ROBERT CHALMERS.

HEREAS by section 34 (1) of "The Ceylon Railways Ordinance, 1902," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to declare by Proclamation any road or path which the railway may cross to be a "minor crossing," and whether such "minor crossing" shall be closed by gates or not:

And whereas it is expedient to declare the road which the railway crosses between the stations of Fort and Wharf, in the Western Province, and set out in the schedule hereto, to be a "minor crossing" for the purpose of the said Ordinance:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, in exercise of the power in Us vested as aforesaid, do hereby declare the said road to be a "minor crossing" for the purpose of the said Ordinance as from and after November 19, 1915, and that such "minor crossing" shall not be closed by gates.

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, in the exercise of the powers vested in him by "The Riot Damages Ordinance, No. 23 of 1915," has been pleased, by Order in Executive Council—

- (a) To declare the Moratuwa peruwa of the Salpiti korale, in the Colombo District, to be a-riot area under the said Ordinance, with effect from May 28, 1915.
- (b) To direct the recovery from the persons resident and owning property in the said area (other than Europeans, Eurasians, Burghers, Tamils, Moors, Malays, and natives of India, who are hereby exempted from liability) of the sum of Rs. 428,743, being the amount of riot damage, as assessed by the Special Commissioner, caused in such area on or after the said May 28, 1915, together with the cost of suppressing within the said area the riots or disturbances within the said area by which such damage was occasioned, and to direct that such costs shall be deemed to be eight per cent. of the amount of such assessed damage, that is to say, Rs. 34,299.44.
- c) To direct that the amount of such damage and costs be apportioned among the several administrative divisions of the said area in the proportions following:—

Applications for admission to the examination by persons not now in the Public Service must be addressed to the Director of Education, must bear a duly cancelled stamp of Rs. 10, and must be in the form (Schedule A) attached to this notice. Forms are to be obtained at any Post Office on application, or within four days' notice. A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to be on February 28, 1916, between the ages of 18 and 21, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person,* to the satisfaction of the Director of Education, must be attached to the form of application. Clerks in Government service (other than members of the Customs, Postal, Survey, or Railway Departments) from whatever funds they may be paid, who have completed three years' service, and whose service has been throughout satisfactory, are eligible for examination irrespective of age and without fee. Their applications (in the same form, Schedule A) for admission to the examination should be forwarded to the Director of Education through the Heads of their Departments.
- 4. Applications should reach the Director of Education not later than 2 P.M. on December 31, 1915; any applications received after that hour, by whatever cause delayed, will be rejected.
- 5. The Director of Education will return to the candidate his application, approved or disapproved as the case may be, after taking, if necessary, the orders of Government thereon. The approved application shall constitute the candidate's ticket of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the Director of Education. A candidate not producing such form, whatever may be the reason for his not so doing, will be refused admittance to the examination.
- 6. The examination will be held at Colombo only, in the place and under the supervision of the officer specified in Schedule B. Heads of Departments are required to grant to officers of their Departments, whose applications to present themselves for examination have been returned to them approved by the Director of Education leave to present themselves at the examination.
 - 7. The examination will be competitive. The number of places assigned for competition will be twenty.
- 8. The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.
- 9. The subjects for examination are those set out in Schedule C to this notice. The examination will be held in two parts. The first part a qualifying examination in Handwriting, Spelling, Arithmetic, and Bookkeeping, Any candidate failing to obtain two-thirds of the marks allotted for Handwriting, half those allowed for Spelling and Arithmetic respectively, and one-third of those allowed for Bookkeeping will be excluded from the remainder of the examination. Special attention will be paid to Handwriting, and candidates whose writing is untidy or illegible or contains defects in the formation of letters will be rigorously excluded. The kind of writing preferred is that generally known as the "Civil Service" hand. The second part of the examination will be in the remaining subjects in Schedule C. Should a candidate obtain less than one-third of the aggregate marks for the three subjects—Composition, General Paper, Précis Writing—or less than one-fourth marks in any other subject, or if he be a Sinhalese or Tamil, less than one-half of the marks in his native language, such marks will not be counted in his favour. In all the written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling.
- 10. Clerks of the description given in section 3 above will be allowed to compete amongst themselves, and will be eligible, if they obtain a minimum of 66 per cent. in Writing and 33 per cent. in the other compulsory subjects, for five of the appointments offered for competition.
- 11. Three more appointments will be reserved as prizes for deserving clerks of the same description, who have served Government continuously for ten years and upwards, to be selected irrespective of examination. No service under the age of sixteen years will be reckoned for this purpose.
- 12. The Government does not undertake to provide the successful candidates with posts immediately, but they will be given appointments as suitable vacancies occur.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 4, 1915.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 96 (2 Europeans, 8 Burghers, 49 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 20 Moors, and 2 Malays). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1915, viz., 251,338) was 19.9, as against 25.7 in the preceding week, 25.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.2 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 125 (3 Europeans, 5 Burghers, 54 Sinhalese, 31 Tamils, 19 Moors, 6 Malays, and 7 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 26 0, as against 27 4 in the previous week, 25 9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26 7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 125 total deaths, 25 were of infants under one year of age, as against 31 in the preceding week, 21 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Galle Prison, December 7, 1915. Principal Causes of Death.—Twenty-one deaths from Phthisis were registered, as against 16 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 6 were in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 5 in Kotahena, 3 in Slave Island, 2 in St. Paul's, 2 in New Bazaar, 2 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in San Sebastian.

- 2. Seven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 15 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2 were in St. Paul's, 2 in Maradana, 2 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Slave Island. Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.
- 3. Three deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, as against 5 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2 were in Slave Island and 1 in Maradana.
- 4. One death from Plague was registered (in St. Paul's), as in the previous week. Three cases were reported, as against 2 in the previous week.
 - 5. No deaths from Smallpox were registered, and no cases were reported since the week ended November 6.
- 6. Twelve deaths from Infantile Convulsions were registered, 6 from Debility, 3 from Worms, 3 from Tetanus, 2 from Dysentery, 2 from Enteritis, and 62 from Other Causes.
- 7. Eight cases of Chickenpox were reported, as against 24 in the previous week. No cases of Measles were reported.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.5°, against 79.4° in the preceding week and 80.0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.836 in., as in the preceding week, against 29.806 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.12 in., against 1.28 in. in the preceding week and 3.05 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
