THE following resolution passed by the Legislative Council at the meeting held on January 26, 1916, is published for general information:—

That the towns of Siduwa and Diwulapitiya, in the Negombo District, Western Province, be brought under the operation of the Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance, No. 18 of 1892, as from and after this date. The limits of Siduwa and Diwulapitiya are:—

Siduwa.

East: The Dandugama-oya.

South: The Dandugama-oya, the Depa-ela to a point ten chains to the south of the Mahalangamuwa-Kotugoda road. From this point a line drawn westwards and parallel to the said road as far as the Colombo-Negombo road.

West: The Colombo-Negombo road.

North: A line drawn eastwards from the Colombo-Negombo road ten chains to the north of the Mahalangamuwa-Kotugoda road and parallel to it as far as the Depa-ela. The Depa-ela northwards to the Siduwa-Amandoluwa village boundary, the said village boundary eastwards to the Dandugama-oya.

Diwulapitiya.

North: A line drawn due west through the point at which the Hapitigam korale boundary crosses the Minuwangoda-Giriulla road, about a quarter of a mile north-east of Diwulapitiya bazaar, far as the western boundary of the Diwulapitiya village.

West: The western boundary of Diwulapitiya village as far south as the point at which it meets the Minuwangoda-Mirigama road. From this point a line drawn southwards through the paddy fields to a distance of 25 chains from the said road until it meets the southern boundary.

South: The northern boundary of the Bombugammana-Wewagedara Kumburuyaya.

East: The same boundary continued eastward and north-eastward up to the point at which it crosses the Negombo-Mirigama road. From this point a straight line drawn northwards to meet the eastern extremity of the northern boundary.

"THE SMALL TOWNS SANITARY ORDINANCE, 1892."

THE following by-law made by the Sanitary Board of the Kandy District, under section 9 E (2) (0) of Ordinance No. 18 of 1892, and approved by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government in Executive Council, is published for general information.

By His Excellency's command,

By-law referred to.

It shall not be lawful for any person to erect, re-erect, or add to any hut or house within the limits of any Sanitary Board town, except under the following conditions:—

The following clear air space shall be left around any hut or house which is erected or re-erected, or around any hut or house which is added to with respect to such addition, and no portion of the walls of such building, and not more than 2 ft. 6 in. of the projecting eaves of such building, shall come within such space:—

(1) On the side of any road or street 25 ft. to the centre of such road or street.

(2) Behind such space up to 50 feet to any other hut or house, except a kitchen, bathing place, or latrine as the Chairman may require, of which prescribed space at least half shall be land belonging to the same owner as the land upon which the house stands which is erected, re-erected, or added to.

(3) To the side such space up to 15 ft. to the nearest building as the Chairman may require, of which prescribed space at least half shall be land belonging to the same owner as the land upon which the house stands which is erected, re-erected, or added to.

Provided that the Chairman may in his discretion relax the operation of this rule in any special case, but he shall not do so unless he is satisfied that (1) no detriment is caused thereby to the sanitary condition or amenities of the house or hut to be erected, re-erected, or added to, or of any other neighbouring house or hut used or intended to be used as a human dwelling place; and (2) that the future alignment, widening, or development of any road or street, or the convenience of the public using such road or street, will not be interfered with by such relaxation of the rule.

Provided further, that the Chairman may allow the erection of a kitchen, bathing place, or latrine upon the portion thus reserved for air space on the side of any house furthest from the road or street in such place as the Chairman shall approve.

Provided further, that where a conservancy lane shall have been provided, or laid out, or projected by the Board, such latrine shall adjoin such lane or projected lane.

"THE GAME PROTECTION ORDINANCE, 1909."

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

1. The sea within a line drawn 200 yards north-west of the Sally Port at Fort Frederick is reserved for fishing with "adasavalai" hand lines and hand nets thrown from the rocks or the seashore, and it shall not be lawful for any person or persons at any time to fish therein by means of any other nets or appliances.

It shall not be lawful for any person to fish with an "adasavalai" within a radius of 200 yards from the Sally Port at Fort Frederick, except between

October 1 and last day of March.

3. Persons desirous of fishing with an "adasavalai" within 200 yards of Fort Frederick between October 1 and last day of March shall apply to the Assistant Government Agent of Trincomalee to have their names registered. Such application shall be made annually on September 1, and shall contain a declaration that the applicant is the owner of a net, boat, and tackle.

The Assistant Government Agent of Trincomalee shall thereupon give notice by beat of tom-tom that he will on a day, which shall be named in the notice, and shall not be less than fourteen days from the publication of the same, cause the nets, boats, and tackle of such persons as have applied for registration to be examined by the Town Vanniah and the Police Vidane of Division No. 10.

5. Only such persons as shall produce their nets, boats, and tackle in good condition before the Town Vanniah and the Police Vidane of Division No. 10 on the day named in the notice shall be entitled to have their names registered, and

no person whose name is not so registered shall be permitted to fish.

6. Each person registered shall be allowed to fish at any time during two days of each week within the period October 1 to March 31, and the Assistant Government Agent of Trincomalee shall have power to arrange in rotation the dates to be set apart for each such person.

THE following notice issued by the Board of Trade with regard to the importation of goods of enemy origin is published for general information:

"The Board of Trade desire to warn importers that goods which originated in an enemy country, even though they may have left enemy territory and become neutral property before the war, are liable to seizure under the Customs (War Powers) Act, 1915; if imported without the Board's permission.

"Such permission is, as a rule, granted only upon production of incontrovertible evidence that the identical goods which it is desired to import left enemy territory before the war. The evidence should be produced and the Board's authority obtained before any steps are taken to have the goods shipped to this country.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended January 29, 1916.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 117 (6 Burghers, 68 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 15 Moors, 3 Malays, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1916, viz., 255,354) was 24.0, as against 29.5 in the preceding week, 31.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.7 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 126 (1 European, 5 Burghers, 64 Sinhalese, 38 Tamils, 12 Moors, 2 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 25.8, as against 25.0 in the previous week, 29.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 126 total deaths, 28 were of infants under one year of age, as against 22 in the preceding week, 50 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

Principal Causes of Death.—Seventeen deaths from Phthisis were registered, as against 16 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 6 were in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in Slave Island, 2 in St. Paul's, 2 in Kotahena, 1 in Pettah, 1 in New Bazaar, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta.

- 2. Six deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 13 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 1 was in Pettah, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in Kotahena, 1 in New Bazaar, 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in Kollupitiya. One death from *Bronchitis* was registered.
- 3. Four deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 3 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 1 was in New Bazaar, 1 in Slave Island, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta.
- 4. One death from *Plague* was registered (in St. Paul's), as against 5 in the previous week. Three cases were reported, as against 5 in the previous week.
 - 5. No deaths from Smallpox were registered, and no cases were reported since the week ended November 6, 1915.
- 6. Fourteen deaths from Infantile Convulsions were registered, 10 from Debility, 8 from Worms, 5 from Dysentery, 4 from Enteritis, 3 from Diarrhæa, and 53 from Other Causes.
- 7. One hundred and four cases of Chickenpox were reported, as against 43 in the previous week. Two cases of Measles were reported. There were none in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 77.4°, against 78.8° in the preceding week and 79.8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.889 in., against 29.865 in. in the preceding week and 29.879 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil, as in the preceding week, against 0.01 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
