Rs. 42 be paid to the clerk to the Medical Officer of Health for work done out of hours.

Resolved—That the recommendations be adopted.

(7) That Inspector Malleappah be given a commuted rickshaw allowance of Rs. 15 per mensem.

Resolved—That the matter be referred back to the Finance Committee.

#### *Municipal Works.*

(8) That the following estimates be sanctioned:—(i.) Survey of Trincomalee street, Rs. 400; (ii.) water meter parts, Rs. 2,200; (iii.) materials for laying private water service, Rs. 2,000; (iv.) materials for waterworks upkeep, Rs. 100; (v.) new wheel for steam road roller, Rs. 475.

(9) That the following applications for house service pipes be allowed on usual terms:—(i.) M. K. Muttalibo, Nos. 9 and 9A, Castle Hill street; (ii.) S. M. S. V. Sevugon Chetty, No. 381, Trincomalee street; (iii.) M. B. Panabokke, No. 330, Trincomalee street.

(10) That a fee of Rs. 3 per annum be charged as fee for trespass opposite 359-362, Peradeniya road.

Resolved—That the recommendations be adopted.

Superintendent of Works.**Health Officer's Report, March, 1915.**

I have the honour to submit the report of the Public Health Department for the month of March, 1915.

*Births.*—The total births registered in the town of Kandy in March, 1915, were 94 (1 European, 4 Burghers, 58 Sinhalese, 9 Tamils, 15 Moors, 4 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population to the middle of 1915 by intercensal increase, viz., 31,840) was 34·81, as against 24·16 in the previous month.

*Deaths.*—The total deaths registered were 80 (1 Burgher, 39 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 11 Moors, 3 Malays, and 1 Other), of which 19 were non-residents. The death-rate (crude) on 61 (excluding 19 non-residents) per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population to the middle of 1915 by intercensal increase, viz., 31,840), was 22·61, as against 28·67 in the previous month.

*Infantile Deaths.*—Of the total 80 deaths, 13 were of infants under one year of age, as against 12 last month.

*Stillbirths.*—The number of stillbirths registered during the month was 1, as against 4 last month.

*Principal Causes of Death.*—3 from Diarrhoea, 1 from Dysentery, 7 from Pneumonia, 3 from Smallpox, 1 from Bright's Disease, 6 from Debility, 7 from Anchylostomiasis, 5 from Phthisis, 3 from Bronchitis, 1 from Worms, 2 from Convulsions, 3 from Accidents, 1 from Suicide, 1 from Continued Fever, and 23 from other diseases were registered.

*Infectious Diseases.*—3 cases of Smallpox, 1 case of Chickenpox, 2 cases of Continued Fever, 1 case of Enteric Fever, 2 cases of Phthisis, and 1 case of Whooping Cough, as against 8 cases of Smallpox, 6 cases of Chickenpox, 1 case of Measles, and 4 cases of Continued Fever reported in the previous month.

*State of the Weather.*—The mean temperature of the air was 79·2, as against 77·1 in the previous month.

The total rainfall in the month was 3·46 inches, as against 3·76 inches during the previous month.
