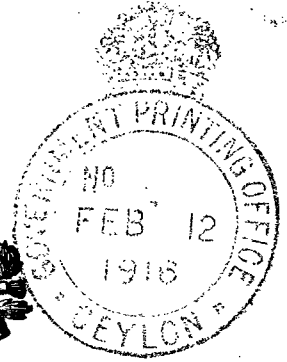
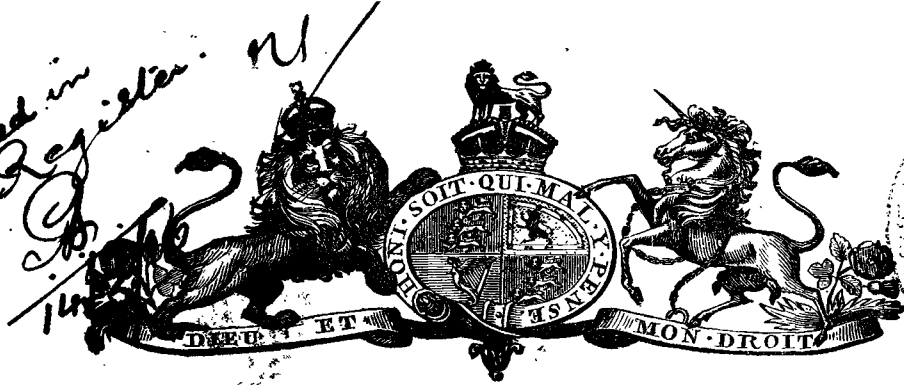

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency REGINALD EDWARD STUBBS, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer Administering the Government of the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated December 21, 1909, the provisions of section 31 and the six following sections of "The Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, 1895," as amended by the Ordinance No. 23 of 1900, came into operation within the town of Tangalla as set forth in the schedule hereto:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Proclamation in the manner shown in the schedule hereto:

Now know Ye that We, the said Officer Administering the Government, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by the said Ordinance, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation amend the said Proclamation by altering, with effect from April 1, 1916, the limits of the said town of Tangalla shown in the first column of the annexed schedule to those shown in the second column thereof.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Tenth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Sixteen.

Southern Province, Hambantota District.

Division as defined by Proclamation dated December 21, 1909.

Tangalla Town Division.

Boundaries :—

North by Tangalla-Wiraketiya road and the road to Basarachchilage-watta *alias* Madelwellatayanapara ; East by the sea ; South by the sea ; and West by Boraluwehena near 121½ milestone on Matara-Tangalla road, Karijjawewa, Tanchiwewa, Pansalapokuna, Kudavihara, Maha Bo-tree, Mahamegahena, lane leading to Tangalla-Beliatta high road near 11½ mile, Claessen's koratuwa, Polommaruwa fields, Pinkoratuwa, and live fence of Siyambalagahakoratuwa about 100 yards west of ½ milepost on Tangalla-Wiraketiya road.

Boundaries :—

North by Madilla-Walganeliya village boundary (paddy fields) ; East by the sea and the Gansabhawa road leading from opposite the Henakaduwa temple to the sea ; South by the sea ; and West by Tangalla-Kadurupokuna village boundary, Polommaruwa paddy fields, and Kirame-ela.

WHEREAS it is desirable to consolidate, with certain amendments, Our Proclamations issued under "The Necessaries of War Exportation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1914," herein named :

Know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government, in pursuance of the said "The Necessaries of War Exportation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1914," do hereby revoke Our Proclamations dated the 17th day of December, 1915, the 6th day of January, the 12th day of January, and the 5th day of February, published in the *Government Gazettes* Nos. 6,767, 6,768, 6,769, and 6,776, dated the 31st December, 1915, the 7th January, the 13th January, and 5th February, 1916, respectively, and do hereby prohibit the exportation from Ceylon of the articles specified in Schedules A, B, C, and D hereto to the extent therein specified.

And We do hereby further call upon His Majesty's subjects and all other persons being in the said Island to govern themselves accordingly.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Tenth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Sixteen.

Whereas the Governor in Council is satisfied that there is danger of an outbreak of plague at Rameswaram, in the Ramnad taluk of the Ramnad District, if persons from the infected portions of the Anantapur, Bellary, Coimbatore, Madura, Nilgiri, North Arcot, Salem, and South Canara districts, the Mysore State, the Bombay Presidency, the town of Colombo in Ceylon, and other parts declared to be infected with plague are permitted to visit that place on the occasion of the ensuing Masi New Moon festival:

In exercise of the powers delegated to him under the Epidemic Diseases Act, 1897, the Governor in Council prohibits the attendance at the said festival from February 22 to March 8, 1916, inclusive, of persons from the said parts, and further directs that, between the said dates, no tickets to travel by railway shall be sold at the stations of Mangalore, Madukari, Mettupalayam, Karaimadai, Tudyalur, Coimbatore, Podanur, Singamallur, Sulur, Somanur, Ariyanur, Salem, Thinnapatti, Hosur, Vellore Town, and Vellore Cantonment on the South Indian Railway, the stations of Ootacamund, Fernhill, Lovedale, Ketti, Wellington, and Coonoor on the Nilgiri Railway, and the stations of Hindupur, Hospet, Jalarpet, Nettandapatti, Kavanur, Virinjipuram, Latteri, and Katpadi on the Madras and Southern Maharatta Railway, for the stations of Madura, Madura East, Silaiman, Tiruppuvanam, Turuppachetti, Muttanandal, Manamadurai, Parthibanur, Kamudakkudai, Paramagudi, Pondimankay, Sattirakudi, Ramnad, Valantaravai, Uchipuli, Mantapam, Pamban, Tangachimadam, Rameswaram, and Dhanuskodi Jetty on the South Indian Railway to any person intending or believed to be intending to be present at the said festival.

All persons proceeding to the said festival in contravention of this notification will be turned back.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 5, 1916.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 116 (14 Burghers, 59 Sinhalese, 11 Tamils, 21 Moors, 8 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1916, viz., 255,354) was 23·8, as against 24·0 in the preceding week, 31·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22·7 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 115 (8 Burghers, 60 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 10 Moors, 2 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 23·5, as against 25·8 in the previous week, 30·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25·8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 115 total deaths, 19 were of infants under one year of age, as against 28 in the preceding week, 38 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 20 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Principal Causes of Death.—Thirteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 17 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Maradana (including a death of a non-resident in hospital), 2 in Kotahena, 2 in Wellawatta, 2 in Kollupitiya, 1 in Pettah, 1 in St. Paul's, and 1 in New Bazaar.

2. Twelve deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 6 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in Kotahena, 2 in St. Paul's, 1 in New Bazaar, 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in Wellawatta. Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

3. Seven deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 4 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Kotahena, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in Maradana, and 1 in Wellawatta.

4. No deaths from *Plague* were registered. There was 1 in the previous week. Two cases were reported, as against 3 in the previous week.

5. No deaths from *Smallpox* were registered, and no cases were reported since the week ended November 6, 1915.

6. Eight deaths from *Infantile Convulsions* were registered, 7 from *Enteritis*, 6 from *Worms*, 5 from *Debility*, 3 from *Dysentery*, 2 from *Diarrhoea*, 2 from *Tetanus*, and 47 from *Other Causes*.

7. Seventy-six cases of *Chickenpox* were reported, as against 104 in the previous week. No cases of *Measles* were reported. There were 2 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 77·5°, against 77·4° in the preceding week and 79·8° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·838 in., against 29·889 in. in the preceding week and 29·866 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was nil, as in the preceding week, against 0·05 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
