**VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE
MONTH OF FEBRUARY, 1915.**

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 33 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31-36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

Births.

2. The births numbered 1,437 (705 males and 732 females), and were equal to an annual rate of 31·98 per 1,000, against 29·31 in the preceding month, 30·91 in the corresponding month of last year, and 31·66 the average of the corresponding months since 1908. The rate ranged from 7·93 in Kalpitiya to 69·08 in Hambantota.

3. In the city of Colombo the births numbered 633 (295 males and 338 females), and were equal to an annual rate* of 32·83 per 1,000, against 26·19 in the preceding month, 24·24 in the corresponding month of last year, and 27·19 the average for the months of February since 1908. The rate ranged from 13·80 in Kollupitiya to 37·06 in Wellawatta.

Deaths.

4. The total deaths registered during the month amounted to 1,656 (868 males and 788 females). There were 1,423 deaths of residents, equivalent to an annual rate of 34·52 per 1,000, against 35·90 in the preceding month, 40·83 in the corresponding month of last year, and 33·51 the average of the corresponding months since 1908. The rate ranged from 73·21 in Jaffna to 15·95 in Tangalla.

5. In the city of Colombo the deaths numbered 537 (278 males and 259 females). There were 497 deaths of residents, equivalent to an annual rate* of 32·31 per 1,000, against 34·29 in the preceding month, 30·36 in the corresponding month of last year, and 32·09 the average of the corresponding months since 1908. Kollupitiya showed the lowest death-rate, viz., 10·96, and Wellawatta the highest, 31·16.

6. Stillbirths numbered 86 (43 males and 43 females), against 90 in the preceding month.

Infantile Mortality.

7. The infantile mortality was equal to a rate of 274 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ending on February 28, 1915. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only it was 228, against 298 in the preceding month, 371 in the corresponding month of last year, and 272 the average for the corresponding months since 1908.

8. The infantile mortality in the city of Colombo was 341 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ending on February 28, 1915. Taking only the births registered during the month the rate was 231, against 352 in the preceding month, 323 in the corresponding month of last year, and 306 the average for the corresponding months since 1908.

Causes of Death.

9. The highest mortality was from *Debility*, *Convulsions*, *Pneumonia*, and *Diarrhoea*, to each of which 8 per cent. of the total deaths was due, 7 per cent. were due to *Phthisis*, 4 per cent. each to *Dysentery* and *Anchylostomiasis*, 3 per cent. to *Enteritis*, and 2 per cent. to *Bronchitis*.

10. In the city of Colombo the highest mortality was from *Convulsions*, which caused 12 per cent. of the total number of deaths in the city. 11 per cent. were due to *Phthisis*, 9 per cent. to *Pneumonia*, 8 per cent. to *Debility*, 7 per cent. to *Enteritis*, 3 per cent. each to *Bronchitis* and *Diarrhoea*, and 1 per cent. each to *Anchylostomiasis*, *Plague*, and *Smallpox*. The total number of deaths registered from *Plague* was 7, against 19 in the preceding month.

11. *Infectious Diseases reported*.—The most prevalent infectious disease during the month was *Chickenpox*, of which 92 cases were reported (69 in Colombo, 6 in Matara, 6 in Kandy, 5 in Moratuwa, 4 in Kalutara, 2 in Jaffna), followed by *Phthisis* 91 (80 in Colombo), *Enteric Fever* 48 (33 in Colombo, 9 in Galle), *Smallpox* 34 (24 in Colombo, 9 in Kandy, 1 in Kalutara), *Continued Fever* 19 (7 in Galle, 6 in Colombo), *Measles* 8 (3 in Colombo), *Plague* 7 (in Colombo), *Mumps* 5 (in Colombo), *Whooping Cough* 3 (in Ambalangoda), *Diarrhoea* 2 (1 in Galle, 1 in Negombo), *Dysentery* 1 (in Negombo), *Sore Eyes* 1 (in Ambalangoda), *Diphtheria* 1 (in Colombo).

Meteorology.

12. *Rainfall*.—Ratnapura recorded the highest rainfall (6·21 inches), followed by Colombo (5·42 inches). In the other towns the rainfall ranged from 0·06 inch in Mullaitivu to 4·68 inches in Kalutara.

13. *Temperature*.—The mean temperature varied from 58·6° in Nuwara Eliya to 82·3° in Mannar, and was 81·0° in Colombo.
