## Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on August 21, 1915, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated August 17, 1915.

Present:—The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene; Mr. D. E. Weerasooria; Mr. C. A. LaBrooy; Dr. Allan de Saram; Mr. V. M. Saravanamuttu; and Mr. J. C. Ratwatte.

- 1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on July 17, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.
  - 2. The following documents were submitted:-

      (b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.

      (c) Health Officer's Report for July.

during the month of July.

(e) The Reservoir Readings for July.

Resolved—That the estimate be passed.

(2) That a sum of Rs. 25 be forwarded to the Hon, the Government Agent, Central Province, in payment of claim for inserting dates of Police Court fines erroneously credited to revenue.

(3) That the following Supplemental Votes be sanctioned:—(a) Charges on account of vagrants, Rs. 1,500; (b) Smallpox epidemic, Rs. 500; (c) Sanitation account, disinfectants, &c., Rs. 1,500; (d) Uniforms, Rs. 200.

(4) That a sum of Rs. 500 be spent on improvements to the public latrine near Lady Gordon's road.
 (5) That a private water service be allowed on usual terms to No. 278, Trincomalee street, Dr. J. Omar. Resolved—That the recommendations be adopted.


