VITAL STATISTICS OF CEYLON.

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL OF MARRIAGES, BIRTHS, AND DEATHS FOR  
THE FIRST QUARTER OF 1915.

INTRODUCTORY.

My quarterly report hitherto contained 12 tables of which No. III., which related to Sinhalese Births and Deaths and their rates in Sinhalese districts and sub-divisions, No. IV., which related to Tamil Births and Deaths and their rates in Tamil districts and sub-divisions, and No. V., which related to Moor Births and Deaths and their rates in Batticaloa and Puttalam districts and their sub-divisions, are, in this report, consolidated and shown as Table III., excluding therefrom the figures for sub-divisions: Table VI. (Deaths among the various races registered in the Island and in each Province and District in each month of the quarter) and Table IX. (Causes of deaths in the districts of the Island) are now omitted: and Tables X. and XI. which gave all causes of death in the Island and estates respectively are now substituted by Tables VI. and VII. in which are shown selected causes of death.

The number of towns proclaimed under sections 31–36 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1895 is now 33, Ambalangoda proclaimed with effect from January 1, 1915, being included for the first time.

I.—Population.

The population on the last day of the quarter was estimated at 4,323,074. There was an excess of 8,067 births over deaths, but a decrease of 2,015 in immigration during the quarter under review.

2. *Indian Coolies.*—There were 8,561 arrivals and 10,576 departures of Indian coolies, as against averages of 13,519 and 20,620 in the corresponding quarters of the past decade.

II.—Marriages.

3. 5,426 marriages (4,002 General and 1,424 Kandyan) were registered during the quarter, as against 5,938 in the preceding quarter, 5,681 during the first quarter of 1914, and 5,029 the mean of the ten preceding first quarters. Table I. in the Appendix gives their distribution by Provinces and Districts.

III.—Births.

4. The births registered during the quarter numbered 42,037 and corresponded to an annual rate of 39·5 per 1,000 of the estimated population. This rate is 4·7 more than that of the previous quarter, but 2·4 less than the mean of the ten preceding first quarters. The estate births correspond to a rate of 38·9 per 1,000 and the urban (including those of Colombo) to 30·84. The Colombo rate is 29·13. For detailed statistics see Tables I. to V. in the Appendix.

252 stillbirths were registered in the 33 towns, as against 255 in the previous quarter and 300 in the corresponding quarter of last year. (See Table V.)

IV.—Deaths.

5. The number of deaths registered during the quarter was 33,970, corresponding to an annual rate of 31·9. This rate is 4·4 more than that in the previous quarter, but 3·2 less than the mean of the ten preceding first quarters. The Western Province with a rate of 24·5 maintains its usual place as the healthiest Province in the Island, while the unhealthiest was the North-Central with 60·7. In the districts the death-rate ranged from 21·6 in Negombo to 67·4 in Mannar. The rate of mortality on estates is 37·4, with the highest rate (69·3) recorded, as usual, for the estates of Ratnapura. The urban rate is 33·26, while the rate ranged from 13·89 in Tangalla to 71·67 in Mannar. In the town of Colombo the death-rate is 30·10. See Tables I. to V. for detailed statistics.

V.—Infantile Mortality.

6. The infant mortality rates appearing in this report are worked out differently from those which appeared in previous reports. The method hitherto adopted was to measure the infant mortality by the proportion of deaths under one year to 1,000 births registered in the quarter under review, but now the rate is calculated not on the births registered during the quarter under review, but on the births registered during the year ending the last day of the quarter. Thus calculated the rate is 232 for all races. During the quarter under review nearly 72 per cent. of the children under 1 year died in the town of Vavuniya, whilst in the towns of Tangalla and Kalutara the percentage was less than 15. Colombo Town recorded 34 per cent. (Table V.). The estate infantile mortality ranged from 384 in the estates of Kurunegala to 138 in the estates of Kegalla.

## VI.—Causes of Death.

7. Pyrexia, as usual, heads the list with 6,383 deaths, or 19 per cent. of the total deaths. 11 per cent. were due to Diarrhoea and Enteritis, 10 per cent. to Infantile Convulsions, 8 per cent. to Diseases of Skin and Cellular Tissue, 5 per cent. to Diseases of Early Infancy, 4 per cent. to Rickets, 3 per cent. each to Dysentery, Anæmia, Phthisis, Diseases of Pregnancy, Pneumonia, Senility, and Dropsy, and 2 per cent. each to Malaria and Malarial Cachexia and Anchylostomiasis. There were 29 deaths (all in Colombo) registered from Plague, as against 73 in the previous quarter and 120 in the corresponding quarter of the previous year; there were also 51 deaths from Smallpox, as against 53 in the previous quarter and 1 in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. (*Vide Table VI.*)

8. Affections caused by external causes—

(a) *Suicide*.—Fifty-eight deaths were due to suicide, against 44 in the previous quarter and 58 in the corresponding quarter of the previous year.

(b) *Homicide*.—Fifty-six deaths were due to homicide, against 48 in the preceding quarter and 61 in the corresponding quarter of the previous year. Of these, 5 were caused by firearms and 29 by cutting or piercing instruments.

(c) *Executions*.—Eleven judicial executions took place during the quarter as in the previous quarter, against 12 in the corresponding quarter of the previous year.

(d) *Accidents*.—Of the 476 deaths attributed to violence, 107 deaths were due to drowning (of which 39 were in wells), 84 to falls from trees, and 46 to burns. Snake bite caused 56 deaths, landslides 22, and fall of heavy substances 19. Trains were responsible for 10 deaths, carts for 8, and motor cars for 7.

9. *Causes of Deaths on the Estates*.—The highest mortality on the estates was from Diarrhoea and Enteritis and Diseases of Early Infancy, to each of which were due 15 per cent. of the total deaths. Dysentery accounted for 13 per cent.; Anchylostomiasis, 9 per cent.; Pneumonia, 8 per cent.; Infantile Convulsions, 7 per cent.; Senility, 4 per cent.; Dropsy, Malaria, and Malarial Cachexia, Diseases of Pregnancy, and Bronchitis 2 per cent. each; and Phthisis and Pyrexia 1 per cent. each. See Table VII. for detailed statistics.

10. *Causes of Deaths in the Towns*.—In the 33 towns of the Island (inclusive of Colombo) Malaria and Malarial Cachexia was responsible for 9 per cent. of the total deaths; Pneumonia, Convulsions, and Diarrhoea, 8 per cent. each; Phthisis, 7 per cent.; Infantile Debility, 6 per cent.; Dysentery, 5 per cent.; Anchylostomiasis, 4 per cent.; Enteritis, 3 per cent.; Bright's Disease and Nephritis, and Bronchitis, 2 per cent. each; and Puerperal Septicæmia, Enteric Fever, and Plague 1 per cent. each.
