HEREAS the following by-law has been made by the Municipal Council of Colombo, under the provisions of section 109 (1) of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, and has been confirmed by the Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon in Executive Council, as provided by section 109 (3) of the said Ordinance:

Now know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government of the Island of Ceylon, in exercise of the power in Us vested by section 109 (3) of the said Ordinance, do hereby proclaim the said by-law.

#### By-law referred to.

No person shall preach or address any assembly or crowd or hold any meeting in any street within the Municipal limits of Colombo, except in pursuance of a permit from the Superintendent of Police or the Chairman of the Municipal Council, and within the times and limits specified in such permit. Any person who shall commit a breach of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding 188, 50.

### VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 1, 1916.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 109 (1 European, 9 Burghers, 66 Sinhalese, 15 Tamils, 12 Moors, 3 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on June 1, 1915, viz., 251,338) was 22.6, as against 16.8 in the preceding week, 15.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.2 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 110 (5 Burghers, 62 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 18 Moors, 1 Malay, and 1 Other). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 22.8, as against 23.4 in the previous week, 34.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 26.7 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 110 total deaths, 23 were of infants under one year of age, as against 18 in the proceding week, 43 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 27 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10:

Principal Causes of Death.—Thirteen deaths from Phthisis, were registered, as in the previous week, against 14 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 3 were in St. Paul's, 3 in Kotahena, 2 in San Schadian; 2 in Maradana (deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 1 in Pettah, 1 in New Bezgar, and 1 in Wellawatta.

- 2. Nine deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 12 in the previous week and !! the weekly average for last year. Of these, 3 were in Maradana (including 2 deaths of new residents in hospitals), 2 in New Bazaar, 2 in Wellawatta, 1 in St. Paul's, and 1 in Kotahena. Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.
- 3. Six deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 3 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2 were in St. Paul's, 2 in Kotahena, and 2 in Maradana (including a death of a non-resident in hospital).
- 4. One death from Plague was registered (in New Bazaar), as against 3 in the previous week. No cases were reported, as against 9 in the previous week.
  - 5. No death's from Smallpox were registered; and no cases were reported since the week ended November 6, 1915.
- 6. Fourteen deaths from Infantile Convulsions were registered, 7 from Debility, 5 from Enteritis, 2 from Dysentery, 2 from Worms, 1 from Diarrhea, 1 from Tetanus, and 46 from Other Causes.
- 7. Twenty-two cases of Chickenpox were reported, as against 11 in the previous week. One case of Measles was reported. There was none in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was  $79\cdot0^{\circ}$ , against  $78\cdot9^{\circ}$  in the preceding week and  $79\cdot4^{\circ}$  in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was  $29\cdot866$  in., against  $29\cdot842$  in. in the preceding week and  $29\cdot892$  in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was  $0\cdot59$  in., against  $0\cdot13$  in. in the preceding week and  $0\cdot59$  in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

# Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 8, 1916.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 142 (1 European, 12 Burghers, 90 Sinhalese, 14 Tamils, 19 Moors, 5 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1916, viz., 255,354) was 29·1, as against 22·6 in the preceding week, 26·1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22·7 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 133 (1 European, 6 Burghers, 72 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 20 Moors, 3 Malays, and 9 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 27·2, as against 22·8 in the previous week, 33·9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25·8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 133 total deaths, 23 were of infants under one year of age, as in the preceding week, against 46 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 8.

Principal Causes of Death.—Sixteen deaths from Phthisis were registered, as against 13 in the previous week, and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 5 were in Kotahena, 4 in Maradana (including a death of a non-resident in hospital), 2 in San Sebastian, 2 in Slave Island, 1 in Pettah, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta.

- 2. Eleven deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 9 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Maradana (including a death of a non-resident in hospital), 2 in Kotahena, 2 in New Bazaar, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in Wellawatta. Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.
- 3. Six deaths from *Plague* were registered, as against 1 in the previous week. Of these, 4 were in St. Paul's, 1 in San Sebastian, and 1 in Wellawatta. Eight cases were reported. None were reported in the previous week.
- . 4. One death from Enteric Fever was registered (in Maradana), as against 6 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.
  - 5. No deaths from Smallpox were registered, and no cases were reported since the week ended November 6, 1915.
- 6. Twelve deaths from Enteritis were registered, 8 from Infantile Convulsions, 7 from Debility, 6 from Diarrhaa, 3 from Worms, 1 from Dysentery, and 57 from Other Causes.
- 7. Forty cases of *Chickenpox* were reported, as against 22 in the previous week. No cases of *Measles* were reported. There was 1 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 77.6°, against 79.0° in the preceding week and 78.4° in in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.881 in., against 29.866 in. in the preceding week and 29.890 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil, against 0.59 in. in the preceding week and 1.22 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
