## ORDER BY THE GENERAL OFFICER COMMANDING THE TROOPS, CEYLON.

NO male British subject of military age arriving on any ship within the limits of the Colony from any port in Australia (not being a person of the Naval or Military Service of His Majesty, or an officer of the ship), whose passport shall be endorsed by the competent Australian Authority, "Travelling to Great Britain," shall land in the Colony, unless such passport shall be further so endorsed with permission so to do; and no such person who shall have landed in the Colony shall embark upon any ship (other than the ship on which he shall have arrived), unless his passport shall be endorsed by the Ceylon Military Authorities with permission so to do.

It shall be the duty of the master or other officer in charge of all ships arriving at or sailing from any port in the Colony to take all necessary steps to prevent the infringement of the order, and to conform to all orders given by any officer of Police or Customs for the purpose of its enforcement.

## GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATION.

IT is hereby directed by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, in pursuance of his powers under the Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council of the 26th day of October, 1896, that any person committing any offence under the Army Act by any infringement of the above Order shall be tried by a Civil Court.
