Excise Notification No. 50.

WHEREAS under section 17 of "The Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912," no person can sell any excisable article without a license from the Government Agent :

And whereas by Notification No. 49, published in the *Government Gazette* of January 28, 1916, no person can possess any cocaine—

- (a) Unless he holds licenses for the possession thereof in accordance with notifications issued by the Excise Commissioner in that behalf, and subject to the conditions of such licenses ; or
