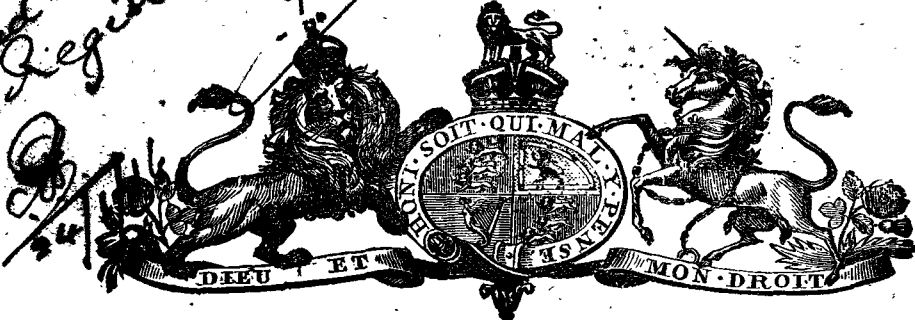

By His Excellency REGINALD EDWARD STUBBS, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer Administering the Government of the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by the 5th section of the Prisons Ordinance, No. 16 of 1877, as amended by section 1 of Ordinance No. 24 of 1890, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to establish any prison for this Island or for any part thereof:

And whereas it is expedient to establish a prison in Hambantota, in the Southern Province:

Now know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in Us as aforesaid, do by this Our Proclamation establish the building known as "The Salt Stores" as a prison in Hambantota aforesaid for the reception of prisoners of every description committed or remanded under the authority of the several courts of the Island, as from and after the 25th January, 1916.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-first day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Sixteen.

And whereas the prison at Hambantota in the Southern Province, being a prison mentioned in the schedule of the said Ordinance, was closed by a Proclamation dated the 26th day of October, 1903, published in the *Gazette* of the 30th idem :

And whereas it is now expedient to revoke the said Proclamation :

Now know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers vested in Us as aforesaid, do by this Our Proclamation revoke the said Proclamation dated the 26th October, 1903, and do re-establish the said prison for the reception of prisoners of every description committed or remanded under the authority of the several courts of the Island, as from and after the 25th January, 1916.

GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

“THE RIOT DAMAGES ORDINANCE, No. 23 OF 1915.”

Colombo District.

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, in the exercise of the powers vested in him by “The Riot Damages Ordinance, No. 23 of 1915,” has been pleased, by order in Executive Council—

- (a) To declare the Colombo District (excluding the area within the Municipal limits of Colombo and the Moratuwa peruwa of the Salpiti korale) of the Western Province to be a riot area under the said Ordinance, with effect from June 7, 1915.
- (b) To direct the recovery from the persons resident and owning property within the said area of the sum of Rs. 2,037,505, being the amount of all riot damage, as assessed by the Special Commissioners, caused in such area on and after May 31, 1915, and of the costs of suppressing within the said area the riots or disturbances within the said area by which such damage was occasioned, and to direct that such costs shall be deemed to be 8 per cent. of the amount of such assessed damage. Provided that in any case in which the inhabitants of an administrative division have entered into a bond or bonds for the discharge of the liability of the division, such division shall be exempt from the above direction for the recovery of costs in so far as such bond or bonds shall be duly satisfied.
- (c) To exempt from liability under the said Ordinance in respect of the said area all Europeans, Eurasians, Burghers, Tamils, Moors, Malays, and natives of India.

“THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1897.”

By adding after rule 19 the following:—

19 A. The owner of every water boat shall have the tanks in every boat owned by him cleaned and disinfected every quarter, and shall submit to the Chairman, Plague Committee, a certificate from the Port Surgeon to the effect that this has been satisfactorily carried out.

He shall also annually or whenever required to do so obtain a report from the Government Analyst of the analysis of any sample of the water in each boat which may be taken by the Port Surgeon for the purpose.

19 B. The tindal or person in charge of every boat or canoe shall keep such boat or canoe clean and free from foul bilge water.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

Aerated Water Manufactories.

1. No person shall commence the manufacture of aerated waters within the limits of the Local Board for the purpose of sale without giving one month's previous notice in writing to the Chairman of the Board.
2. No aerated water factory shall be situated within less than 150 feet from any gala, stable, or other building used for keeping animals by day and night, or of any latrine or cesspit. No part of the factory shall be used as a dwelling house.
3. All premises used for manufacture of aerated waters must be well lighted, ventilated, and provided with a wood ceiling; must have cemented floors; must be provided with suitably built drains to carry off waste material; and must be kept clean and free from dirt and dust. The preparation of the syrups must be carried out in a separate fly-proof room. All chemicals and other materials used in the manufacture of the waters must be of good quality. All utensils and machinery employed in the manufacture must be scrupulously clean.
4. The water used in the manufacture shall be obtained from a source adequately protected from contamination and approved of by the Chairman of the Board. It shall be transported to the factory by means which shall ensure that no pollution occurs in transit. It shall be stored at the factory in properly constructed tanks or reservoirs with dust-tight covers connecting with the aerating apparatus.
5. All waters used in the manufacture of aerated waters shall be passed through a Jewell or other filter approved by the Chairman and connected with the plant, provided that the Chairman shall have the power to exempt from the operation of this rule the water derived from an approved public supply.
6. Whenever the Secretary or the Inspector of the Board is satisfied that any aerated water, either manufactured within the limits of the Board or introduced into such limits from outside, is of such bad quality as to be unfit for human consumption, he may seize such waters and produce them before the Medical Officer or Police Magistrate, and if it appears to such Medical Officer or Police Magistrate that such waters are unfit for human consumption, he may order the same to be destroyed. Any person manufacturing any aerated water which shall be proved to the satisfaction of the court to be unfit for human consumption shall be guilty of an offence.
7. All bottles used in the manufacture of aerated waters shall be washed with filtered water and shall be kept scrupulously clean.
8. Every bottle containing aerated water shall bear a label setting out the description of the water and the place of manufacture, the name of the person or firm owning the factory, and the number assigned to the factory by the Chairman of the Board.
9. No person under 12 years of age shall be employed in any aerated water factory, nor any person suffering from any cutaneous or contagious disease.
10. All employers engaged in the filling of bottles with gas shall wear fine-meshed wire face and neck shields and leather gloves.
11. It shall be lawful for the Medical Officer or the Secretary or the Inspector of the Board to enter any place used for the manufacture or sale of aerated waters at any time when such place is open and to take a sample bottle of any kind of aerated water which is there manufactured or kept for sale; and any proprietor or person in charge of such place who shall refuse to permit such sample to be taken shall be guilty of an offence.

NOTICES CALLING FOR TENDERS.

TENDERS are hereby invited for the supply of sleepers, Batticaloa Division, during 1915-16, the work to commence on March 1, 1916, and to be completed by August 15, 1916. The areas to be exploited for the purpose and further details are given in the schedule below.

2. A separate tender should be submitted for each service in the schedule.

3. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Office of the Controller of Revenue, Colombo.

4. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box in the Office of the Controller of Revenue, or be sent through the post.

5. Tenders should be marked "Tender for Sleeper Supply, Batticaloa Division, 1915-16," service (a), (b), or (c), as the case may be, in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Office of the Controller of Revenue not later than midday on Tuesday, February 8, 1916.

6. The tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the Subdivisional Forest Office, Trincomalee, for services (a) and (b), and at the Divisional Forest Office, Batticaloa, for service (c). No tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. Alterations must be initialled, otherwise the tenders may be treated as informal and rejected.

7. A deposit of Rs. 20 for each service will be required to be made either at the Treasury or Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued. Should any person decline or fail to enter into the contract and bond after he has tendered or to furnish approved security, within ten days of receiving notice in writing from the Head of the Department, or his duly authorized representative, that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown, and the defaulter will render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Government contract. All other deposits will be returned upon signature of a contract.

8. Contract may not be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Tender Board previously obtained.

9. Each tender must be accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given, engaging to become security for the due fulfilment of the contract.

10. Sufficient sureties will be required to join in a bond for the due fulfilment of the contract. The amount of the bond, and all other necessary information, can be ascertained upon application at the offices referred to in section 6. A further security in cash of 5 per cent. of the value of contract will be required of the contractor when entering into the bond.

11. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

12. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and of accepting any portion of a tender.

13. Separate rates per sleeper, broad gauge and narrow gauge, must be quoted, written both in words and figures.

14. For any further information application should be made to the Divisional Forest Officer, Batticaloa, or to the Subdivisional Forest Officer, Trincomalee, as the case may be.

Special Conditions.

(1) Trees are to be felled within 6 inches from the ground by saw or axe and saw combined.

(2) Only such trees as are stamped and marked by the Forest Ranger are to be felled, and no sound trees below 4 feet 6 inches in girth will be marked or should be felled.

(3) All suitable dead and hollow trees within the forest such as are marked by the Forest Officer, though below 4 feet 6 inches in girth, should, in addition to all matured sound trees marked by him, be utilized for conversion into sleepers.

(4) Logs attacked by fungus or defective logs are not to be sawn into sleepers. The sleepers should be sawn from

sound matured wood, free from shakes, cracks, sapwood, and large or loose knots.

(5) Broad gauge sleepers are to be 9 feet by 10 inches by 5 inches, and narrow gauge sleepers 5 feet by 9 inches by 4½ inches.

(6) Sleepers should be rectangular in form, and perfectly parallel on all sides, and should have no wane.

(7) Sleepers should be covered with saw dust or immersed in water and invariably be placed under shade immediately they are sawn until they can be transported to delivery depôts, where they should be stacked and kept under shade in the manner to be pointed out by the Forest Ranger.

(8) Only such sleepers as are practically certain to be accepted by the Railway authorities will be allowed to be stacked at delivery depôts; payment may be made for not more than 75 per cent. of such stacked sleepers on the responsibility of the Assistant Conservator of Forests, the balance sleepers will be paid for on the Railway authorities accepting them finally.

(9) Rejected sleepers will not be paid for, and they will lapse to Government, as well as all refuse wood in the sleeper operations. The contractor shall have no claim in respect of any material sold as rejections.

(10) The felling operations are to be completed practically by end of June, 1916. Not less than 40 per cent. of sleepers shall have been sawn by end of June, 75 per cent. by end of July, and the full number by end of August. By end of June not less than 30 per cent. of the sleepers shall have been transported and stacked at delivery depôts, by end of July not less than 60 per cent., by end of August the full number due on the contract.

To fell a sufficient number of palu and milla trees standing on the released areas of (1) Vitpanaikulam, (2) Divulawewa, (3) Gomarasankadawela, (4) Galkadawela, (5) Anaikaddy, (6) Madawachy, (8) Keulakadawela, &c. Service (c).—Batticaloa Division.

To fell a sufficient number of palu and milla trees standing in the released area in Panama forest, to convert the trees felled into 1,500 broad gauge and 1,500 narrow gauge sleepers, more or less, to transport the sleepers to Arugam bay, about 6 miles by forest road and 5 to 12 miles by principal road, and deliver them stacked at the Arugam bay out-bay depôt.

SEALED Tenders, marked on the envelopes "Tender for transporting and weighing Salt into Government Stores at Nachchikali," will be received by the Assistant Government Agent of Puttalam up to noon of February 5, 1916, from persons willing to contract for the service of transporting from the Nachchikali salterns the 6,659 cwt. of salt collected in them during the maha manufacture of 1915, and weighing and storing the same in the salt stores at Nachchikali.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 15, 1916.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 108 (10 Burghers, 58 Sinhalese, 12 Tamils, 13 Moors, 7 Malays, and 8 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1916, viz., 255,354) was 22·1, as against 29·1 in the preceding week, 28·9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22·7 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 120 (2 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 54 Sinhalese, 26 Tamils, 21 Moors, 3 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 24·6, as against 27·2 in the previous week, 33·5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25·8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 120 total deaths, 19 were of infants under one year of age, as against 23 in the preceding week, 35 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—Fourteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 16 in the previous week, and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 7 were in Maradana (including 4 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in St. Paul's, 2 in Kotahena, 2 in Slave Island, and 1 in Pettah.

2. Twelve deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 11 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 7 were in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in San Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Kollupitiya. Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

3. Six deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 1 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 3 were in Kotahena, 2 in Maradana (including a death of a non-resident in hospital), and 1 in Wellawatta.

4. No deaths from *Plague* were registered. There were 6 in the previous week. Two cases were reported, as against 8 in the previous week.

5. No deaths from *Smallpox* were registered, and no cases were reported since the week ended November 6, 1915.

6. Ten deaths from *Infantile Convulsions* were registered, 8 from *Enteritis*, 7 from *Diarrhœa*, 7 from *Debility*, 6 from *Worms*, and 45 from *Other Causes*.

7. Twenty-eight cases of *Chickenpox* were reported, as against 40 in the previous week. No cases of *Measles* were reported.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 78·9°, against 77·6° in the preceding week and 80·0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·914 in., against 29·881 in. in the preceding week and 29·897 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·31 in., against nil in the preceding week and 0·03 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
