### MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, April 30, 1915.

THE Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated April 23, 1915.

*Present* :—Mr. R. W. Byrde, Chairman; the Hon. Sir Allan Perry, Kt.; Major A. W. de Wilton; Mr. L. B. Fernando; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. H. L. de Mel; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; Dr. D. P. Banajee; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; Mr. J. A. Perera; Mr. F. R. Senanayake; and Mr. C. H. Wellard.

Before the business of the meeting commenced, the Chairman, with the leave of Council, referred to the death of Mr. James van Langenberg, K.C., Solicitor-General, and proposed a vote of condolence, and in doing so said—Ceylon has suffered an inestimable loss in the death of the Solicitor-General, Mr. James van Langenberg, K.C., an able lawyer, a skilled counsel, an ardent volunteer, and a keen sportsman. The city of Colombo to-day mourns the loss of a talented and distinguished citizen.

The Chairman moved, with the leave of the Council, that—The Members of the Municipal Council of Colombo desire to express their deep sympathy with the widow and children of the late Mr. James van Langenberg, K.C., Solicitor-General, in their sorrow and bereavement. The Hon. Sir Allan Perry, Kt., seconded.—Carried unanimously.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of March 26, 1915, having been previously printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of the General Meeting of March 26, 1915, be confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman read the following :—

#### *Statement re Plague.*

Four cases only have occurred since our last meeting, making a total for the year of 31. Last year the figure stood at 147. One case was at Chekku street; another at Muhandiram's lane, San Sebastian; the third at Wolfendahl; the fourth was the case of a person found dead by the roadside at Saunder's court. Four plague-infected rats have been discovered. They were caught at Nagalagam street (two), Chekku street, and Quarry road. No rat examined since March 29 has been found to be infected.

Mr. Arthur Alvis moved that the meeting be adjourned for Tuesday, the 4th proximo, in order to enable the members to attend the funeral of the late Mr. James van Langenberg, K.C., Solicitor-General. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

**Minutes of Proceedings of an Adjourned General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Tuesday, May 4, 1915.**

THE adjourned Meeting of the Municipal Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice dated April 30, 1915.

*Present* :—Mr. R. W. Byrde, Chairman; the Hon. Sir Allan Perry, Kt.; the Hon. Mr. R. S. Templeton; Mr. L. B. Fernando; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. H. L. de Mel; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; Dr. D. P. Banajee; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; and Mr. J. A. Perera.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. J. A. Perera asked the Chairman—

(a) By whom and at whose expense were certain buildings recently erected on Municipal land facing the Gasworks street and lying between the Office of the Municipal Assessor and the Edinburgh market?

The Chairman said: There are three temporary buildings on this land, facing Gasworks street, erected by the following persons at their own expense:—(1) Messrs. Delmege Forsyth and Co.; (2) S. K. Velupillai; and (3) P. D. Bastian Appuhamy.

Mr. Perera asked: (b) Whether the sites on which the buildings stand have been leased, and if so on what terms?

The Chairman said: The sites have not been leased in the ordinary sense of the term. They have been let on monthly agreements, determinable on one month's notice. The rent for the first is Rs. 45 a month paid by Messrs. Delmege Forsyth & Co. for a space of 45 ft. × 15 ft.; for the second site S. K. Velupillai pays Rs. 15 per month for a space 15 ft. × 15 ft.; while No. 3 brings a rental of Rs. 45 a month for a space 45 ft. × 45 ft. occupied by P. D. Bastian Appuhamy.

Mr. Perera asked: (c) Whether notice of the intention to lease the said sites were given to the public, and if so in what manner?

The Chairman said: No notice was given to the public. The first site was leased two years ago in August, 1913; the second in October, 1914; and the third in December, 1914.

Mr. Perera asked: (d) Whether the sanction of the Council was obtained for the lease of the said sites?

The Chairman said: The sanction of Council was not obtained for letting these sites as they have been let on monthly tenancies as the custom has been hitherto. He added that he would submit all papers to the Works and Finance Committees to consider the question in connection with other leases.

Mr. Perera said that in that case he would beg to withdraw the motion standing in his name under item No. 5 of the agenda.

4. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. V. Ratnam asked the Chairman—

How many cases of smallpox have been reported (1) from the Lunatic Asylum and (2) within one mile radius of the Infectious Diseases Hospital from the time of the present outbreak of the epidemic to date.

The Chairman replied as follows:—

(1) There were 5 cases reported from the Lunatic Asylum since the commencement of the present outbreak, *i.e.*, since July 19, 1914.

(2) There were 34 cases reported within a mile radius of the Infectious Diseases Hospital, exclusive of the 5 cases in the Lunatic Asylum, and the total number of cases is 297.

6. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. V. Ratnam moved that a Committee be appointed to inquire into the cause or causes of the unusually long duration of the present epidemic of smallpox, and that the Committee consist of the Members of the Sanitation Committee, Mr. J. A. Perera, and Dr. P. W. Mathew, R.A.M.C. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.

The Chairman read a report from the Medical Officer of Health.

In connection with the report of the Medical Officer of Health, Mr. Arthur Alvis inquired whether any prosecutions had taken place for concealment of cases of smallpox.

The Chairman replied in the affirmative. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo and Sir Allan Perry, Kt., also spoke to the motion. On a show of hands being taken the motion was declared carried.

7. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved for the appointment of a Committee to consider the report of the Commission and letter No. 43 of March 27, 1915, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, and that the Committee consist of Mr. C. P. Dias, the Hon. Mr. R. S. Templeton, Mr. Arthur Alvis, Mr. H. L. de Mel, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo, the Hon. Mr. T. H. Chapman, Mr. J. A. Perera, and Mr. T. L. Villiers. The Hon. Sir Allan Perry, Kt., seconded. Carried unanimously.

The Hon. Sir Allan Perry, Kt., moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 8, 9, and 10 on the agenda. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.

(Council in Committee.)

8 to 10. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Sanitation and Markets, on Law and General Subjects, on Municipal Works, the combined Committees on Municipal Works and Finance, and Finance Committee, having been previously printed and circulated, were laid before the Council in Committee.

*Extract from Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of April 21, 1915.*

(3) To consider the question of fees to Municipal midwives.—Recommended that the extra fee of Rs. 5 be paid for every case over 12, instead of over 8 as at present.

*Resolution.*

Resolved that the above recommendation be adopted.

*Extracts from Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of April 21, 1915.*

(3) To consider Messrs. Boustead Brothers' applications to erect overhead wires:—(1) at Elibank road; (2) in 19th lane, Bambalapitiya; (3) in Havelock town.—Recommended that the applications for the erection of overhead wires be refused.

(9) To consider the question of payment of sanctioned gratuities to minors amounting in all to Rs. 75.—Recommended that the money be paid over to the mother for the maintenance of the minors.

*Resolution.*

Mr. Arthur Alvis moved that the above recommendations be adopted. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

(5) To consider the proposed street lines for Symond's road and Dean's road.—Recommended that the lines be adopted.

(10) To consider the proposed deviation of the street lines for Regent street.—Recommended that the deviation be approved.

(12) To consider an application to rebuild a wall on premises No. 47, Third Division, Maradana, in relation to the proposed street lines in Maradana.—Recommended (1) that the applicant be permitted to re-build the front wall as suggested 3 feet from the existing wall upon his and the owner of the premises entering into a notarial agreement not to claim compensation for the wall when the property is acquired; (2) that the erection of a sunshade be not allowed.

*Extracts from Minutes of the combined Standing Committees on Municipal Works and Finance of April 23, 1915.*

- (4) To consider Messrs. Boustead Brothers' applications to erect overhead wires:—(1) at Elibank road; (2) in 19th lane, Bambalapitiya; (3) in Havelock town.—Recommended that the application for the erection of overhead wires be refused.
- (6) To sanction a supplementary estimate for the maintenance of pumping stations, Rs. 4,700.—Recommended.

- (8) To consider an application for an increment to Mr. J. A. V. Rodrigo, Surveyor, City Sanitation Department.—Recommended that the increment of Rs. 60 per annum be granted.

- (2) To consider a petition from Cader Maricar of No. 35, Second Division, Maradana, complaining of his prosecution in M. C., case No. 1,141. (Considered with Messrs. N. H. M. Abdul Cader and J. A. Perera, Members of the Law Committee).—Recommended that the petitioner be informed that the Council is unable to grant his request and give him compensation.
- (6) To consider the question of fees to Municipal midwives.—Recommended that the recommendation of the Sanitation Committee be adopted.
- (7) To consider the proposal to reward Mr. N. Schokman, Sanitary Inspector, in connection with his action in regard to the smallpox case at No. 5/54, Stewart street, Slave Island.—Recommended that Mr. Schokman be granted a reward of Rs. 50 and that he should be complimented on his commendable action.
- (8) To consider the question of payment for the printing of the Chairman's Administration Report amounting to about Rs. 800.—Recommended that the payment be made.
- (10) To sanction a supplemental vote of Rs. 300 to vote E. 27—Upkeep of Ambulance and Reception carts.—Recommended.
- (11) To restore a sum of Rs. 130, under vote K. 2—Allowances, to meet the expenditure of the Waterworks Engineer.—Recommended.
- (12) To sanction the inclusion of a sum of Rs. 122.50, under the Land Acquisition vote in the Supplemental Budget, to meet payment of lawyers' fees and compensation in D. C., case No. 2,373.—Recommended.
- (15) To sanction the purchase made of Manilla rope from Messrs. Brown & Co. at Rs. 42.50 per cwt., being over contract rates.—Recommended.
- (16) To sanction the purchase of pig lead from Messrs. Walker Sons & Co. at amended rates.—Recommended.
- (17) To sanction a contract with Messrs. Delmege Forsyth & Co. for six months for liquid fuel at 21 cents per gallon.—Recommended.
- (18) To restore a sum of Rs. 75 to the Veterinary Surgeon's vote E. 12—Miscellaneous, and Rs. 33 to vote E. 6—Uniforms.—Recommended.
- (20) To sanction:—(a) A supplementary vote of Rs. 1,500; (b) a re-vote of Rs. 1,034.79 for the Vagrants' Home.—Recommended.

Mr. L. B. Fernando moved that the recommendations of the Standing Committees on Municipal Works, combined Committees of Works and Finance, and Finance Committee be adopted. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

The Hon. Sir Allan Perry moved that the Council do resume, and that the recommendations of Council in Committee be adopted. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.

Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved that the Committee be resumed in order that item No. 8 of the Finance Committee—re payment for the printing of the Administration Report—may be considered. Mr. J. A. Perera seconded.—Carried.

(Council in Committee.)

After some discussion the recommendation of the Finance Committee re item No. 8 was adopted.

[Messrs. L. B. Fernando and Arthur Alvis left the meeting at this stage.]

The Hon. Sir Allan Perry, Kt., moved that the Council do resume, and that the recommendations of Council in Committee be adopted. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman in Council moved that the recommendations of the Council in Committee be adopted. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

**Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on April 17, 1915, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated April 12, 1915.**

*Present* :—The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairmar ; Mr. E. Beven ; Mr. V. M. Saravanamuttu ; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene ; Mr. J. C. Ratwatte ; Dr. Allan de Saram ; and Mr. H. F. Tomalin.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on March 20, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statements of Receipts and Expenditure from close of 1914 to March 31, 1915, on account of the Municipal Fund, comprising the (No. 1) General Revenue and Consolidated Rate (Police and Lighting) and (No. 2) Water-rate accounts.
- (b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's Report for March.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of March.
- (e) The Reservoir Readings for March.

Resolved—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, and the Health Officer's report, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during March.

## 4. Correspondence :—

(1) Letter No. 5 of March 25, 1915, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, intimating that the Treasurer has been instructed to refund to the Council the sum of Rs. 4,404.37, the amount of Police Court fines erroneously credited to revenue, and requesting the Council at the same time to pay into revenue from January, 1915, the sum of Rs. 500 per annum previously paid to the Municipal Magistrate.

Mr. Wijegoonewardene proposed—That the Council pay into revenue a sum of Rs. 500 per annum from January 1, 1915. Mr. Saravanamuttu seconded—Carried.

(2) Letter No. 6 of April 1, 1915, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, *re* tax on bicycles.

Resolved—That the letter be circulated.

(3) Letter No. 104 of March 17, 1915, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to the Hon. the Government Agent, Central Province, *re* acquisition of land at junction of Lady Gordon's road with Trincomalee street, for the information of the Chairman.—Read.

(4) Letter of April 6 from National Secretary, Young Men's Christian Association, submitting plan of site below Wace park for proposed building for the Young Men's Christian Association, and asking for an additional piece of ground marked on the plan.

Mr. Tomalin proposed—That the request of the Young Men's Christian Association be granted. Mr. Saravanamuttu seconded.—Carried.

(5) Letter of March 22 from the Manager, Colombo Gas and Water Company, intimating that his Committee regret the Council is not in a position to deal with the question of renewing the lighting contract at present.—Read.

(6) Letter of March 11 from Mr. G. S. Saxton, late Chairman, Municipal Council, Kandy, thanking the Council for their resolution of January 16, 1915.—Read.

(7) Letter of April 12 from Mr. H. F. Tomalin thanking the Council for the vote of thanks accorded to him for the assistance rendered by him in stopping the leak in the Kandy Reservoir.—Read.

(8) Letter of March 29 from M. Ismail objecting to the site acquired for a public latrine on Peradeniya road.—Read.

The Chairman said he was quite willing to ask the Superintendent of Works to erect the latrine on the land acquired as far as possible from the house now being built by Mr. Ismail.

5. The Report of the Colonial Auditor on the accounts of the Municipality of Kandy for the year 1914.—Read. It was agreed to refer the report to the Standing Committees on Finance and Municipal Works.

## 6. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

(2) That house service pipes be allowed on usual terms to (i.) No. 820, Peradeniya road, Mrs. Mass Rahim ; (ii.) No. 32, Colombo street, H. H. Mohamed.

## Health Officer's Report, April, 1915.

I have the honour to submit the report of the Public Health Department for the month of April, 1915.

*Births.*—The total births registered in the town of Kandy in April, 1915, were 83 (2 Europeans, 1 Burgher, 54 Sinhalese, 10 Tamils, 9 Moors, 5 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population to the middle of 1915 by intercensal increase, viz., 31,840) was 31·78, as against 34·81 in the previous month.

*Deaths.*—The total deaths registered were 71 (2 Burghers, 31 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 8 Moors, 1 Malay, and 3 Others), of which 20 were non-residents. The death-rate (crude) on 51 (excluding 20 non-residents) per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population to the middle of 1915 by intercensal increase, viz., 31,840) was 27·18, as against 28·61 in the previous month.

*Infantile Deaths.*—Of the total 71 deaths, 11 were of infants under one year of age, as against 13 last month.

*Stillbirths.*—The number of stillbirths registered during the month was nil, as against 1 last month.

*Principal Causes of Death.*—8 from Diarrhœa, 4 from Dysentery, 1 from Enteric, 6 from Pneumonia, 7 from Debility, 5 from Anchylostomiasis, 3 from Phthisis, 4 from Accidents, 2 from Suicide, 1 from Drowning, and 19 from other diseases were registered.

*Infectious Diseases.*—1 case of Smallpox, 3 cases of Chickenpox, 3 cases of Enteric Fever, 1 case of Measles, 2 cases of Phthisis, 1 case of Continued Fever, as against 3 cases of Smallpox, 1 case of Chickenpox, 1 case of Enteric Fever, 2 cases of Continued Fever, 2 cases of Phthisis, and 1 case of Whooping Cough reported in the previous month.

*State of the Weather.*—The mean temperature of the air was 80·4, as against 79·2 in the previous month.

The total rainfall in the month was 11·92 inches, as against 3·46 inches during the previous month.

*Solar Radiation Thermometer.*—Highest 157·5 on April 8, 1915; lowest 145·4 on April 13, 1915; mean 151·8 for the month of April 1915.

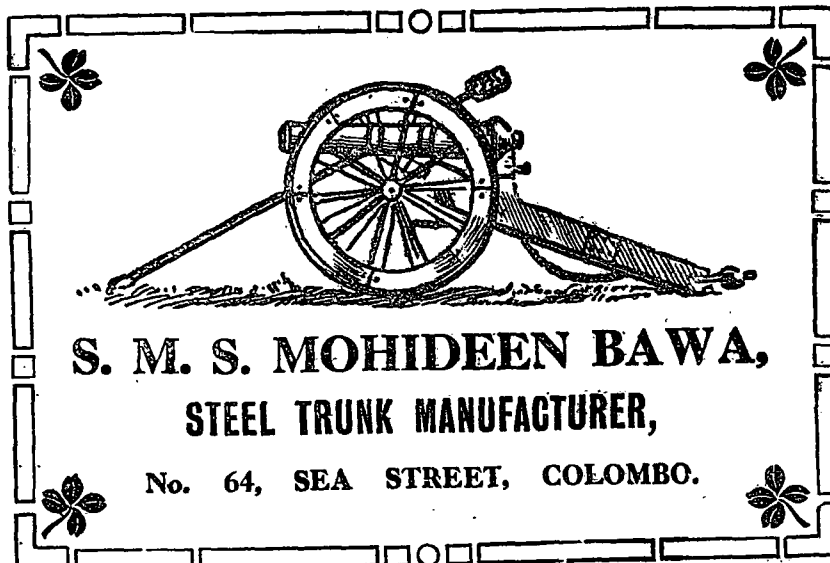
