HEREAS by section 34 (1) of "The Ceylon Railways Ordinance, 1902," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for W the Officer Administering the Government from time to time to declare by Proclamation any road or path which the railway may cross to be a "minor crossing," and whether such "minor crossing" shall be closed by gates or not:

And whereas it is expedient to declare the roads and paths which the railway crosses between the stations of Ratnapura and Dela, in the Province of Sabaragamawa, and set out in the schedule hereto, to be "minor crossings" for the purpose of the said Ordinance :

Now know Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government, in exercise of the power in Us vested as aforesaid, do hereby declare each of the said roads and paths to be a "minor crossing" for the purpose of the said Ordinance as from and after March 3, 1916, and that such "minor crossings" shall not be closed by gates.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-fifth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Sixteen.

T is hereby notified that His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, in the exercise of the powers vested in him by "The Riot Damages Ordinance, No. 23 of 1915," has been pleased, by order in Executive Council-

Provided that in the said recovery credit shall be given for all sums paid by way of voluntary contribution, and that the costs proportionate to the amount of the sums so paid shall be waived

(c) To direct that the amount of such damage and costs shall be apportioned among the several administrative

"THE RIOT DAMAGES ORDINANCE, NO. 3 OF 1915."

T is hereby notified that His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, in exercise of the powers vested in him by "The Riot Damages Ordinance, No. 23 of 1915," has been pleased, by order in Executive Council—

(a) To declare the area consisting of the Wellaboda pattu, Talpe pattu, Bentota-Walallawiti korale, Gangaboda pattu, and the Four Gravets, in the Galle District of the Southern Province, to be a riot area under the said Ordinance, with effect from June 7, 1915.

(b) To direct the recovery from the persons resident and owning property within the said area, other than Europeans, Eurasians, Burghers, Tamils, Moors, Malays, and natives of India, who are hereby exempt from liability, of the amount of riot damage, as assessed by the Special Commissioners, caused in such area subsequent to May 28, 1915, together with the costs of suppressing within the said area the riots or disturbances within the said area by which such damage was occasioned.

(c) To direct that credit be given in respect of so much of the amount of such damage as has already been paid by voluntary contributions, and that no costs shall be recoverable in respect of any sum so paid.

(d) To direct that the said costs shall in the case of each division be deemed to be 8 per cent. of the amount due from such division.

GOVERNMENT NOTICES AFFECTING TRADE.

Regulations affecting the Shipment of Goods of Belgian Origin.

PEBSONS or firms resident or carrying on business in the United Kingdom are prohibited from obtaining goods from

that part of Belgium which is in enemy occupation, for shipment to any destination, except under license. Shipment to the United Kingdom.—Licenses to import goods of Belgian origin into the United Kingdom are granted by the Board of Trade in suitable cases subject to the following conditions, viz., that the Customs Authorities must be furnished in respect of each consignment of goods with-

An undertaking that the licensee will pay the purchase-money into a special account, in the name of the exporter, 1. in a Bank in the United Kingdom and will, when called upon on behalf of His Majesty's Government, furnish evidence of such payment within a reasonable period after the importation ;

2. An undertaking by the Bank that, so long as the enemy occupation of Belgium continues, no money will be allowed to be withdrawn from such special account, except under license given on behalf of His Majesty's Government, and that no charge on the account will be allowed or recognized without such license; 3. A certificate granted by a British Consular Officer to the effect that he is satisfied that the goods are in fact

of Belgian origin. When Belgian goods which have been imported into the United Kingdom are subsequently re-exported to a British oversea port (other than those in Canada, Newfoundland, and Egypt), the importer at that port will be required to produce a certified duplicate of the "Specification for Foreign and Colonial Merchandise" (Form 30) or the "Shipping Bill" (Form 64), as the case requires, which exporters are called upon to lodge with the Customs Authorities in this country

Bill "(Form 64), as the case requires, which exporters are called upon to longe what the observation of such goods from the United Kingdom. The proper Officers of Customs in the United Kingdom are authorized by the Board of Customs and Excise to sign and stamp complete duplications of the "Specification" or "Shipping Bill," or extracts therefrom, free of charge, and the duplicate or extract is presented at the same time as the original. When the goods described on the "Specification" or "Shipping Bill" are intended for two or more consignees, exporters may have extracts signed and stamped for transmission to each consignee.

Shipment to British Oversea Ports.-Licenses are also granted by the Board of Trade in suitable cases to firms in this country to obtain and supply goods of Belgian origin to British oversea ports subject to the following conditions :

- (a) That the licensee furnishes to the proper authority (see below) (i.) an undertaking in respect of each consignment that he will pay the purchase-money into a special account, in the name of the Continental exporter, in a Bank in the United Kingdom, and will, when called upon on behalf of His Majesty's Government, furnish evidence of such payment within a reasonable period; and (ii.) an undertaking by the Bank that, so long as the enemy occupation of Belgium continues, no money will be allowed to be withdrawn from such special account, except under license given on behalf of His Majesty's Government, and that no charge on the account will be allowed or recognized without such license ; (b) That the goods are either sent direct from Holland, or, if sent via the United Kingdom, are entered on arrival
- for immediate exportation under the transhipment regulations ; and
- (c) That the conditions and formalities prescribed by the oversea Government in connection with the importation of goods of Belgian origin are complied with.

by the importer to make no payment for the goods except to the licensee in the United Kingdom, and to furnish evidence of payment to the licensee within a reasonable period after the importation if called upon to do so; and (ii.) a certificate granted by a British Consular Officer in Holland to the effect that he is satisfied that the goods are in fact of Belgian origin.

In case (9) the local Customs Authorities must be furnished with (i.) the authority of the local Government to make the importation; (ii.) an undertaking by the importer that no payment will be made for the goods except to the licensee in the United Kingdom; and (iii.) a certificate granted by a British Consular Officer in Holland to the effect that he is satisfied that the goods are in fact of Belgian origin.

Shipment to Neutral Countries.—If a firm in the United Kingdom or elsewhere desires to obtain goods of Belgian origin for shipment to a neutral country either direct from Holland or with transhipment in the United Kingdom, application should be made to the Foreign Office for a shipment permit, and with the application the firm should enclose—
 1. A declaration or certificate* issued by a competent Belgian local or municipal authority that the goods in question

are to their knowledge of Belgian origin or manufacture ; and

2. A written guarantee from a Bank in this country that the purchase-money for the goods has been deposited with them, and will not be withdrawn without the special authorization of His Majesty's Government during the continuance of the occupation of Belgium by the enemy; or alternatively, clear evidence that the purchase-money was remitted to Belgium before July 31, 1915, such as an affidavit of the Bank in a neutral country through which the money was remitted.

If, however, the firm are unable to deposit the purchase-money in advance, it will be sufficient if they deposit with a Bank in this country the documents covering the sale and shipment of the goods. In this case a written guarantee from the Bank must be produced that they will collect the purchase money against the documents and will retain it during the continuance of the occupation of Belgium by the enemy; and, upon issue of the permit, the documents should be delivered to His Majesty's Consular Officer at the port of shipment for transmission to the Bank named. This notice supersedes that which appeared on pp. 666-8 of the "Board of Trade Journal" of September 2, 1915.

* A declaration or statement by the manufacturers, legalized by a Belgian authority, is not sufficient; the certificate must be issued directly by such authority on their own responsibility.

ESTABLISHMENT OF THE FOREIGN TRADE DEPARTMENT.

The Foreign Trade Department of the Foreign Office has been set up by the Foreign Office as a new Department in order to carry out the policy embodied in the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915 (see pp. 19-20 of the "Board of Trade Journal" of January 6). This Act gives power to prohibit trade by any person, firm, or company in the United Kingdom with any enemy persons or association established in neutral countries.

As the Foreign Trade Department will be concerned with preventing trade by British firms and companies with the enemy in neutral countries, it has been decided to merge with it the Trading with the Enemy Department of the Home Office, which has had the duty of enforcing the measures already taken to prevent trading with the enemy, and the staff of which will continue to perform the same duties, as members of the new Department, in addition to taking part in the administration of the new Act.

Questions of contraband or the hindrance of oversea trade between neutrals and the enemy and the licensing of exports from this country, and all questions of trading with the enemy other than those described above, will continue to be dealt with by the Government Departments which have hitherto been charged with these questions.

In order to secure the full benefit for British interests of the policy of the Department, the advice and assistance of business men will be invited through the Chambers of Commerce and other trade organizations. It is recognized that the success of this policy will depend upon the active co-operation of the business community. It is hoped, therefore, that business men will be willing to aid the Department, and also that they will not besitate to consult it in any matter in which it can be of assistance to therr.

Mr. L. Worthington Evans, M.P., has undertaken the direction of the new Department, with the title of Controller of the Foreign Trade Department of the Foreign Office. Offices have been obtained at Lancaster House, The Mall, S.W. (above the London Museum), and were opened on January 5. (b) To direct the recovery from the persons resident and owning property within the said area of the sum of Rs. 118,700, being the amount of all riot damage, as assessed by the Special Commissioners, caused in such area on and after June 4, 1915, and of the costs of suppressing within the said area the riots or disturbances within the said area by which such damage was occasioned, and to direct that such costs shall be deemed to be 8 per cent. of the amount of such assessed damage. Provided that on the said recovery credit shall be given for all sums paid by way of voluntary contribution, and that the costs proportionate to the amount of the sums so paid shall be waived.

(c) To direct that the amount of such damage and costs shall be apportioned among the several administrative divisions of the said area in the proportions following :---

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 26, 1916.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 141 (1 European, 17 Burghers 74 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 18 Moors, 7 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1916, viz., 255,354) was 28.9, as against 20.5 in the preceding week, 28.9 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.7 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 118 (5 Burghers, 51 Sinhalese, 33 Tamils, 20 Moors, 1 Malay, and 8 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 24.2, as against 26.8 in the previous week, 27.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.8 the weekly average of last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 118 total deaths, 24 were of infants under one year of age, as in the preceding week, against 38 in the corresponding week of the previous year and 29 the average of last year.

Stillbirths .--- The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 3.

Selected Causes of Death.-Twenty deaths from Pneumonia were registered, as against 18 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year; of these, 11 were in Maradana (including 6 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in St. Paul's, 2 in New Bazaar, 2 in Wellawatta, 1 in Pettah, 1 in Kotahena, and 1 in Slave Island; Two deaths from Bronchitis were registered.

2. Thirteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as in the previous week, against 15 the weekly average for last year; of these, 4 were in Maradana (of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in Slave Island, 2 in St. Paul's, 2 in Kotahena, 1 in Pettah, and 1 in San Sebastian.
3. Three deaths from *Plague* were registered, as against 2 in the previous week; of these, 2 were in St. Paul's

and 1 in Maradana. Four cases were reported, as against 6 in the previous week.

4. Three deaths from *Chickenpox* were registered in Maradana; there were none in the previous week. 233 cases were reported, as against 101 in the previous week. Ten cases of *Measles* were reported, as against 2 in the previous week. 5. One death from Enteric Fever was registered (in Kollupitiya), as against 3 in the previous week and 3 the

weekly average for last year. 6. Twelve deaths from Infantile Convulsions were registered, 9 from Debility, 6 from Enteritis, 5 from Dysentery,

3 from Worms, 2 from Diarrhea, 2 from Tetanus, and 37 from Other Causes.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 78.9°, against 81.1° in the preceding week and 81.7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.840 in., against 29.826 in. in the preceding week and 29.845 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.06 in., against 0.01 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.
