By His Excellency Sir ROBERT CHALMERS, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

ROBERT CHALMERS:

WHEREAS the cart road leading from Aluwihare to Dullewe Gap, in the District of Matale, Central Province, 2½ miles in length, has been constructed and maintained by Matale West, Beredewella estates, and the District Road Committee of the District of Matale:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by section 39 of "The Estate Roads Ordinances, 1902 and 1910," do hereby extend the application of the said Estate Roads Ordinances, 1902 and 1910, to the maintenance and improvement of the said road as from and after the date hereof.

The Proclamation dated March 26, 1914, is hereby revoked.

WHEREAS by the proviso to section 4 of "The Toll Ordinance, 1896," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, from time to time to cause a higher rate of toll than that specified in the said section to be levied in respect of ferries which shall exceed half a mile in width:

And whereas the Pannai ferry included in Schedule D to the said Ordinance exceeds half a mile in width:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, in exercise of the powers in Us vested, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby direct that from and after July 15, 1915, tolls shall be levied in respect of the said ferry at such rates as are specified in the schedule hereto attached.

By His Excellency Sir ROBERT CHALMERS, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

ROBERT CHALMERS.

WHEREAS by section 28 of "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges, or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance, for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided, for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence—

For the Midland Circuit, three times at least at Kandy, and any other Sessions at such other places in such Circuit as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint; such Sessions commencing at Kandy on March 10, on August 1, and on December 1 in every year:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to order that a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court should be holden, on the day hereinafter mentioned, at Kurunegala, a place included within the Midland Circuit :

Now, therefore, know Ye that We, the said Governor, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do order and appoint that a Criminal Session of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Kurunegala, in the said Midland Circuit, on or about Monday, September 20, 1915.

#### BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. Dairymen supplying milk within Local Board limits shall register their names and addresses at the office of the Local Board.
2. No dairy shall be allowed in a compound where there is a cesspit or latrine, or in a position where bad odours wafted from such will reach it.
3. Every dairy compound shall be sufficiently provided with proper drainage to the satisfaction of the Chairman, and the drains shall be kept flushed; no foul water shall be allowed in a dairy compound.
4. All refuse and dirt in and about the premises of a dairy shall be removed without delay. Cowdung shall be removed daily from the dairy compound.
5. There must be a pure water supply at a convenient distance. No bathing or washing of clothes at a well in the dairy compound shall be allowed, nor shall water for use in the dairy be drawn from any well outside the compound at which bathing or washing of clothes is allowed.
6. No building used as a dairy shall be used as a dwelling place or for any other purpose whatsoever; such building shall be kept clean at all times.
7. The milk cows must be free from any disease, and all dairymen must be free from any cutaneous, contagious, or infectious disease. No water or other foreign liquid or substance shall be added to the milk.
8. All utensils, furniture, and other requisites used in or belonging to a dairy shall be kept clean.
9. All vessels sent out containing milk shall be properly covered, stoppered, or corked, and shall not be carried under the armpit, nor shall the mouth of bottles be fingered.

Whereas the Governor in Council is satisfied that there is danger of an outbreak of plague at Rameswaram, in the Ramnad taluk of the Ramnad district, if persons from the infected portions of the Nilgiri, North Arcot, Salem, and South Canara districts, the Mysore State, the Bombay Presidency, the town of Colombo in Ceylon, and other parts declared to be infected with plague are permitted to visit that place on the occasion of the ensuing Adi New Moon festival :

In exercise of the powers delegated to him under the Epidemic Diseases Act, 1897, the Governor in Council prohibits the attendance at the said festival from July 30 to August 13, 1915, inclusive, of persons from the said parts, and further directs that, between the said dates, no tickets to travel by railway shall be sold at the stations of Mangalore, Hosur, Ariyanur, Salem, and Thinnapatti on the South Indian Railway for the stations of Madura, Madura East, Silaiman, Tiruppuvanam, Tiruppachetti, Muttanandal, Manamadurai, Partibanur, Kamudakkudi, Paramakudi, Pandikanomi, Sattirakkudi, Ramnad, Valantaravai, Uchippuli, Mandapam, Pamban, Thangachimadam, Rameswaram, and Dhanushkodi on the South Indian Railway to any person intending or believed to be intending to be present at the said festival.

All persons proceeding to the said festival in contravention of this notification will be turned back.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

## Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended July 10, 1915.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 86 (4 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 42 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 13 Moors, 1 Malay, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1915, viz., 251,338) was 17·8, as against 16·4 in the preceding week, 24·9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22·2 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 118 (12 Burghers, 59 Sinhalese, 17 Tamils, 24 Moors, 1 Malay, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 24·5, as against 25·3 in the previous week, 30·2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26·7 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 118 total deaths, 28 were of infants under one year of age, as against 29 in the preceding week and in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 7.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—Thirteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 14 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 6 were in Kotahena, 3 in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 2 in St. Paul's, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Wellawatta. Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

2. Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as in the previous week, against 14 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 7 were in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospital), 2 in Kotahena, 1 in St. Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, and 1 in Slave Island.

3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 1 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last year; of these, 3 were in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals) and 1 in Slave Island.

4. No deaths from *Plague* have been registered since the week ended May 29, 1915, and no cases reported since the week ended June 12, 1915.

5. Two deaths from *Smallpox* were registered in St. Paul's; 2 cases were reported. No deaths were registered and no cases reported in the previous week.

6. Thirteen deaths from *Dysentery* were registered, 10 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 8 from *Enteritis*, 7 from *Debility*, 5 from *Diarrhoea*, 1 from *Worms*, and 40 from *Other Causes*.

7. Two cases of *Chickenpox* were reported, the same number as in the previous week. No cases of *Measles* were reported.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 81·9°, against 81·6° in the preceding week and 81·3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·838 in., against 29·868 in. in the preceding week and 29·816 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1·27 in., against 2·40 in. in the preceding week and 1·90 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
