NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

THE following Specification has been accepted:—

No. 1,447 of April 27, 1915.

Samuel Cleland Davidson.

"Improvements in or relating to tea leaf rolling machinery."

Abstract.—The inventor states:—

This invention relates to tea leaf rolling machinery of the type described in my prior Ceylon Patents Nos. 1,118, 1,220, and 1,296.

The present invention has for its object to provide an improved construction of container, and (or) the devices which retard the rotation of the mass of leaf in the container whilst under the action of the plough which rotates in the centre of the container.

The specifications of my said prior patents describe various constructions of retarding devices which were in the form of narrow battens or bars of various shape and disposition, generally inclined, but sometimes arranged as narrow vertical ribs, the object of the said retarders being to prevent the leaf being swept round by the plough along the inner face of the container.

According to the present invention, the container is provided on its interior with vertically disposed inward projections which form retarding devices, the retarding area of which either collectively or separately is of considerable proportions relatively to the container. The said devices will be hereinafter referred to as retarders.

According to one modification, the container is provided on its interior with vertically disposed inward projections which form the retarders and which are of considerable width relatively to the circumference of the container. These retarders diminish or fade away towards the base of the container, and are of wedge-shape in cross section with the deeper part leading in the direction in which the plough rotates, and the said retarders there merge into the circular space of the container above the level of the projecting shoulder at the lower end of the blade or blades of the central rotary plough. In this way the base of the container will be circular, and the maximum projection of the retarders will be towards the top. The retarders may be tapered away towards the base, both in face view and in section.

According to a second modification, the container may be indented to give the same or an equivalent inside formation as that of the above-described retarders, and thereby obviate the requirement for these retarders being attached as separate parts on the inner face of the container.

According to a third modification, the sheets forming the leaf container may be corrugated in the form of successive slight corrugations extending vertically from near the top to near the bottom of the leaf container.

The claims are:—

1. A tea leaf rolling machine consisting of the combination of a vertical container with a central rotary plough in combination with retarders extended vertically or approximately so, and the retarding area of which is collectively or separately of considerable proportion relatively to that of the container.

2. A tea leaf rolling machine consisting of the combination of a vertical container with central rotary plough in combination with retarders extended vertically or approximately so, and which are collectively of considerable width relatively to the circumference of the casing and present a wedge-like or inclined face to the mass of leaf being operated upon, substantially as set forth.

3. A tea leaf rolling machine as claimed in claim 1, wherein the inner face of the cylindrical container is formed with successive vertical rib-like corrugations extending from near the top to near the bottom of the container, or substantially so.

4. A tea leaf rolling machine as claimed in claim 1, wherein the inner face of the cylindrical container has mounted upon it retarders consisting of successive vertical or substantially vertical ribs extending from near the top to near the bottom of the container, or substantially so.

5. A tea leaf rolling machine comprising the combination of a circular container with central rotary plough and retarders which are collectively of considerable width relatively to the circumference of the casing and projecting from the walls of the container, said retarders extending axially of the container for the greater part of the height thereof and merging into the circular section of the container at or near the base thereof, which retarders may be applied separately to the inner face of the cylindrical container or may be indented into the sheet forming such cylinder so as to give the same inside formation thereon as the separately applied retarders, substantially as set forth.

6. A tea leaf rolling machine as claimed in claim 1, wherein the internal walls of the container are formed with retarders consisting of successive vertical corrugations extending from near the top to near the bottom of the container, or substantially so.

7. A tea leaf rolling machine as claimed in claims 1 and 2, wherein the central rotary plough is provided with a shoulder such as c, and is carried out from the shoulder in a curve to substantially the full width of the container at its base, the retarding device merges into the circular section of the container above the said shoulder of the central rotary plough, substantially as set forth.

8. The improved tea leaf rolling machine consisting of the combination of a circular container, a central rotary plough such as c, and vertically extending retarding devices of collectively considerable width relative to the circumference of the casing, substantially as set forth with reference to the accompanying drawings.

9. In a tea leaf rolling machine the combination with the mechanism claimed in the preceding claims of an air draught apparatus and means for operating the same, substantially as described with reference to the accompanying drawings.

10. The improved tea leaf rolling machine consisting of the combination of parts, substantially as described with reference to and illustrated in the accompanying drawings, and subject to the modifications referred to.
