**VITAL STATISTICS OF TOWNS IN CEYLON IN THE
MONTH OF DECEMBER, 1915.**

REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL.

THIS report deals with the Vital Statistics of the 33 principal towns in the Island proclaimed under sections 31-36 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1895.

Births.

2. The births numbered 1,354 (693 males and 661 females), and were equal to an annual rate of 27.22 per 1,000, against 26.13 in the preceding month, 28.21 in the corresponding month of last year, and 29.04 the average of the corresponding months since 1908. The rate ranged from 7.57 in Hatton and Dikoya to 50.10 in Matara.

3. In the city of Colombo the births numbered 478 (248 males and 230 females), and were equal to an annual rate* of 22.39 per 1,000, against 20.96 in the preceding month, 22.52 in the corresponding month of last year, and 24.54 the average of the corresponding months since 1908. The rate ranged from 12.22 in St. Paul's to 28.91 in Wellawatta.

Deaths.

4. The total deaths registered during the month amounted to 1,433 (783 males and 650 females). There were 1,181 deaths of residents, equivalent to an annual rate of 25.88 per 1,000, against 26.04 in the preceding month, 34.31 in the corresponding month of last year, and 35.58 the average for the month of December in each year since 1908. The rate ranged from 43.20 in Puttalam to 12.41 in Panadure.

5. In the city of Colombo the deaths numbered 493 (279 males and 214 females). There were 442 deaths of residents, equivalent to an annual rate* of 24.02 per 1,000, against 25.72 in the preceding month, 31.24 in the corresponding month of last year, and 35.77 the average for the month of December in each year since 1908. The lowest rate, 7.33, was observed, as usual, in Kollupitiya, and the highest, 23.64, in Kotahena.

6. Stillbirths numbered 99 (50 males and 49 females), against 74 in the preceding month.

Infantile Mortality.

7. The infantile mortality was equal to a rate of 216 per 1,000 births registered during the year ended December 31, 1915. Reckoned on the births registered during the month only the rate was 210, against 244 in the preceding month, 270 in the corresponding month of last year, and 326 the average of the corresponding months since 1908.

8. In the city of Colombo the infantile mortality was 188 per 1,000 births registered during the twelve months ended December 31, 1915. Calculated on the births registered during the month the rate was also 188, against 282 in the preceding month, 295 in the corresponding month of last year, and 385 the average of the corresponding months since 1908.

Causes of Death.

9. The highest mortality was from *Debility*, to which 14 per cent. of the total deaths was due, 11 per cent. were due to *Pneumonia*, 10 per cent. to *Convulsions*, 7 per cent. to *Phthisis*, 6 per cent. to *Diarrhoea*, 4 per cent. each to *Anchylostomiasis* and *Dysentery*, 3 per cent. to *Malarial Fever*, 2 per cent. each to *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, *Enteritis*, *Bronchitis*, and *Enteric Fever*, and 1 per cent. to *Puerperal Septicæmia*.

10. In the city of Colombo the highest mortality was due to *Phthisis*, which caused 12 per cent. of the total number of deaths, 10 per cent. each were due to *Pneumonia* and *Convulsions*, 4 per cent. each to *Debility* and *Enteritis*, 3 per cent. each to *Bronchitis*, *Enteric Fever*, and *Bright's Disease* and *Nephritis*, and 2 per cent. to *Dysentery*. Fourteen deaths from *Plague* were registered in the city of Colombo, against 8 in the preceding month. No deaths from *Smallpox* were registered; there was one in the preceding month.

11. *Infectious Diseases reported*.—The most prevalent infectious disease during the month was *Chickenpox*, of which 113 cases were reported (68 in Colombo, 17 in Ratnapura, 6 in Kegalla, 5 in Moratuwa), followed by *Phthisis* 80 (72 in Colombo, 6 in Galle), *Enteric Fever* 60 (36 in Colombo, 10 in Moratuwa, 6 in Galle), *Measles* 28 (24 in Kandy), *Plague* 23 (in Colombo), *Continued Fever* 22 (12 in Colombo, 4 in Galle), *Mumps* 14 (12 in Colombo, 2 in Kandy), *Dysentery* 7 (in Moratuwa), *Diarrhoea* 3 (in Colombo), and *Diphtheria* 3 (in Kandy).

Meteorology.

12. *Rainfall*.—Batticaloa recorded the highest rainfall (13.02 inches), followed by Ratnapura (10.85 inches). In the other towns the rainfall ranged from 10.57 inches in Kandy to 1.47 inches in Negombo. Colombo recorded 1.49 inches.

13. *Temperature*.—The mean temperature varied from 58.1° in Nuwara Eliya to 80.1° in Mannar and was 78.7° in Colombo.
