**Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on August 21, 1915, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated August 17, 1915.**

*Present*:—The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene; Mr. D. E. Weerasooria; Mr. C. A. LaBrooy; Dr. Allan de Saram; Mr. V. M. Saravanamuttu; and Mr. J. C. Ratwatte.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on July 17, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted:—

- (a) Statements of Receipts and Disbursements from close of 1914 to July 31, 1915, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's Report for July.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of July.
- (e) The Reservoir Readings for July.

Resolved—That the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during July.

(1) Letter No. 14 of July 17, 1915, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary inquiring why the Progress Report of Works and the Health Officer's Report should be published in the *Gazette*.

Resolved—That they be not forwarded for publication in future, and be not printed elsewhere for circulation to the Members.

(2) Letter No. 15 of July 20, 1915, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that His Excellency the Governor approves the lease to the Kandy Young Men's Christian Association of a portion of Waco park on the modified conditions given in his letter No. 13 of June 17, 1915.—Read.

(3) Letter No. 16 of August 9, 1915, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary re Esala Perahera at Kandy.

Mr. Beven read a statement in reply explaining the circumstances under which the letter to the Colonial Secretary on the subject of the perahera was addressed by the Unofficial Members of the Council.

(4) Letter No. 17 of August 10 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary forwarding copy of report by the Attorney-General on the proposed rules under the Public Performances Ordinance.—Read.

(5) Letter No. 311 of August 6 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to the Hon. the Government Agent, Central Province, re acquisition of land for widening a portion of the Trincomalee street pavement, for the information of the Chairman.—Read.

(6) Letter No. 100 of August 12 from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to the Chairman, Municipal Council, Colombo, re amendment of Motor Car Regulation No. 27, for the information of the Chairman, Municipal Council, Kandy.—Read.

5. Amended estimate for the maintenance of Udawattakelle roads, Rs. 2,200.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Chairman of the Municipal Council of Kandy will receive sealed tenders for the purchase of the under-mentioned Ferry Toll Rents of the Kandy Municipality from January 1, 1916, to December 31, 1916. The tenders, which must be in sealed envelopes, superscribed "Tender for Toll Rents," will be received at the Municipal Office until 8 A.M. on Saturday, October 16, 1915, when they will be opened, and all persons making tenders will be required to be present, and tender must be delivered in person.

2. The person whose tender is selected by the Chairman for submission to the Municipal Council will be required to deposit at once one-tenth of the purchase amount in cash; and should the tender be accepted by the Council, to furnish approved security for one-half of the whole purchase amount, or in cash for one-third of the whole purchase amount, within thirty days of the date of the receipt by him of the notification of the Council's acceptance of his offer. If deeds are tendered as security, the one-tenth cash deposit will be retained till the rent is closed.

3. He will also be required to deposit money to pay the fees of counsel for examining and giving his opinion on the title deeds of properties tendered by him as security, and for examining and settling the security bond, and the fees charged by the Council's proctor for examining documents and drawing the security bond, and also the expenses of appraising the properties and of registering the security bond.

4. All title deeds tendered as security should be accompanied by a certificate obtained from the Registrar of Lands that the lands to which they relate are unencumbered. This certificate must be obtained at the cost of the party offering the security.

5. The renter shall be bound to provide and maintain, at his own expense, sufficient boats and boats' crew at the said ferry, the seaworthiness of the boats and the number of the crew being subject to the approval of the Chairman, Municipal Council.

6. Further information regarding conditions of sale can be obtained on application to the Secretary Municipal Council.
