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DRAFT ORDINANCES.

MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information :-

> An Ordinance to dispense with the Publication of Public Documents in Vernacular Versions in the "Government Gazette."

Preamble.

HEREAS it is expedient to dispense with the publication of public documents in vernacular versions in the "Government Gazette": Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

This Ordinance may be cited as "The Gazette Ordinance, of 1916." No.

Meaning of " public document."

2 The expression "public document" in this Ordinance includes any notification, notice, advertisement, rule, regulation, by-law, or other document of public interest.

Vernacular publications dispensed with

8 Notwithstanding anything contained in any Ordinance, or in any rule, regulation, by-law, or order made thereunder, it shall not be necessary to publish in the "Government Gazette" any vernacular version of any public document which is otherwise therein published in English; and the publication of such vernacular version shall not be deemed to be a condition precedent to the validity of any such public document, or of any act done or to be done, or of any proceeding taken or to be taken, subsequent to or in pursuance thereof.

Substituted publication.

4 In any case in which it is provided by any Ordinance, or any rule, regulation, by-law, or order made thereunder, that any public document required to be published in the "Government Gazette" shall be published therein in a vernacular version, there shall be substituted for such publication a public notice of the contents of such document or the substance thereof by the issue of leaflets, placards, or advertisements, or in such other manner as shall be most appropriate for bringing the substance of such document to the attention of the persons interested.

Provided that no such public notice shall be deemed to be a condition precedent to the validity of any such public document, or of any act done or to be done, or proceeding taken or to be taken subsequent to or in pursuance of the publication for which such public notice is substituted.

Statement of Objects and Reasons.

THE publication in the Government Gazette of vernacular versions of rules, regulations, and public notices is found in practice to be both expensive and ineffectual. The expense involved is considerable. The persons to whose notice it is necessary to bring such documents do not read the Government Gazette, and it is desirable that other steps should be taken for the purpose.

(2) The Ordinance accordingly abolishes the publication of vernacular versions in the Government Gazette, and provides that in any case where such publication is required by law publication by leaflets, placards, advertisements, or in some other appropriate method shall be substituted. Such substituted publication is, however, not to be a condition precedent to the validity of the document, or of any act or proceeding dependent on the publication of the vernacular version as not being on record in the same manner as a Gazette publication, it might be impracticable to prove it if occasion required.
