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### MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Chairman of the Municipal Council of Kandy will receive sealed tenders for the purchase of the under-mentioned Ferry Toll Rents of the Kandy Municipality from January 1, 1916, to December 31, 1916. The tenders, which must be in sealed envelopes, superscribed "Tender for Toll Rents," will be received at the Municipal Office until 8 A.M. on Saturday, September 18, 1915, when they will be opened, and all persons making tenders will be required to be present, and tender must be delivered in person.

2. The person whose tender is selected by the Chairman for submission to the Municipal Council will be required to deposit at once one-tenth of the purchase amount in cash; and should the tender be accepted by the Council, to furnish approved security for one-half of the whole purchase amount, or in cash for one-third of the whole purchase amount, within thirty days of the date of the receipt by him of the notification of the Council's acceptance of his offer. If deeds are tendered as security, the one-tenth cash deposit will be retained till the rent is closed.

3. He will also be required to deposit money to pay the fees of Counsel for examining and giving his opinion on the title deeds of properties tendered by him as security, and for examining and settling the security bond, and the fees charged by the Council's proctor for examining documents and drawing the security bond, and also the expenses of appraising the properties and of registering the security bond.

4. All title deeds tendered as security should be accompanied by a certificate obtained from the Registrar of Lands that the lands to which they relate are unencumbered. This certificate must be obtained at the cost of the party offering the security.

5. The renter shall be bound to provide and maintain, at his own expense, sufficient boats and boats' crew at the said ferry, the seaworthiness of the boats, and the number of the crew being subject to the approval of the Chairman, Municipal Council.

6. Further information regarding conditions of sale can be obtained on application to the Secretary, Municipal Council.

**NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."**

THE following specification has been accepted:—

No. 1,443 of April 15, 1915.

*Carter White.*

"Improvements in and relating to the treatment of mineral oils and residues for the production of lower boiling hydrocarbons."

*Abstract.*—The inventor states:—

This invention relates to a process of treating mineral oils or residues for the purpose of producing therefrom lower hydrocarbons of the paraffin series or products of low boiling point and low flash point of approximately the character of petrol.

According to the invention the oil or residue is brought in a liquid state and without addition of steam on to quicklime (preferably in the form of small pieces or lumps), which is heated to a temperature of about 400—650°C. in a suitable retort or chamber. A temperature between 550°C. and 575°C. is found to be suitable, but a temperature as low as about 400° or as high as 650°C. may be employed. The oil or residue may be sprayed or trickled on to the lime or be admitted thereto in a thin sheet or film or otherwise. It is essential that no steam or water be admitted with the oil into contact with the quicklime; it is also essential that the oil or residue be admitted to the retort or chamber in a liquid state.

The oil on coming into contact with the hot quicklime volatilizes, and the vapours of oil thus produced are absorbed into the lime, where they undergo molecular rearrangement, with consequent production of a large proportion of lower hydrocarbons of lower boiling point and lower flash point.

The claims are:—

1. A process for the treatment of mineral oils and residues, characterized in that the oil or residue, with or without previous distillation to remove lower boiling hydrocarbons, is brought in a liquid state, and without addition of steam on to quicklime or quicklime containing carbon heated to a temperature of about 400° to 650°C. and preferably about 550° to 575°C. in a retort or chamber.

2. Process for the treatment of mineral oils and residues according to claim 1, characterized in that suction is applied to the retort or chamber to draw away the vapours generated for the purpose of restraining the degradation or reduction of the same into undesired low forms.

3. In a process according to claim 1 or 2, distilling or fractionating the products from the retort or chamber to remove the petrol or lower boiling product therefrom.
