By His Excellency Sir ROBERT CHALMERS, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

ROBERT CHALMERS.

KNOW Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the powers vested by section 4 (1) of Ordinance No. 8 of 1905, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation dated January 24, 1907, so far as it relates to the division of the Alutnuwara district into three subdistricts, and hereby divide the said Alutnuwara district into three different subdistricts set out in the schedule.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Nineteenth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Fifteen.

WHEREAS by Proclamations dated February 28, 1900, and December 19, 1901, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, divided the Kandyan Provinces enumerated in Schedule B to the Ordinance No. 3 of 1870 into the districts set forth in the schedules to the said Proclamations :

And whereas it is expedient to alter and amend the said divisions :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by section 5 of the said Ordinance, do, by this Our Proclamation, alter and amend, with effect from January 1, 1916, the districts specified in the first column of the annexed schedule in the manner specified in the second column thereof.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-first day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Fifteen.

WHEREAS it is desirable further to amend Our Proclamation issued in pursuance of "The Necessaries of War Exportation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1914," dated the 24th day of September, 1915, published in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,745 of the 8th day of October, 1915, and added to and amended by Our Proclamations dated the 26th day of October and the 4th day of November, 1915, respectively :

Know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in pursuance of the said "The Necessaries of War Exportation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1914," do hereby amend Our Proclamation of the 24th day of September aforesaid, in the manner set out in the schedule hereto, and do call upon His Majesty's subjects and all other persons being in the said Island to govern themselves accordingly.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

## Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 20, 1915.

*Births.*—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 93 (3 Europeans, 7 Burghers, 54 Sinhalese, 12 Tamils, 15 Moors, 1 Malay, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1915, viz., 251,338) was 19·3, as against 20·7 in the preceding week, 23·2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22·2 the weekly average for last year.

*Deaths.*—The total deaths registered were 103 (8 Burghers, 55 Sinhalese, 19 Tamils, 17 Moors, 1 Malay, and 3 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 21·4, as against 22·2 in the previous week, 25·5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26·7 the weekly average for last year.

*Infantile Deaths.*—Of the 103 total deaths, 26 were of infants under one year of age, as against 24 in the preceding week, 30 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

*Stillbirths.*—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

*Principal Causes of Death.*—Nineteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 12 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 6 were in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 4 in San Sebastian, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in Kotahena, 2 in Wellawatta, 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in Kollupitiya.

2. Nine deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 8 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Maradana (including a death of a non-resident in hospital), 2 in Kotahena, 1 in Fort and Galle Face, 1 in St. Paul's, and 1 in Slave Island.

3. One death from *Enteric Fever* was registered (in New Bazaar), as against 7 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last year.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered in the Pettah. There were none in the previous week. Four cases were reported, as against 2 in the previous week.

5. No deaths from *Smallpox* were registered, and no cases were reported since the week ended 6th instant.

6. Thirteen deaths from *Infantile Convulsions* were registered, 10 from *Debility*, 8 from *Enteritis*, 4 from *Worms* 1 from *Dysentery*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 36 from *Other Causes*.

7. Fifteen cases of *Chickenpox* were reported, as against 1 in the previous week. No cases of *Measles* were reported.

*State of the Weather.*—The mean temperature of air was 77·3°, against 79·1° in the preceding week and 79·9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·861 in., against 29·834 in. in the preceding week and 29·792 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 11·80 in., against 6·84 in. in the preceding week and 3·71 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
