## PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir ROBERT CHALMERS, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

ROBERT CHALMERS.

WHEREAS by section 34 (1) of "The Ceylon Railways Ordinance, 1902," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to declare by Proclamation any road or path which the railway may cross to be a "minor crossing," and whether such "minor crossing" shall be closed by gates or not:

And whereas it is expedient to declare the roads and paths which the railway crosses between the stations of Kalutara North and Kalutara South and Kalutara South and Katukurunda respectively, in the Western Province, and set out in the schedule hereto, to be "minor crossings" for the purpose of the said Ordinance:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, in exercise of the power in Us vested as aforesaid, do hereby declare each of the said roads and paths to be a "minor crossing" for the purpose of the said Ordinance as from and after December 3, 1915, and that such "minor crossings" shall not be closed by gates.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-seventh day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Fifteen.

WHEREAS the Government Agent of the Province of Uva, by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 11 of "The Irrigation Ordinance, 1906," has drawn up the irrigation rules set forth in the schedule hereto for Hanwelle-ela irrigation work in the Province of Uva :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by section 20, do by this Our Proclamation give notice of Our approval of the said rules set forth in the schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

*Hanwelle-ela in Yatikinda.*

1. All rules enacted previous to this in respect of the above work are hereby cancelled, provided that such cancellation shall not affect—
  - (a) The past operation of such rules.
  - (b) Any right, obligation, or liability acquired, accrued, or incurred thereunder.
  - (c) Any punishment or penalty incurred in respect of any breach of the said rules.
  - (d) Any investigation or legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any such right, obligation, liability, penalty, or punishment, and every such investigation, legal proceeding, and remedy may be carried on as if the above rules had not been published.
2. The cultivation of fields under Hanwelle-ela irrigation work shall be confined to maha and yala harvests.
3. The cultivation for yala shall take place between April 1 and August 31 each year, and cultivation for maha between October 1 and February 28.
4. The following intervals between cultivation seasons are required for general repairs and maintenance of the work, and no water will be issued through any sluice or canals for distribution to the fields during these periods, viz. :—From September 1 to September 30, 30 days ; and from March 1 to March 30, 30 days.
5. The issue of water from the sluices and Government channels shall be regulated by the officer in charge of the work. No person except that officer or some person deputed by him shall interfere with the sluices of the irrigation work or channels or the issue of water therefrom.
6. The manager of fields shall furnish the irrigation headmen, within fifteen days before commencing cultivation, with a list of persons who have been employed as goiyas, showing the extent which each goiya cultivates. This list to be sent to the irrigation officer in charge of the work.
7. The distribution of water from the sluices on Government channels shall be regulated by the irrigation officer in charge of the work on written application from the Vel-Vidanes giving the area requiring water, and they shall take action to prevent any water running to waste.
8. It shall be compulsory on all proprietors whose lands are irrigable from any Government channel to construct their shares of the subsidiary channels required to irrigate such lands. The course of such channels and section and description to be constructed by each proprietor shall be determined by the officer in charge of the work according to the acreage of irrigable land held by each proprietor. The officer in charge will give notice to the Government Agent when and where any such channels are required.
9. The Government channel and all field channels shall be maintained in good order by the proprietors whose lands are irrigable thereby, and it shall be their duty to have all channels cleared before every cultivation, and to maintain them clear during the cultivation. In the event of any proprietor failing to clear his share of the channels, the officer in charge of the works shall give notice that such repair or maintenance is required to the Government Agent, who shall cause the work to be done and recover the cost thereof from the defaulter.
10. No dam may be constructed on any channel except on instructions from the officer in charge of the work.
11. Ploughing shall be commenced from agawata to the mulata fields and sowing in like manner, and no mulata proprietor shall plough his field before the agata proprietor, provided the latter ploughs in time.

12. Fences must be put up within six days of notice of apportionment being given by the Vel-Vidane. They must be sufficiently strong to keep out cattle, and each cultivator shall keep his portion of the fence in proper repair until the crop is reaped and gathered.

13. Each cultivator shall erect a proper watch hut adjoining the fence put up by him before sowing has commenced, and shall watch regularly until the crop is reaped and gathered, whether his own paddy is reaped or not.

14. In the event of any sudden and unforeseen accident occurring to any of the water-courses of such magnitude that it cannot be repaired in the ordinary manner, the field officer, through the Vel-Vidane, shall, by beat of tom-tom, call on all the proprietors or cultivators of lands irrigated by the water-course to attend on the spot and assist in repairing it, and such proprietors or cultivators thus called upon shall attend and assist accordingly.

15. It shall be the duty of irrigation headmen to properly distribute the water supplied from the Government channels or other sources by the irrigation officer in charge of the works to various fields or tracts of fields in their charge, and they shall be under the control of the Government Agent, and their dismissal shall rest with him.

16. The proprietors of lands under cultivation shall be liable to pay to the Vel-Vidane 4 kurunies per amun' m of sowing extent for yala and maha as huwandiram. If there is an unpaid Ela-Vidane, he shall recover one-fourth of the huwandiram paid to the Vel-Vidane.

17. These dues shall be paid by each proprietor before any of his crop is removed from the threshing-floor, and the irrigation headmen shall give receipts acknowledging the payment thereof.

18. The Government Agent shall have power to disallow the share or part of the huwandiram due to any headman who has been guilty of any neglect of his duties.

19. Persons neglecting or refusing to give the shares of huwandiram from their fields shall be liable to prosecution and to a fine equal to double value of the huwandiram due, half the fine to be credited to fine fund, and the other half to be paid in satisfaction of the huwandiram.

20. Any new channel that may be required by all the proprietors shall be made whenever the majority of the proprietors shall decide on making it, the work being executed by all in proportion to their respective shares. But if the minority of the proprietors do not concur in the decision of the majority, they shall be at liberty to appeal to the Village Council, and the decision of the Council either for or against the channel shall be final.

21. Should any new channel be required inside the field of some of the proprietors, and should the majority of the proprietors admit or a Village Council decide that it is necessary, it shall be made by all the proprietors through whose shares the channel has to pass, each opening the portion through his share.

22. Should any new channel be required outside the fields of some of the proprietors, and should the majority of the proprietors or a Village Council decide that it is necessary, it should be executed in the manner described in the 20th rule.

NOTICE is hereby given that an examination for candidates wishing to enter Class II., Grade III., of the Clerical Branch of the Public Service will take place on Monday, February 28, 1916, and following days.

2. Applications for admission to the examination by persons not now in the Public Service must be addressed to the Director of Education, must bear a duly cancelled stamp of Rs. 10, and must be in the form (Schedule A) attached to this notice. Forms are to be obtained at any Post Office on application, or within four days' notice. A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to be on February 28, 1916, between the ages of 18 and 21, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person,\* to the satisfaction of the Director of Education, must be attached to the form of application. If a certificate of birth for a previous examination has been already sent in, it will be sufficient to refer to the name and date of that examination. Affidavits will in no circumstances be accepted. In the case of candidates who submit certificates of registration from the register of past births, the certificates will only be accepted after consideration of the evidence by which the dates of birth were established. If the name appearing in the birth register differs, either by alteration or addition, from the name by which the candidate is known, the parent or guardian should, before obtaining a certificate, apply to the Registrar-General or his Assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 7 of Ordinance No. 23 of 1900. This examination is confined to British subjects whose families are permanently resident in the Island.

3. Clerks in Government service (other than members of the Customs, Postal, Survey, or Railway Departments) from whatever funds they may be paid, who have completed three years' service, and whose service has been throughout satisfactory, are eligible for examination irrespective of age and without fee. Their applications (in the same form, Schedule A) for admission to the examination should be forwarded to the Director of Education through the Heads of their Departments.

4. Applications should reach the Director of Education not later than 2 P.M. on December 31, 1915; any applications received after that hour, by whatever cause delayed, will be rejected.

5. The Director of Education will return to the candidate his application, approved or disapproved as the case may be, after taking, if necessary, the orders of Government thereon. The approved application shall constitute the candidate's ticket of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the Director of Education. A candidate not producing such form, whatever may be the reason for his not so doing, will be refused admittance to the examination.

6. The examination will be held at Colombo only, in the place and under the supervision of the officer specified in Schedule B. Heads of Departments are required to grant to officers of their Departments, whose applications to present themselves for examination have been returned to them approved by the Director of Education leave to present themselves at the examination.

7. The examination will be competitive. The number of places assigned for competition will be twenty.

8. The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.

9. The subjects for examination are those set out in Schedule C to this notice. The examination will be held in two parts. The first part a qualifying examination in Handwriting, Spelling, Arithmetic, and Bookkeeping. Any candidate failing to obtain two-thirds of the marks allotted for Handwriting, half those allowed for Spelling and Arithmetic respectively, and one-third of those allowed for Bookkeeping will be excluded from the remainder of the examination. Special attention will be paid to Handwriting, and candidates whose writing is untidy or illegible or contains defects in the formation of letters will be rigorously excluded. The kind of writing preferred is that generally known as the "Civil Service" hand. The second part of the examination will be in the remaining subjects in Schedule C. Should a candidate obtain less than one-third of the aggregate marks for the three subjects—Composition, General Paper, Précis Writing—or less than one-fourth marks in any other subject, or if he be a Sinhalese or Tamil, less than one-half of the marks in his native language, such marks will not be counted in his favour. In all the written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling.

10. Clerks of the description given in section 3 above will be allowed to compete amongst themselves, and will be eligible, if they obtain a minimum of 66 per cent. in Writing and 33 per cent. in the other compulsory subjects, for five of the appointments offered for competition.

11. Three more appointments will be reserved as prizes for deserving clerks of the same description, who have served Government continuously for ten years and upwards, to be selected irrespective of examination. No service under the age of sixteen years will be reckoned for this purpose.

## BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. Any person intending to alter the existing conditions of drainage of any land situated within the limits of the Jaffna Local Board by any building or planting operations, or by raising or lowering the level of such land, or by diverting or blocking any drain, channel, or waterway, or in any other manner, shall give six weeks' previous notice in writing to the Board. Such notice shall be accompanied by a Licensed Surveyor's plan showing levels, nature of buildings, provision for drainage, and proposed road or path reservations.
2. On receiving such notice the Board may approve the works so contemplated or give written directions for the necessary alterations with a view to prevent the stagnation of water.
3. Any person who alters the existing conditions of drainage of any land within the limits of the Jaffna Local Board without giving the notice required by by-law No. 1 or contrary to the directions, if any, given by the Board under by-law No. 2 shall be guilty of an offence punishable as provided for by section 107 of the Ordinance.
4. If any person alters the existing conditions of drainage of any land without giving notice to the Board or contrary to its directions, if any, with the result that any water stagnates, or any other result ensues which in the opinion of the Board is injurious to public health, the Board may order the previous conditions to be restored or some other work to be undertaken with a view to abate the nuisance. Such order shall state the time within which the previous conditions shall be restored or such other work undertaken, and shall be served in accordance with the provisions of section 90 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1898. If the previous conditions are not restored or such work is not carried out within the time fixed by the order, and after due service thereof, the Board may cause the previous conditions to be restored or such work to be carried out, and the expenses incurred in respect thereof shall be paid by the owner or occupier, and shall be recoverable as provided in sections 92, 93, 94, and 96 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1898.

## "THE SMALL TOWNS SANITARY ORDINANCE, 1892."

## "THE RIOT DAMAGES ORDINANCE, NO. 23 OF 1915."

THE following scheme framed by the Municipal Council of Colombo, under section 32, sub-section (1), of the above Ordinance, and approved by the Governor in Executive Council, under section 32, sub-section (2), is hereby published in terms of the last-named sub-section.

*Scheme framed by the Municipal Council of Colombo under Ordinance No. 23 of 1915, at the General Meeting held on November 26, 1915.*

Whereas under section 32 of Ordinance No. 23 of 1915, entitled "An Ordinance to provide Compensation for Losses by Riots" a Municipal Council may frame a scheme for the liquidation of the charges imposed upon its revenues under section 32 of the aforesaid Ordinance; and

Whereas it is necessary for the Municipal Council of Colombo to frame a scheme for the liquidation of the amount, together with the cost of the collection thereof, of the assessment of the compensation due on the damages occasioned during the riots which occurred in the Municipality of Colombo on May 31, 1915, and the following days.

It is hereby resolved, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, that—

1. (1) A tax of Rs. 5 per head per annum shall be imposed upon all persons liable to the labour tax under section 129 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, in accordance with the lists prepared for the year 1916 and the year 1917, subject to the exemptions contained in the provisions of law mentioned in the aforesaid section, and subject further to the exemption—

(a) Of any person who by reason of any injury received or damage sustained by him during the said riots is in the opinion of the Chairman of the Municipal Council deserving of exemption.

(b) Of any member of any Volunteer Corps who may under the orders of the Military Authorities have assisted in the suppression of the aforesaid riots, on the production of a certificate under the hand of the Commanding Officer to the satisfaction of the Chairman of the Municipal Council.

(2) The said tax shall be paid on or before July 31, 1916, and July 31, 1917, respectively, and may be collected in the same manner as the "Commutation Tax" payable under section 129 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, is collected.

(3) It shall be lawful for any person liable to the payment of the said tax to apply in writing to the Chairman of the Municipal Council to be allowed to commute the payment of the said sum of Rs. 5 due by him by the performance of labour upon such public works as the Works Engineer of the Colombo Municipality shall appoint.

(4) Every such application shall be made at any time prior to June 1, 1916, and June 1, 1917, respectively, and the Chairman of the Municipal Council shall make such order thereon as he may deem fit.

(5) If the application is allowed such applicant shall sign at the Office of the Financial Assistant of the Colombo Municipality an undertaking in writing to perform twelve days' labour within the limits of the Municipal Council of Colombo and to appear on such date at the Town Hall, as may be decided by the Financial Assistant, to ascertain the time and place at which the labour is to be performed.

(6) No person shall be entitled to commute the money payment due by him unless he has signed the undertaking herein referred to before July 1, 1916, and July 1, 1917, respectively.

(7) If any person shall fail or neglect to pay the said sum of Rs. 5 by July 31, 1916, and July 31, 1917, respectively, or if any person who may have signed an undertaking to perform labour in lieu of payment of the said sum of Rs. 5 shall fail or neglect to attend at the time and place appointed for the performance of labour, or shall fail or neglect to perform the labour appointed in pursuance of such undertaking, the Chairman of the Municipal Council may file or cause to be filed before the Municipal Magistrate an information against the said person.

(8) On the receipt of the said information the Municipal Magistrate shall issue a warrant for the arrest of such person.

(9) Any person arrested under the warrant issued by the Municipal Magistrate shall be taken without delay before the said Municipal Magistrate according to the terms of the warrant and subject to such bail as may be directed by the Municipal Magistrate in his discretion to be taken, and the Municipal Magistrate before whom such person shall be brought shall inquire into the default in respect of which such person was arrested, and upon being satisfied that the person arrested is the person against whom the warrant was issued and that the default mentioned in such warrant was committed by such person, shall and is hereby required by warrant to commit such person to prison, there to be detained at hard labour for the period of one month. Provided that the Municipal Magistrate before whom any such person shall be brought may, in his discretion, in lieu of committing such person to prison, adjudge him to pay a penalty of Rs. 10, and, if such sum be paid forthwith or within such time as the Municipal Magistrate may allow, such person shall not be committed to prison, but otherwise he shall; and the Municipal Magistrate may, if such person shall have been released prior to the payment of such fine when inflicted issue if necessary a warrant for his arrest. Provided that, if after the commitment of such person such penalty shall be paid, it shall be lawful for such Magistrate to discharge such person out of prison. Provided that from any decision of the Municipal Magistrate under this scheme there shall be no appeal.

2. A rate of 2 per cent. on the annual value of all houses and buildings of every description and of all lands and tenements whatsoever within the aforesaid Municipality of Colombo shall be made and assessed for the year 1916 and the year 1917, which said rate shall be collected and enforced in conformity with the provisions of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, and of any by-laws made thereunder relating to the collection and enforcement of rates.

## "THE MOTOR CAR ORDINANCE, No. 25 OF 1908."

IN terms of regulations Nos. 55, 56, and 57 of the regulations dated August 4, 1910, and October 11, 1913, framed under "The Motor Car Ordinance, No. 25 of 1908," it is hereby notified for general information that the road mentioned in the schedule hereto annexed is suitable for use by motor lorries, subject to their compliance with the regulations governing the use of motor cars, motor lorries, and motor cycles, and with the modified condition specified in the schedule referred to.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 27, 1915.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 124 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 65 Sinhalese, 17 Tamils, 26 Moors, 1 Malay, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1915, viz., 251,338) was 25·7, as against 19·3 in the preceding week, 23·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22·2 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 132 (8 Burghers, 63 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 27 Moors, 3 Malays, and 7 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 27·4, as against 21·4 in the previous week, 31·1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26·7 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 132 total deaths, 31 were of infants under one year of age, as against 26 in the preceding week, 31 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 7.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—Sixteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 19 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in St. Paul's, 3 in New Bazaar, 3 in Maradana (including a death of a non-resident in hospital), 2 in Pettah, 2 in Kotahena, 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in Kollupitiya.

2. Fifteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 9 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 7 were in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in Kotahena, 2 in New Bazaar, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in Wellawatta. Two deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

3. Five deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 1 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 3 were in Kotahena, 1 in Maradana (of a non-resident in hospital), and 1 in Kollupitiya.

4. One death from *Plague* was registered (in St. Paul's) as in the previous week. Two cases were reported, as against 4 in the previous week.

5. No deaths from *Smallpox* were registered, and no cases were reported since the week ended 6th instant.

6. Seventeen deaths from *Infantile Convulsions* were registered, 10 from *Enteritis*, 9 from *Debility*, 2 from *Dysentery*, 1 from *Diarrhoea*, 1 from *Worms*, and 53 from *Other Causes*.

7. Twenty-four cases of *Chickenpox* were reported, as against 15 in the previous week. No cases of *Measles* were reported.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 79·4°, against 77·3° in the preceding week and 80·3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·836 in., against 29·861 in. in the preceding week and 29·843 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1·28 in., against 11·80 in. in the preceding week and 1·33 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
