BY THE KING.

A Proclamation relating to Trading with the Enemy.

GEORGE R. I.

Whereas doubts have arisen as respects the position under the Proclamations for the time being in force relating to Trading with the Enemy of incorporated companies or bodies of persons which, though not incorporated in any enemy country or in territory in hostile occupation, carry on business in any such country or territory:

And whereas it is expedient that the position of those companies or bodies for the purposes of those Proclamations should be defined:

Now, therefore, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation declaring, and it is hereby declared, as follows:-

For the purposes of the Proclamations for the time being in force relating to Trading with the Enemy, the expression "enemy," notwithstanding anything in the said Proclamations, is hereby declared to include, and to have included, any incorporated company or body of persons (wherever incorporated) carrying on business in an enemy country or in any territory for the time being in hostile occupation.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Fourteenth day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Fifteen, and in the Sixth year of Our Reign. 15

Srr,—I have the honour to inform you that by section 7 (2) of the National Registration Act, 1915, every person between the ages of 15 and 65 arriving in the United Kingdom after the passing of the Act is required within twenty-eight days after his arrival, if he has not been previously registered, to send or deliver to a local registration authority, by post or otherwise, notice of his arrival, together with the particulars concerning himself required by the Act to be registered, and, if so required, to attend at such place and time as the authority may appoint, and answer such questions as may be addressed to him for the purpose of enabling the necessary particulars to be registered.

2. I shall be glad if you will take steps to communicate this provision generally to the officers serving under your administration and to cause the special attention of every officer coming on leave to be called to the

THE following rules made by the District Committee, Kegalla, under section 12 of "The Buddhist Temporalities Ordinance, 1905," and approved by the Governor and the Executive Council, are published for general

They supersede the rules dated July 20, 1908, and published in the Ceylon Government Gazette No. 6,252 of July 24, 1908.

RULES.

- 1. The President of the District Committee or in his absence the President for the time being elected under rule 2 and one member shall form a quorum.
- In the absence of the President at any meeting, one of the members present shall be elected as President for the occasion.
- 3. The Committee shall appoint one of their members as Honorary Secretary, and shall employ as many clerks and messengers as may be found necessary.
- 4. The Honorary Secretary shall enter in a book the business to be placed before each meeting; and shall record in another book the minutes of the proceedings of each meeting, and the minutes shall be read and confirmed from time to time at every subsequent meeting, the President signing such confirmation.
- 5. Every question coming before the meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes. Whenever the votes of members present happen to be equal, the President shall, besides his vote as a member, have a casting vote.
- 6. The meetings of the District Committee shall be held on the first Saturday of every alternate month at 3 r.x. at the Kegalla Buddhist School or in any other place notified by the Secretary.
- 7. The President shall have the power to convene a special meeting of the Committee at any time by giving the other members not less than forty-eight hours' notice thereof in writing, and it shall be his duty to convene such meetings if and whenever any two or more members by an application in writing request him to convene such meeting,
- 8. The Secretary shall have three registers as per forms hereto annexed marked A, B, and C, showing lists of movable and immovable properties, statements of income and expenditure of each temple, and names of priests belonging to each
- 9. Every charge or charges preferred in writing against any Buddhist priest by two or more Dayakayas of any temple shall be inquired into by the District Committee, and if it appears that the charge is true, the District Committee shall report the same to the Sangasabhawa of the Nikaya to which the priest belongs. If the Sangasabhawa shall not take any steps within a month from the date of such report, or within any extended time that shall be granted by the District Committee, the District Committee shall call upon such priest to show cause within a stated time why the trustee of the temple should not be ordered to withhold maintenance of such priest from temple funds. If the priest fails within such time to show sufficient cause, the District Committee shall order the trustee to refuse maintenance from temple funds. maintenance from temple funds.
- 10. Each temple shall contribute an amount proportionate to its income for defraying the expenses already incorred or to be incurred by the Committee in carrying out the provisions of the Buddhist Temporalities Ordinance.
- 11. Each trustee shall on or before March 31 in each year prepare and transmit to the District Committee
 - (a) Estimates showing the probable receipts of each temple within its jurisdic-
 - tion for the ensuing year.
 (b) Estimates of proposed disbursements for the ensuing year.

The Secretary of the District Committee likewise shall make yearly estimates of the proposed disbursements in his department, and submit them to the District Committee with the estimates of the trustees.

- 12. The District Committee shall carefully revise the estimates laid before them by the trustees and shall assess and determine the amounts which each temple shall contribute. The Secretary of the District Committee shall then return estimates to the respective trustees, who shall recover from the different temples the amount payable by each.
- 13. Trustees shall recover and remit to the District Committee all sums so assessed due by the different temples on or before June 50 in every year. The District Committee shall then remit, on application, to each of the trustees the amounts sanctioned in the estimates that have been received and passed.
- 14. The Secretary of the District Committee shall deposit in a bank selected by the Committee all contributions from temples as well as all income derived from other sources, and shall make disbursements under the directions of the Committee. At every meeting of the Committee held under rule 6 the Secretary shall submit a statement of receipts and expenditure, and produce his bank books and cheque books for inspection.
- 15. At the end of each financial year the trustees shall remit to the District Committee all surplus funds which they may have in their hands. The Secretary shall deposit such moneys as a special fund, and shall, under the directions of the

Committee, advance from time to time such amounts as trustees may actually require for the use and benefit of the different temples.

- 16. All trustees shall make full returns of all movable property and moneys in their hands within one month of the publication of these rules in the Government Gazette. Thenceforth they shall make quarterly returns to the District Committee.
- 17. It shall be the duty of the President of the District Committee to prosecute trustees who may be found disobedient or neglectful of the duties imposed on them by law.
- 18. Every trustee shall within two months of the publication of these rules in the Government Gazette furnish full and correct lists of lands belonging to the different temples which were sold, mortgaged, or otherwise alienated before the passing of Ordinance No. 3 of 1889.
- 19. Every trustee who shall, with the permission of the District Committee, grant a lease of land belonging to any temple, shall forward a certified copy of such lease to the District Committee to be filed in their office.
- 20. No trustee shall grant any lease of temple land without the sanction in writing of the District Committee, and where such sanction has been obtained, it shall be the duty of the trustee to put up the right of possession for sale by public auction after one month's clear notice of the sale. The highest bidder at such sale shall be entitled to obtain a lease from the trustee, subject to the approval of the District Committee.
- 21. The District Committee shall have power, whenever it seems to them necessary or expedient, to authorize one or more of their members to inspect and report upon the condition and management of any temple, and the expenses of such inspection shall be paid out of the funds of the particular temple concerned.
- 22. The District Committee shall have the power to inspect and examine all the books and movable property and moneys of any temple and the accounts and papers of any trustee by deputing one or more of their members for the purpose at any time and as often as the Committee deem such inspection necessary.

T is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council; in exercise of the powers vested in him by section 7 of "The Land Surveyors, Auctioneers, and Brokers Ordinances, 1889 and 1909," has been pleased to make the following regulations, and to revoke the regulations published in the Notifications dated June 13, 1910, September 8, 1913, and April 7, 1914, promulgated in the Government Gazettes of June 17, 1910, September 12, 1913, and May 29, 1914, respectively.

B .- For License to practise as a Surveyor.

(Course, Eighteen Months.)

- 1. The Entrance Examination will be held by such officers of the Survey Department and on such dates as shall be duly authorized by His Excellency the Governor, and will be as follows:—
- 2. Handwriting, Orthography, Composition, Arithmetic, Geometry (first book of Euclid), Algebra (up to and including Quadratic Equations), Plane Trigonometry (Elementary), Mensuration, and Plan Drawing.
- Before admission to the examination, candidates must fill up the form "A" referred to in rule 6 (printed at the end of these Regulations).
- 4. Candidates who hold certificates that they have passed the Senior Cambridge or other examination of similar standing, or that they have matriculated at the London University or other similar institution from time to time approved by His Excellency the Governor, will be exempted from this examination in all subjects, if their certificates show that they have passed in mathematics.
 - 5. The syllabus of the course will be as follows:---

Fieldwork.—Chain surveying, theodolite surveying, and levelling, including adjustments of the theodolite and level, laying out curves.

Drawing.—Setting out, plotting, drawing up, computing, and making a report on a survey.

6. The course will include also mathematics and mensuration, and the theory of surveying and levelling up to the limits required for the Surveyor-General's examination for the Government license for surveying and levelling.

Fees.

- The fees will be Rs. 150 paid in advance for the course (eighteen months), but if a candidate then fails to obtain a license, he may continue his training for another six months on payment of a further fee of Rs. 50; in addition, a deposit of Rs. 100 must be made on admission, to be returned to the student on leaving the School, less estimated value of any damage done to instruments or other property of Government and cost of instruments, &c., supplied for his use after completion of the course.
- 8. Students who have obtained the Surveyor-General's license in surveying and levelling are eligible for appointments in the Survey Department on the recommendation of the Surveyor-General, on the same terms as those who have been trained under Regulations A.
- The number of students to be admitted to Class A will be limited to the probable requirements of the Survey Department, while those for Class B will be limited to ten.

10. Annual licenses will be granted in "Surveying and Levelling," "Surveying" only, or "Levelling" only, to those who pass the final examination for those purposes by the Surveyor-General.

11. All students of the class will be under the authority of the Surveyor-General. They will be expected to attend the class at the times and dates laid down for the Survey Department Training School, and the Surveyor-General is authorized to dismiss them from the class for irregular attendance, bad conduct, or insufficient progress in their studies.

Rules re Examination of License Surveyors.

- 1. Examiners, Date, and Place of Examination.—The examiners shall be one or more officers of the Survey Department appointed annually by the Surveyor-General.
- 2. The examination shall be held during the last quarter of each year. A notice of the time and place at which the examination will be held shall be published one month beforehand in the Government Gazette.
- 3. Subjects of Examination.—The examination shall comprise the following

Mathematics.—Algebra up to quadratic equations, plane trigonometry, and the mensuration of surfaces and solids.

Drawing.—Setting out, plotting, tracing, and office work, including a report on a survey.

Field Work.—Chain surveying, the odolite surveying, and levelling, including the adjustments of the theodolite and level, and setting out curves.

- (a) Candidates found to be in communication with a surveyor or referring to books, notes, printed papers, or diagrams, or having them in their possession or available for reference during their examination, shall be disqualified.
- (b) Candidates shall produce instruments in good order, and no excuse will be admitted on account of defective instruments during examination.
- (c) No candidate shall be allowed to compete who presents himself ten minutes late for any subject.
- (d) Adjustments.—Forty minutes shall be allowed for the correct adjustment of each instrument.
 - (c) The maximum collimation error allowed shall be 0.01 foot at two chains.
- (f) Candidates who fail in adjustments shall be debarred from taking further part in the examination.
- (g) Field Work-During the progress of field work, the examiner shall inspect the candidates on the ground.
- (h) Candidates shall be expected to be at work in the field between the hours fixed by the examiner.
- (i) Field and level books should be kept clearly and in ink, or the work will not be accepted. Each page must be numbered, paged, and dated, and full reference properly made. No erasures shall be allowed. Mistakes should be corrected so that the original figures are plainly visible, and a short explanation written opposite the correction. Level books must be clearly referenced and properly reduced.
- (j) Field and level books must be new, and must bear the name of the candidate neatly printed on the outside of the cover.

The field book must contain-

- (a) The record of the survey.
- (b) Report on the same. Co-ordinates
- (d) Computation of areas.

The level book must contain-

- (a) Flying levels.(b) Longitudinal section.
- Check levels.
- (d) Cross sections.
- (e) Computation of earthwork.

No loose sheets shall be accepted. All field and level books must be delivered to the person appointed to receive them after work is over for the day. be called for the next morning by the candidates at the time fixed by the examiner.

- (k) Surveying.—The largest angular misclosure in minutes shall be 4 per cent. of e number of lines. The largest misclosure allowed in chainage shall be five links the number of lines. per mile. (l) Levelling.—The largest misclosure allowed in levelling shall be 0.06 foot per
- (m) The closing readings must in all cases be taken only in the examiner's presence or of some person deputed by him.
- (n) Office Work.—Plans and sections must be accurately plotted. They should be (n) Office Work.—Plans and sections must be accurately plotted. They should be neat and well drawn. All lines must be drawn with the drawing or ruling pen, crow-quills being used for lettering only. Survey plans must be plotted to the scale of one chain to an inch. Plans must be drawn up within a reasonable time, which shall be determined by the Surveyor-General. All plans must be dated and signed by the candidates

(e) The areas computed on a plan must be distinctly shown by a narrow coloured border.

(p) Candidates will be expected to plot their survey by co-ordinates. The ations should be numbered similarly in the field book and the co-ordinate sheet and carefully cross referenced.

MISCELLANEOUS DEPARTMENTAL NOTICES.

Regulations relating to Courses of Instruction and Examinations in Chemistry and Physics for Teachers at the Government Technical Schools.

I.—GENERAL CONDITIONS.

- 1. A number of scholarships are annually awarded in March tenable for two years at the Government Techincal Schools. The holders go through courses of instructions in chemistry and physics with a view to qualifying as Science Teachers. The certificate is obtained as a result of passing two examinations.
- 2. The scholarship entitles the holder to free attendance at the necessary courses of instruction and to an allowance of Rs. 480 per annum, conditional on regular attendance and diligence.
- 3. Suitable candidates who do not obtain one of the scholarships may be admitted to the courses of instruction and examinations on payment of a fee of Rs. 72 50 payable in two instalments, one on May 1 of each year.
- 4. Such scholars and students will be required, before commencing the course of studies, to sign a bond to the effect that they will complete the two years' course of instruction and then follow the teaching profession for three years. A.—Chemistry: (a) One written paper of one hour on chemical facts.
(b) One written paper of three hours on general, physical, and organic chemistry.
(c) A practical and oral examination of four hours.

Candidates must be familiar with-

Ordinary qualitative and quantitative analysis;
 Use of physical chemical apparatus, such as thermostats, conducticity and viscosity apparatus, polorimetry, and any other exercise which the course may include for the time being.
 Preparation and identification of carbon compounds and quantitative determination of nitrogen

and fats in such compounds.

B.—Physics: (a) One written paper of one hour on physical facts.
(b) One written paper of three hours on the properties of matter, sound, light, heat, magnetism, and electricity.

VITAL STATISTICS.

November 6, 1915.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 13, 1915.

**Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 100 (9 Burghers, 54 Sinhalese. 13 Tamils, 21 Moors, 2 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per amum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1915, viz., 251,338) was 20.7, as against 20.3 in the preceding week, 19.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.2 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 107 (3 Burghers, 53 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 22 Moors, 3 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 22 2, as against 27 6 in the previous week, 28 7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26 7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 107 total deaths, 24 were of infants under one year of age, as against 31 in the preceding week, 23 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 7.

Principal Causes of Death.—Twelve deaths from Phthisis were registered, as against 20 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 7 were in Maradana (including 4 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in St. Paul's, 2 in Kotahena, and 1 in San Sebastian.

- 2. Eight deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 13 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average at year. Of these, 5 were in Maradana (including 4 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 1 in Kotahena, 1 in Slave for last year. Of these, 5 we Island, and 1 in Kollupitiya.
- 3. Seven deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, as against 2 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 3 were in Kotahena, 3 in Maradana, and 1 in St. Paul's.
- 4. No deaths from Smallpox were registered during the week. There was I in the previous week. No cases were reported; 2 were reported in the previous week.
- 5. No deaths from Plague were registered during the week. There was I in the previous week. Two cases were reported; none were reported in the previous week.
- 6. Eleven deaths from Infantile Convulsions were registered, 10 from Debility, 8 from Enteritis, 3 from Dysentery, 3 from Tetanus, 2 from Worms, 1 from Diarrhæa, and 42 from Other Causes.

7. One case of Chickenpox was reported, as against 10 in the previous week. No cases of Measles were reported.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79·1°, against 79·6° in the preceding week and 80·3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·834 in., against 29·795 in. in the preceding week and 29·829 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 6·84 in., against 6·13 in: in the preceding week and 3·00 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
