### DRAFT ORDINANCES.

#### MINUTE.

The following Draft of a proposed Ordinance is published for general information:—

**An Ordinance for making provision for the Supplementary Contingent Charges for the Year 1914-15.**

Preamble.

WHEREAS by Ordinance No. 17 of 1914 it was enacted that a sum not exceeding Sixty-six million Five hundred and Fifty-five thousand Two hundred and Seven rupees should be charged upon the revenue and other funds of this Island for the Contingent Service of the financial year 1914-15, and it has become necessary to make further provision for the service of the said period: It is enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:

Rs. 4,738,950.76 to be charged upon the revenue of the Island for the Supplementary Contingent Charges for the year 1914-15.

1 That a sum not exceeding Four million Seven hundred and Thirty-eight thousand Nine hundred and Fifty rupees and Seventy-six cents shall be and the same is hereby charged upon the revenue and other funds of the Colony for the services hereinafter mentioned, and the said expenditure shall be in conformity with the Heads of Expenditure specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed:
