BY-LAW REFERRED TO.

Every person proceeding on foot along a street shall keep to the pavement or footpath, if any, or where there is no pavement or footpath to the right hand side of the street. WHEREAS by section 4 (1) of Ordinance No. 3 of 1903, it is enacted that when it appears to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time, that by reason of the existence or apprehension of crime and outrage in any district it is desirable to quarter police in such district, or should a Police Force have been already established there to increase the same, he may by Proclamation, which shall be published in the Government Gazette, declare that for the reason aforesaid such district requires police or additional police, and may order police to be quartered in such district or additional police be employed there:

And whereas it appears to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, that by reason of the existence of crime and outrage in the district defined in the schedule hereunto annexed it is desirable to quarter police in the said district:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that by reason of the existence of crime and outrage therein the said district in the Western Province requires police, and do hereby order that a Police Force consisting of one sergeant and four constables be quartered in the said district in the said Western Province as from and after November 1, 1915.

And We do further hereby define the limits of the said district to be those set out in the schedule hereunto

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 80, 1915.

Births.—The total births registered in the City of Colombo in the week were 81 (4 Burghers, 42 Sinhalese, 17 Tamils, 15 Moors, 2 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1915, viz., 251,338) was 16.8, as against 21.0 in the preceding week, 18.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.2 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 114 (5 Burghers, 66 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 9 Moors, 2 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 23 7, as against 24 1 in the previous week, 27 2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26 7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 114 total deaths, 29 were of infants under one year of age, as against 33 in the preceding week, 30 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

Principal Causes of Death.—Eighteen deaths from Phthisis were registered, as against 15 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 6 were in Maradana (including 4 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in San Sebastian, 3 in St. Paul's, 2 in New Bazaar, 2 in Slave Island, 1 in Pettah, and 1 in Wellawatta.

- 2. Nine deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 18 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 3 were in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 2 in Pettah, 2 in Slave Island, 1 in Kotahena, and 1 in Wellawatta. 6 deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.
- 3. Five deaths from *Plague* were registered, as against 3 in the previous week. Of these, 3 were in Pettah, 1 in St. Paul's, and 1 in New Bazaar. Five cases were reported, as against 8 in the previous week.
- 4. Four deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, as against 1 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 1 was in St. Paul's, 1 in Maradana, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta.
- 5. One death from Smallpox of a resident of New Bazaar was registered, as against 2 in the preceeding week. Four cases were reported, as against 6 in the preceding week.
- 6. Fourteen deaths from Infantile Convulsions were registered, 11 from Debility, 4 from Enteritis, 4 from Worms, 2 from Dysentery, 2 from Tetanus, 1 from Diarrhæa, and 33 from Other Causes.
- 7. Fifteen cases of Chickenpox were reported, as against 9 in the previous week. No cases of Measles were reported.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.2°, against 80.7° in the preceding week and 79.4° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.829 in., against 29.814 in. in the preceding week and 29.857 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 12.66 in., against 0.11 in. in the preceding week and 2.85 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
