Balconies, galleries, verandahs, open or enclosed, or anything having a floor at or above the first floorlevel.

Sunshades, weather frames, eaves, or other similar projections, including only roofing or other protection from the weather (exclusive of permanent architectural features projecting not more than 2 ft. 6 in., and shown on the drawings approved by the Chairman, Municipal Council, when sanctioning the erection of the building of which they form a part).

Projecting signs parallel to the street fixed so as to expose only one side to the street.

Projecting signs at right angles to side of street or fixed or exposed so as to exhibit two sides visible from street, including flagstaffs, masts, or poles, and the like.

Temporary buildings on streets, including hoardings, scaffoldings, and enclosures of all kinds.

Re. 1 per annum per square foot of total floor areas encroaching on the street measured horizontally. Minimum fee Rs. 10.

Cents 25 per annum per square foot of encroachment on the street measured horizontally. Minimum fee Rs. 2.50.

Cents 25 per annum per square foot of visible surface. Minimum fee Re. 1.

Cents 25 per annum per square foot of visible surface. Minimum fee Rs. 2.50.

Cents 2½ per week per square foot of ground covered, including eaves and all projections.

#### BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. Every dairyman supplying milk within Local Board limits shall apply for the registration of his name and address and the names and addresses of his servants at the office of the Local Board. Every person selling or exposing for sale milk without doing so shall be guilty of an offence.

No dairy shall be allowed within 50 feet of any cesspit or latrine, nor in a

position where bad odours wafted from any cesspit or latrine shall reach it.

3. Every dairy compound shall be provided with drainage to the satisfaction of the Chairman, and the drains shall be regularly flushed and kept clean; no foul water shall be allowed in a dairy compound.

4. All refuse and dirt in and about the premises of a dairy shall be removed thout delay. Cowdung shall be removed daily from the cowshed and the dairy without delay. compound.

or washing of clothes at a well in the dairy compound shall be allowed.

6. No building used as a dairy shall be showed. There must be a pure water supply at a convenient distance. No bathing

No building used as a dairy shall be used as a dwelling place or for any other purpose whatsoever; such building shall be kept clean at all times.

7. The milk cows must be free from any disease, and all dairymen must be free

from any cutaneous, contagious, or infectious disease.

8. All utensils, furniture, and other requisites used in or belonging to a dairy shall be kept clean. 9. All vessels sent out containing milk shall be properly stoppered or covered

with non-absorbing material, and shall not be carried under the armpit.

It shall not be lawful for any person to sell, hawk about, or expose for sale any milk which has been adulterated with water or any foreign substance whatever.

11. No person shall sell or offer for sale any milk from which the cream has been removed, unless he previously informs the person to whom he sells or offers it that the cream has been removed.

The Chairman, the Government Medical Officer of the station or his Assistant, or any Local Board Inspector may at any time demand and take for the purpose of analysis samples of any milk which is in possession of any person who is found selling, hawking, or exposing milk for sale, or from any premises registered as a dairy, and any person who refuses to permit samples to be taken shall be guilty of an offence

13. Should any samples of milk taken for analysis prove to be adulterated, any dairyman or dairyman's servant from whose possession such sample was taken shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

The Chairman of the Local Board shall be at liberty to cancel the regis-

tration of any dairy in case of breach of any provision of these by-laws.

#### BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

- 1. No person shall sink a well or cause a well to be sunk within the limits of the Local Board town, unless he shall have given to the Chairman one month's notice of such his intention, or shall have obtained a permit from the Chairman to sink such well or cause it to be sunk.
- 2. No well shall be sunk less than 50 feet from any cesspit, cesspool, pigsty, gala, cattle shed, manure heap, leaking drain, neglected privy, heap of decaying vegetable or animal matter, or any manured land.
- 3. No cesspit, cesspool, privy, pigsty, gala, or cattle shed shall be constructed within a distance of 50 feet from any well used for drinking or domestic purposes, nor shall any manure or decaying animal or vegetable matter be deposited, nor any land be cultivated with manure, nor any drain suffered to remain in a leaking condition within such distance.
- 4. All wells shall be lined as far as water level either with bricks set in cement with a backing of puddled clay, or with cylinders of iron, cement, or clay, or shall be otherwise so constructed as to prevent the entrance of water except from the bottom.
- 5. A platform upon which to stand and draw water may be constructed over the top of a portion of the mouth of the well. This platform shall be so constructed as to be absolutely water-tight, so that no water therefrom can trickle back into the well, but all flow on to the apron or pavement referred to in rule 6. The said platform shall have a slope downwards from the centre of the mouth of the well outwards so as to throw off water, and a water-tight ledge at least 6 inches high along its inner edge connected at both ends with the parapet wall. The remainder of the well mouth shall be surrounded by a parapet wall at least 2 feet 6 inches high.
- 6. The well shall be surrounded for a distance of 5 feet by a cement apron or pavement of stone or brick set in cement sloping away from the well.
- 7. The outer edge of such apron or pavement shall be surrounded by a cement gutter emptying into a leadaway drain not less than 10 feet long, so as to prevent the stagnation of water in the vicinity of the well.
- 8. No plank shall be placed across the mouth of the well to stand on when drawing water or for any other purpose.
  - Water from wells shall be drawn in clean receptacles.
- 10. No one shall wash clothes within 20 feet of the mouth of a well used for drinking or domestic purposes.
- 11. Every owner or lessee of a well used as a public bathing place shall supply bathing tubs, and shall not allow persons who bathe to draw water, and no person shall draw water from such well while bathing.
- 12. Whenever any tree or branch of any tree overhangs a well, and is deemed after inspection by the Chairman or any Sanitary Officer of the Board to be injurious to the water owing to the dropping of the leaves or fruit into the water or by otherwise rendering the water unfit for use, it shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Local Board to cause notice in writing to be given to the owner, lessee, or occupier of the ground on which such tree stands to cut down or remove such tree or branch, and if such notice is not complied with within 14 days, such person shall be guilty of an offence.
- 13. The Chairman may, whenever he deems such a course to be necessary, cause notice to be given in writing to the owner or lessee or occupant of any compound in which there is a well used for drinking or domestic purposes to bale out the water and clean the well and execute such repairs as the Chairman may consider to be necessary, and if such notice is not complied with within 14 days, such person shall be guilty of an offence.
- 14. Whenever it shall be decided by a resolution of the Local Board that such a course is expedient in the interests of health, it may give notice to the owner, lessee, or occupant of any land to fill up or disinfect any well on such land, and the owner, lessee, or occupier shall thereupon be bound to comply with such order within 8 days' time. Should such owner, lessee, or occupier fail within such time to comply with such order, such person shall be guilty of an offence.
- 15. It shall be lawful for the Supervisor or Inspector of the Board or other person empowered in writing by the Chairman of the Board to inspect wells or enter upon any land or premises for the purpose of inspecting proposed sites for wells or existing wells and their surroundings.

# VITAL STATISTICS.

Police Magistrate.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 19, 1916.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 100 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 45 Sinhalese, 20 Tamils, 15 Moors, 4 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1916, viz., 255,354) was 20.5, as against 27.6 in the preceding week, 32.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.7 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 131 (1 European, 9 Burghers, 64 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 18 Moors, 4 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 26.8, as against 28.1 in the previous week 29.1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 131 total deaths, 24 were of infants under one year of age, as against 26 in the preceding week, 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—Eighteen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, as against 14 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 9 were in Maradana (including 4 deaths of non-residents in hospital), 4 in St. Paul's, 2 in New Bazaar, 1 in Pettah, 1 in Kotahena, and 1 in Wellawatta.

- 2. Thirteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 20 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 6 were in Kotahena, 4 in Maradana (including a death of a non-resident in hospital), I in San Sebastian, I in Slave Island, and I in Wellawatta.
- 3. Three deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, as against 5 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2 were in St. Paul's and 1 in Maradana (of a non-resident in hospital).
- 4. Two deaths from *Plague* were registered (in New Bazaar), as in the previous week. Six cases were reported, as against 3 in the previous week.
- 5. Sixteen deaths from Infantile Convulsions were registered, 11 from Debility, 5 from Diarrhæa, 5 from Dysentery, 5 from Enteritis, 5 from Worms, and 48 from Other Causes.
- 6. One hundred and one cases from *Chickenpox* were reported, as against 148 in the previous week. Two cases of *Measles* were reported, as against 5 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.1°, against 78.1° in the preceding week and 80.9° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.826 in., against 29.840 in. in the preceding week and 29.859 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.01 in., against nil in the preceding week and 0.02 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
