By His Excellency REGINALD EDWARD STUBBS, Esquire, Companion of the Most Distinguished. Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Officer Administering the Government of the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

HEREAS the following by-laws made by the Municipal Council of Kandy, under the provisions of Sections 109 (1) and 110 (15) of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910," have been configured by the Officer Administering the Government in Executive Council, as provided by section 109 (3) of the said Ordinance:

Now know Ye that We, the said Officer Administering the Government, in exercise of the power in Us vested by section 109 (3) of the said Ordinance, do hereby proclaim the said by laws set forth in the schedule hereto.

Given at Newara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylorf, this Seventeenth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Sixteen.

#### SCHEDULE.

# By-laws re Public Performances.

222 A. Definition.—"Public performance" in these by-laws shall mean any exhibition of pictures or optical effects by means of a cinematograph or other similar apparatus.

222B. Local authority.—The expression "local authority" shall denote the chairman of the Kandy Municipal Council.

Licensee.—The term "licensee" shall mean the person or persons who have signed the license as such under by-law  $222 \, J$ .

- 222 c. Unlicensed wildings cannot be used.—No person shall use or permit to be used any building, enclosure, or place for the purpose of public performances unless he shall have obtained a license for the same, and no person having obtained a license for the same shall use the same or permit the same to be used in contravention of any of the conditions of such license or in contravention of any of these by-laws.
- 222D. Application for license, should furnish the following particulars.—Any person desirous of obtaining a license for any building, enclosure, or place for the purpose of public performances shall apply to the local authority for a license, specifying in his application—

(1) The situation of the building, enclosure, or place;

(2) Its description and the materials of which it is constructed;
(3) The nature of the performance which it is proposed to present;

(4) The name and permanent address of the owner or owners of the premises to be licensed;

(5) The name and permanent address of the responsible manager of the premises to be licensed;

(6) The name and permunent address of the applicant and the nature of his interest in the building, enclosure, or space for which the license is to be issued;

(7) The nature of the license desired, i.e., annual or temporary;

and any other information which the local authority may demand.

222 E. Local authority to grant licenses.—The licenses which a local authority may grant shall be of two kinds: (i.) annual, (ii.) temporary.

Temporary licenses may be granted for periods not exceeding three months. Annual licenses may be granted only in respect of buildings which are not constructed of inflammable materials. Annual licenses shall expire on December 31 following the issue of the license.

222 F. \*Fee for license.—A fee of Rs. 15 shall be charged for each annual license, and a fee of Rs. 5 for each temporary license.

222 c. Inflammable materials in buildings prohibited.—The local authority shall decide whether the building is constructed of inflammable materials or not.

222 H. No thatched buildings or tents allowed except in special cases.—Ordinarily no thatched building or building constructed of wood, matting, or other inflammable materials, and no tent shall be licensed unless it is situated in an open space. No portion of such structure shall be less than 50 yards from the nearest adjoining building.

2221. License to be subject to certain conditions.—On receipt of an application for the grant of a license, the local authority, after such inquiry as he thinks fit, and after payment of the fees mentioned in by-law 222 r, may, if he sees no objection, grant a license subject to such conditions as he thinks fit.

Any license granted under this by-law may at any time be withdrawn, suspended, or modified by the local authority at his discretion.

222 J. Form of license.—The license granted by the local authority shall be in the Form P annexed, and in it shall be specified the name and address of the licensee, the situation and description (whether built of inflammable materials or not) of the premises, their superficial area, the number of persons to be admitted at any one time, the number of exits to be provided, the houses between which such premises may remain open, the purposes for which they may be used, the nature of the license (whether annual or temporary), the date on which the license expires, and any special conditions attached to the license. The license shall be issued in duplicate, one to be marked "original" and the other to be marked "duplicate," and the license marked "original" shall be issued to and retained by the licensee, and the licensee marked "duplicate" shall be retained and filed by the local authority. Both the licensee marked "original" and "duplicate" shall be signed by the licensee.

222 K. Building to have two main exits with doors to open outwards.—No building or structure shall be licensed unless it has two main exits situated suitably apart, such exits to be not less than 10 feet wide. Where these exits are closed by doors, the doors shall open outwards, and they shall be so constructed that they can be pushed open easily and at once from inside.

222 L. Additional exits necessary in proportion to size of building.—The local authority shall ordinarily make it a condition of a license that when the building or enclosure exceeds 1,000 square feet in area, at least one additional special exit of a width not less than 8 feet shall be provided for each additional 500 square feet of space.

222 M. Exits to be so marked in English and vernaculars.—All exits shall be clearly indicated by having the word "exit" and its equivalent in the vernacular painted in large and legible characters in a conspicuous position on or above them.

222 N. A lighted lamp to be placed over each exit at night.—Each exit shall be provided with a lamp fitted over the doorway with the word "exit" clearly painted on the glass. Each lamp shall be fitted with an oil burner or candle. The lighting of each lamp shall be independent of the lighting of the main building.

222 o. Exit and passages not to be obstructed.—No obstruction shall be placed in

any exit, passage, or staircase within the licensed premises.

222 P. No structural alteration to be made without consent of the local authority.— The licensee shall not make or allow to be made any structural or material alteration to the licensed premises after the license has been granted without the written consent of the local authority.

222 q. Naked light not to be used.—No naked light shall under any circumstances be used inside the licensed premises.

222 R. Swinging lights to be suspended by metal wires or rods.—No swinging light shall be suspended inside the licensed premises except by means of metal wires or rods.

222 s. No kerosthe oil, gunpowder, &c., in excess of a day's quantity to be stored.—No inflammable or explosive substance, such as petroleum, kerosine oil, or gunpowder, &c., in excess of the quantity required for one day's use shall be stored in the licensed premises.

222 r. Three passage ways only allowed to seats.—Not less than three passage ways to seats (one on each side of the premises and one in the centre), each of not less than 3 feet in width, shall be provided in the licensed premises.

222 v. Fire extinguishers to be provided by licensee.—The licensee shall provide or cause to be provided sufficient appliances for the prevention and extinguishing of fire, such provision to consist of not less than 5 gallons of water for every 100 square feet of area of the licensed premises, and if the structure is constructed of inflammable materials of not less than 15 gallons of water per every 100 square feet of area, such water to be kept stored in buckets in readiness for immediate use, one-half within and one-half without the walls of the building.

222 v. Cinematograph not to be placed in the spectatorium without permission.— The cinematograph or apparatus shall not be placed inside the room or building occupied by the spectators, except with the written permission of the local authority.

222 w. Cinematograph how to be placed.—The cinematograph or apparatus shall be screened on three sides as well as overhead, and there shall be only two small openings in the screen, one for the operator to look through and the other for the exhibition of the pictures.

222 x. Smoking prohibited near or inside the cinematograph room.—No smoking shall be permitted, nor shall any one smoke within the screened enclosure or within 6 feet of any film.

222 v. Two persons only to occupy inside the operator's screen.—Not more than two persons, inclusive of the operator, shall be allowed inside the operator's screen at any one time during the exhibition.

222z. No seats to be placed near operator's screen.—No seats shall be placed within a radius of 6 feet of the operator's screen.

222 AA. Films required for the exhibition only to be kept and the others stored away.—
Only those films which are necessary for the performance actually being presented may be kept inside the operator's room or screen. Spare films shall be stored away from the main building.

222 BB. Wet blanket and dry sand to be in readiness near screen.—A person shall be in attendance near the screen during the exhibition with a wet blanket and a bucket of dry sand.

222 CC. Licensed building is open to inspection by police officers and persons authorized by local authority.—Free access to inspect the licensed premises and to see that these by-laws and the conditions of any license are being carried out shall at all times be given to all police officers and to all persons authorized in this behalf by the local authority.

222 DD. Orders of police or authorized officers to be obeyed.—If any officer mentioned in by-law 222 cc not being below the rank of sergeant shall find on inspection that any of these by-laws or any of the conditions of any license is not being carried out, he may order that the public performance shall be stopped, and that the licensed premises shall be closed, and such order shall forthwith be obeyed.

222 EE. No performance to be allowed except in licensed buildings.—No person shall present or assist in presenting or permit to be presented any public performance in any building, enclosure, or place, unless such building, enclosure, or place has been licensed under these by-laws.

222 FF. Permit necessary for performances and previous application should be made.—When the Chairman or any officer authorized by him has reason to believe that any public performance is about to be presented, and deems it advisable that such public performance should not be presented without a permit, such Chairman or any officer authorized by him may, by general or special notice, prohibit the presentation of such public performance until a permit has been obtained.

Any person desirous of presenting any such public performance shall apply to the Chairman or to any officer authorized by him for a permit, and until such permit has been granted no person shall present or assist in presenting or permit to be presented such public performance. Such person shall specify in his application the nature of the performance he desires to present, his name and address, and any other information which the Chairman or any officer authorized by him may demand.

222 gg. Nature or description of the public performance to be furnished if required.—On receipt of an application for the grant of a permit, the Chairman or any officer authorized by him may call on the applicant to exhibit or to submit to him or, to any person named by him the public performance or a description of the

public performance which he desires to present.

222 HH. Chairman to issue permit if there is no objection.—The Chairman or any officer authorized by him, after considering the application mentioned in by-law 222 FF and the exhibition or description mentioned in by-law 222 gg, may, if he sees no objection, grant a permit. Such permit shall ordinarily be in Form Q attached, and shall specify the nature and description of the performance which may be presented, the name of the person or persons responsible for the presentation, the place where such performance may be presented, and the hours between which, and any special conditions under which, it may be presented.

When a permit has been granted for the presentation of a public performance, no person shall present or assist in presenting or permit to be presented any such

public performance in contravention of the conditions of such permit.

222 H. Such permit may be revoked.—Any permit granted under by-law 222 HH may at any time be withdrawn, suspended, or modified by the Chairman or any officer authorized by him at his discretion.

# "THE LOCAL BOARDS ORDINANCE, 1898."

THE following by-laws framed by the Local Board of Minuwangoda, under section 56 (21) of the above-named Ordinance, and confirmed by the Officer Administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, are published for general information.

#### BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

- 1. No person shall sink a well or cause a well to be sunk within the limits of the Local Board town, unless he shall have given to the Chairman one month's notice of such his intention, or shall have obtained a permit from the Chairman to sink such well or cause it to be sunk.
- 2. No well shall be sunk less than 50 feet from any cesspit, cesspool, pigsty, gala, cattle shed, manure heap, leaking drain, neglected privy, heap of decaying vegetable or animal matter, or any manured land.
- 3. No cesspit, cesspool, privy, pigsty, gala, or cattle shed shall be constructed within a distance of 50 feet from any well used for drinking or domestic purposes, nor shall any manure or decaying animal or vegetable matter be deposited, nor any land be cultivated with manure, nor any drain suffered to remain in a leaking condition within such distance.
- 4. All wells shall be lined as far as water level either with bricks set in cement with a backing of puddled clay, or with cylinders of iron, cement, or clay, or shall be otherwise so constructed as to prevent the entrance of water except from the bottom.
- 5. A platform upon which to stand and draw water may be constructed over the top of a portion of the mouth of the well. This platform shall be so constructed as to be absolutely water-tight, so that no water therefrom can trickle back into the well, but all flow on to the apron or pavement referred to in rule 6. The said platform shall have a slope downwards from the centre of the mouth of the well outwards so as to throw off water, and a water-tight ledge at least 6 inches high along its inner edge connected at both ends with the parapet wall. The remainder of the well mouth shall be surrounded by a parapet wall at least 2 feet 6 inches high.
- 6. The well shall be surrounded for a distance of 5 feet by a cement apron or pavement of stone or brick set in cement sloping away from the well.
- 7. The outer edge of such apron or pavement shall be surrounded by a cement gutter emptying into a leadaway drain not less than 10 feet long, so as to prevent the stagnation of water in the vicinity of the well.
- 8. No plank shall be placed across the mouth of the well to stand on when drawing water or for any other purpose.
  - 9. Water from wells shall be drawn in clean receptacles.
- 10. No one shall wash clothes within 20 feet of the mouth of a well used for drinking or domestic purposes.
- 11. Every owner or lessee of a well used as a public bathing place shall supply bathing tubs, and shall not allow persons who bathe to draw water, and no person shall draw water from such well while bathing.
- 12. Whenever any tree or branch of any tree overhangs a well, and is deemed after inspection by the Chairman or any Sanitary Officer of the Board to be injurious to the water owing to the dropping of the leaves or fruit into the water or by otherwise rendering the water unfit for use, it shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Local Board to cause notice in writing to be given to the owner, lessee, or occupier of the ground on which such tree stands to cut down or remove such tree or branch, and if such notice is not complied with within fourteen days such person shall be guilty of an offence.
- 13. The Chairman may, whenever he deems such a course to be necessary, cause notice to be given in writing to the owner or lessee or occupant of any compound in which there is a well used for drinking or domestic purposes to bale out the water and clean the well and execute such repairs as the Chairman may consider to be necessary, and if such notice is not complied with within fourteen days such person shall be guilty of an offence.
- 14. Whenever it shall be decided by a resolution of the Local Board that such a course is expedient in the interest of health, it may give notice to the owner, lessee, or occupant of any land to fill up or disinfect any well on such land, and the owner, lessee, or occupier shall thereupon be bound to comply with such order within eight days' time. Should such owner, lessee, or cocupier fail within such time to comply with such order such person shall be guilty of an offence.
- 15. It shall be lawful for the supervisor or inspector of the Board or other person empowered in writing by the Chairman of the Board to inspect wells or enter upon any land or premises for the purposes of inspecting proposed sites for wells or existing wells and their surroundings.

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# VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended March 18, 1916.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 120 (I European, 9 Burghers, 61 Sinhalese, 16 Tamils, 27 Moors, 5 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1916, viz., 255,354) was 24.6, as against 20.7 in the preceding week, 28.2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.7 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 130 (8 Burghers, 62 Sinhalese, 19 Tamils, 30 Moors, 3 Malays, and 8 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 26.6, as against 23.5 in the previous week, 28.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 130 total deaths, 29 were of infants under one year of age, as against 20 in the preceding week, 31 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 11

Principal Causes of Death.—Twenty-three deaths from Pneumonia were registered, as against 9 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 8 were in Maradana, 4 in St. Paul's, 3 in Slave Island, 2 in Kotahena, 2 in New Bazaar, 2 in Kollupitiya, 1 in San Sebastian, and 1 in Wellawatta. Seven deaths from Bronchitis were registered.

- 2. Fifteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, same as in the previous week, and same also as the weekly average for last year. Of these, 11 were in Maradana (including 4 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in Kotahena, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Wellawatta.
- 3. Four deaths from Plague were registered, as against 5 in the previous week. Of these, I was in Pettah, I in St. Paul's, I in Kotahena, and I in Slave Island. Four cases were reported, as against 5 in the previous week.
- 4. Two deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, same as in the previous week, against 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 1 was in Slave Island and the other in Kollupitiya.
- 5. One death from Chickenpox was registered in Maradana. Two hundred and seven cases were reported, as against 172 in the previous week.
- 6. One death from Measles was registered in Slave Island. Thirty-five cases were reported, as against 7 in the previous week.
- 7. Nine deaths from Debility were registered, 8 from Infantile Convulsions, 7 from Enteritis, 5 from Worms, 2 from Tetanus, 1 from Dysentery, and 45 from Other Causes.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80·7°, against 80·1° in the preceding week and 82·0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·842 in., against 29·832 in. in the preceding week and 29·904 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1·12 in., against 2·38 in. in the preceding week and 1·17 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
