WHEREAS the following churches situated in different parts of the Island are at present governed by the Ordinance No. 12 of 1846, that is to say, Holy Trinity, Colombo; All Saints', Colombo; Holy Trinity, Nuwara Eliya; All Saints', Galle; St. John the Baptist, Kegalla; Holy Trinity, Pussellawa; Christ Church, Matale; and St. Clement's, Puttalam:

And whereas it is expedient to exempt certain of the said churches from the operation of the said Ordinance and to empower the Standing Committee of the Synod of the Church of England in Ceylon to exempt such other of the said churches as desire to be so exempt from the operation of the said Ordinance :

Be it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

Certain churches declared •xempt.

Standing Committee of the Synod empowered to exempt churches.

Churches exempted and hereafter to be exempted to vest in the incorporated trustees of the Church of England. 1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Episcopal Churches (Exemption) Ordinance, No. 7 of 1916."

2 The churches mentioned in the schedule hereto are and they are hereby declared exempt from the operation of the Ordinance No. 12 of 1846 and any amending Ordinance thereof.

3 If at any time after the passing of this Ordinance any of the afore-mentioned churches which have not been included in the schedule to this Ordinance desire to be exempted from the operation of the said Ordinance No. 12 of 1846, the trustees of any such church may apply to the Standing Committee of the Synod of the Church of England in Ceylon to be exempted from the operation of the said Ordinance No. 12 of 1846, and the said Standing Committee is hereby empowered to grant such exemption by the issue of a certificate signed by the Bishop of Colombo in the form set out in the schedule to this Ordinance, and on the issue of such certificate the said church shall be exempt from the operation of the said Ordinance.

Provided always that no such application shall be entertained unless the said Standing Committee shall be satisfied that two-thirds of the seat-holders of the said church present at three consecutive annual meetings of the congregation have voted in favour of such application.

4 The churches hereby exempted, and also such churches as shall hereafter be exempted under this Ordinance, and all property belonging or appertaining thereto, shall vest absolutely in the incorporated trustees of the Church of England in Ceylon, subject to the provisions of the Ordinance No. 6 of 1885 and any amending Ordinance thereof, and subject to any special trust affecting such property.

WHEREAS it is expedient further to amend "The Colombo Municipal Council Waterworks Ordinance, 1907": Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Short title.

Preamble.

Addition of new section.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Colombo Municipal Waterworks (Amendment) Ordinance, No. 9 of 1916."

2 After section 14 of the principal Ordinance the following section shall be added, and shall be numbered 14 A :

14 A. (1) If any private street has been constructed to which one or more houses has access, the Council may, after having passed a resolution to that effect, lay, enlarge, or extend a water main along such private street of such dimensions as may be necessary, and may apportion the whole or part of the cost of the laying, enlarging, or extending such main among the owners of the premises fronting upon, adjoining, abutting, or having access to, or deriving any degree of benefit from, such main according to the areas of the respective premises which may derive, or be so situated as to derive, any such benefit from the laying, enlarging, or extending of the said main.

(2) The initial cost of laying, enlarging, or extending such main shall be borne by the Council, and the property in the said main shall remain in the Council.

(3) The sums apportioned for payment by the owners of the respective premises shall be made a charge upon such premises, and may be recovered as if the same were a rate upon a private water service being granted to such premises; and no private service shall be granted to such premises until the sum apportioned in respect thereof has been paid or an engagement to pay the same be made with the Council as hereinafter provided.

(4) When any premises in any such private street has an already existing supply of water from the Council's mains by private pipes, the Council may, whenever it shall become necessary to take up such private pipes for cleaning or renewal, call upon the owner to connect with the new main.

(5) The Council may, if it is thought fit, on the application of an owner of any such premises, take an engagement from the said owner for the payment by instalments of such sums as will be sufficient to defray the whole amount of the sum apportioned for payment by the said owner, with interest thereon not exceeding the rate of nine per cent. per annum, within a period not exceeding five years, and such sums when due may be recovered by the same process by which rates may be recovered under Ordinance No. 6 of 1910.

(6) (a) In any case where any existing main has been laid in any private street at the expense of any private person, it shall be lawful for such person to recover from the owner or owners of any property fronting upon, adjoining, abutting on, or having access to such private street, who shall apply to the Council for a private service of water, such an apportionment of the cost of the laying of the said main as may be determined by the Chairman in proportion to the frontage of the premises abutting on such street.

(b) No person shall be permitted to make a connection with any such main until he has paid or given a guarantee for the payment of such apportionment to the satisfaction of such private person. (7) (i.) When any premises fronting upon, adjoining, abutting on, or having access to any such private street has an existing supply of water from the Council's mains by private pipes other than the main which has been laid at the cost of any private person aforesaid, the owner of such premises may be permitted to use such pipes until such time as it shall become necessary to take up such pipes for cleaning or renewal.

(ii.) When it shall become necessary to take up such pipes for cleaning or renewal, the owner of the said premises shall not be permitted to relay such pipes in their former position, but shall connect them with the main in the private street laid by the private person aforesaid, and shall, before any connection is made therewith, pay such apportionment of the cost of laying the aforesaid main as shall be determined by the Chairman in proportion to the frontage of the premises abutting on such street.

(8) All mains laid in any private street shall vest in the Council, and the cost of their maintenance, renewal, and repair shall be borne by the Council.

25 A (1) It shall be lawful for the Governor in Executive Council to make over to any Provincial Road Committee or District Road Committee any existing or future tolls lawfully established.

(2) In any such case all the provisions of this Ordinance shall apply to all tolls so made over, and for the purpose of such tolls all references to the Crown in this Ordinance shall be construed as though they were references to the Provincial Road Committee or District Road Committee in question, and all references to a Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent shall be construed as though they were references to the Chairman of the Provincial Road Committee or District Road Committee in question; and any such Provincial or District Road Committee may exercise the same remedies and rights of suit at common law or otherwise with respect to such tolls as the Crown may exercise with respect to tolls under this Ordinance,

In the statement relating to section 380 of the Ceylon Penal Code the words "where the value of the property in respect of which the offence is committed does not exceed one hundred rupees " shall be inserted in continuation of and after the words "Police Court" in the 8th column.


