HEREAS it is desirable to amend Our Proclamation dated the 31st day of December, issued in pursuance of "The Necessaries of War Exportation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1914," and published in the Government Guzette No. 6,767 of the 31st day of December, 1915:

Know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government, in pursuance of "The Necessaries of War Exportation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915," do hereby amend the said Proclamation in the manner set out in the helpedule hereto, and do call upon His Majesty's subjects and all other persons being in the said Island to govern themselves accordingly.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Sixth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Sixteen.

The interior of the stores should be lined with new cadjan. The walls should be repaired with new cadian wherever necessary

The old hinges should be replaced by new ones.

The floor should be raised with clay, stamped, and levelled.

STATISTICS. VITAL

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 25, 1915.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 81 (4 Europeans, 8 Burgliers, 15 Sinhalese, 11 Tamils, 11 Moors, 1 Malay, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the stimated population on July 1, 1915, viz., 251,338) was 16.8, as against 23.7 in the preceding week, 14.4 in the orresponding week of last year, and 22.2 the weekly average for last year.

-The total deaths registered were 113 (2 Europeans, 5 Burghers, 65 Sinhalese, 18 Tamils, 17 Moors, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 23.4, as against 19.3 in the previous week, 24.4 in the corresponding veek of last year, and 26.7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 113 total deaths, 18 were of infants under one year of age, as against 16 in the preceding zeek, 26 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

Principal Causes of Death.—Thirteen deaths from Phthisis were registered, as against 9 in the previous week and 14 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 6 were in Taradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in Kotahena, 2 in St. Paul's, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Wellawatta.

- 2. Twelve deaths from Pneumonia were registered, as against 10 in the previous week and 1 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 5 were in Maradana, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in Kotahena, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta. Eight deaths from Bronchitis were registered.
- 3. Three deaths from *Plague* were registered, as against 6 in the previous week. Of these, 2 were of residents of St. Paul's and 1 of Kotahena. Nine cases were reported, as in the previous week.
- 4. Three deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, as against 1 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 1 was in St. Paul's, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Kollupitiys.
 - 5. No deaths from Smallpox were registered, and no cases were reported.
- 6. Thirteen deaths from Infantile Convulsions were registered, 5 from Debility, 2 from Enteritis, 2 from Worms, 1 from Diarrhaea, 1 from Dysentery, 1 from Tetanus, and 49 from Other Causes.
- 7. Eleven cases of Chickenpox were reported, as aga inst 16 in the previous eek. No cases of Megales were reported.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 78.9°, against 79.0° in the preceding week and 79.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.842 in., against 29.872 in. in the preceding week and 29.879 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.13 in., against nil in the preceding week and 0.16 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
