"THE LOCAL BOARDS ORDINANCE, 1898."

THE following by-laws made by the Local Board of Health and Improvement, Jaffna, under section 56 (7) of "The Local Boards Ordinance, 1898," and confirmed by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, are published for general information.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. No person shall commence the manufacture of aerated waters within the limits of the Local Board for the purposes of sale without giving one month's previous notice in writing to the Chairman of the Board.

2. No aerated water factory shall be situated within less than 150 feet from any gala, stable, or other building used for keeping animals by day and night, or of any latrine or cesspit. No part of the factory shall be used as a dwelling house.

All premises used for manufacture of aerated waters must be well lighted and ventilated, must have cemented floors, must be provided with suitably built drains to carry off waste material, and must be kept clean and free from dirt and dust. The preparation of the syrups must be carried out in a separate fly-proof room. chemicals and other materials used in the manufacture of the waters must be of good quality. All utensils and machinery employed in the manufacture must be kept scrupulously clean.

The water used in the manufacture shall be obtained from a source adequately pretected from contamination and approved of by the Chairman of the Board. shall be transported to the factory by means which shall ensure that no pollution occurs in transit. It shall be stored at the factory in properly constructed tanks or

reservoirs connecting with the aerating apparatus.

5. All water used in the manufacture of aerated waters shall be passed through a Jewell or other filter approved by the Chairman and connected with the plant, provided that the Chairman shall have power to exempt from the operation of this

rule water derived from an approved public supply.

6. Whenever the Secretary or Inspector of the Board is satisfied that any aerated water, either manufactured within the limits of the Board or introduced into such limits from outside, is of such bad quality as to be unfit for human consumption, he may seize such waters and produce them before the Health Officer, and if it appears to such Health Officer that such waters are unfit for human consumption, he may order the same to be destroyed. Any person manufacturing any aerated water which shall be proved to the satisfaction of the court to be unfit for human consumption shall be guilty of an offence.
7. All bottles used in the manufacture of aerated waters shall be washed with

filtered water and shall be kept scrupulously clean.

Every bottle containing aerated water shall bear a label setting out the description of the water and the place of manufacture, the name of the person or firm owning the factory, and the number assigned to the factory by the Chairman of the Board.

9. No person under 12 years of age shall be employed in any aerated water factory, nor any person suffering from any cutaneous or contagious disease.

10. All employés engaged in the filling of bottles with gas shall wear fine-meshed wire face- and neck-shields and leather gloves.

Memorandum of Agreement made the

Twenty-ninth day of March, 1916, between His Excellency REGINALD EDWARD STUBBS, Esquire, C.M.G., Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, acting for and on behalf of His Majesty the King, of the one part, and the CEYLON STEAMSHIP COMPANY, LIMITED, a Company incorporated under the Joint Stock Companies Acts,

1862 to 1886, of the other part.

Whereas the Ceylon Steamship Company, Limited, hereinafter referred to as the "Contractors," have agreed to supply a weekly service of steamers round the Island of Ceylon for a term of five years from the 1st of January, 1915, and the parties hereto have agreed to execute these presents as containing the terms and conditions by and subject to which the said Contractors shall be bound during the continuance of these presents:

Now these presents witness that for considerations hereinafter appearing the Contractors during the continuance of these presents do hereby covenant and agree with the Government of Ceylon as follows; that is to say:

The following expressions as used herein and in the schedule hereto shall have the respective meanings following, i.e.:

Interpretation.

(a) "The Colony" means the Colony of Ceylon.(b) "The Island" means the Island of Ceylon.

- (c) "The Inspector" means the person appointed by the Government of Ceylon to exercise in the Island the powers and duties hereby invested in the Inspector.
- For the purpose of the Steamer Service round the Island the Contractors will, at their own expense, equip and maintain ready for sea during the continuance of these presents the Screw Passenger Steamers whose names, dimensions, power, and tonnage are set forth and described in the schedule hereto to the satisfaction of the Inspector, who shall be at liberty to inspect the condition as to seaworthiness of the hull of each such Steamer and the general efficiency of the boats, engines, boilers, machinery, and fittings of and in the said Steamer, and shall report thereon to the Ceylon Government, and a certificate from the Inspector that each of such Steamers is fully and perfectly equipped and ready for sea shall be a condition precedent to this Contract being in force and binding on the Government of Cevlon.
- Each Steamer shall, so soon as the Inspector shall have given his certificate of approval thereof, and not before, be deemed ready for service for the purposes of this Contract, and shall thereafter during the continuance of these presents be maintained and kept properly manned with proper and sufficient crews, and fully fitted, found, and equipped as aforesaid, at the cost and risk of the Contractors, to the reasonable satisfaction of the Inspector, who shall have access to such vessel at all reasonable times for the purposes of this Contract.
- The Steamer selected for the first voyage under this Contract shall sail on Tuesday, the 5th January, 1915, from the port of Colombo; the sailings of the subsequent Steamers from the port of Colombo shall be on each succeeding Tuesday during the continuance of this agreement, and shall proceed south-about and northabout alternately. Provided that the sailing date may be altered for docking purposes from Tuesday to the previous Monday twice a year for each Steamer mentioned in the schedule to clause 2, sufficient notice being given to the travelling public.

On each voyage the Steamer shall call at the several ports named in the following schedule, and remain thereat respectively during the time set opposite to the name of each port in the same schedule (that is to say) :-

Power to Governor to alter or extend times appointed for sailing, or period of detention at ports.

- 9. The duration of every voyage, and the actual time of weighing anchor or casting off as aforesaid at each port, and the time of bringing to at the next port ready to discharge passengers and cargo, shall be certified by a record under the hand of the Captain of the Steamer, to be verified, if required, by production of the Steamer's log and by statutory declaration or otherwise to the satisfaction of the Governor, and the Captain shall, on the return of the Steamer to Colombo at the end of each voyage, deliver such record to the Master Attendant at Colombo.
- 10. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think it expedient either for any purposes connected with the holding of the Supreme Court of the Colony at any of the said ports or otherwise by notice under his hand, at any time, or from time to time to after or extend, either generally or for any one or more occasion or occasions, the times hereby appointed for the sailing of the Steamer or the periods of detention at the several ports respectively.

11. If and whenever the Contractors shall fail to despatch any Steamer on the day hereby appointed or to be appointed as aforesaid for the sailing thereof, or within such period thereafter as the Inspector may allow, the Contractors shall pay to the Government by way of liquidated damages the sum of Rs. 1,500 for every such default, and the same may be recovered accordingly, or may, at the option of the Government, be set off against and deducted from any moneys payable to the Contractors under these presents.

12. The Contractors shall forfeit and pay on demand to the Government of this Colony a penalty of fifteen rupees for every complete hour and for every part of an hour over any complete hour or multiple of an hour by which any voyage between any two successive ports shall exceed in duration the time allotted therefor under

these presents, unless the Government think fit to waive the same.

13. Provided always that no penalty shall be payable in case of any delay either in sailing or on the voyage which the Contractors shall prove to the reasonable satisfaction of the Master Attendant to have been solely due to stress of weather, or some accident not attributable to their neglect or default, or other unforeseen event not within their control.

- 14. On each and every voyage the Contractors will convey as passengers, subject as hereinafter mentioned, all persons who shall be desirous of travelling by Steamer between the several ports aforesaid, subject to and in accordance with the regulations and conditions set forth in that behalf in the schedule hereto, and also receive, convey, and deliver at, from, and to the several ports aforesaid all such merchandise, goods, and cargo as shall be tendered to them for that purpose, subject to and in accordance with the regulations and conditions set forth in that behalf in the same schedule. Provided always that the number of passengers to be conveyed by any Steamer shall not exceed such number of each class respectively as the Inspector shall certify to be the maximum number to be so carried, and the amount of merchandise, goods, and cargo to be carried thereby at any one time shall likewise not exceed the quantity which shall be likewise certified to be the maximum quantity to be so carried.
- 15. The rates and charges to be paid by passengers between the said several ports and for the conveyance of merchandise, goods, and cargo shall not exceed the several rates and charges set forth in the said schedule. Provided always that the rates and charges to be paid as aforesaid may, upon sufficient cause in that behalf being shown to the satisfaction of the Government, by reason of the change in the value of the rupee or otherwise (such satisfaction to be certified in writing under the hand of the Colonial Secretary), be raised above, but not so as to exceed by more than 20 per cent., the rates and charges specified in the said schedule. Provided that the rates to be paid for the conveyance of merchandise, goods, and cargo between Colombo and ports in the Jaffna Peninsula shall not be less than the rates specified in that behalf in the schedules marked B, D, and E. Provided also that a reduction of 10 per cent. on ordinary rates shall be made in the case of passengers who are persons in the employment of Government and goods and cargo transmitted by or for the purposes of Government.

16. The Contractors shall from time to time supply to the Principal Collector of Customs at Colombo and keep set up for public inspection at the office of their Agents at each of the ports aforesaid a list of the rates and charges for the time being in force, and a table of the ordinary times of the sailing of the Steamers.

17. The Steamers shall, if so required by the Governor by order under his hand, on special occasions and for special purposes make special trips for the purposes of the Government, and shall be paid in respect thereof the several rates and charges mentioned in that behalf in the said schedule, but such special rates and charges shall apply only to persons in the employment of the Government and goods and cargo transmitted by or for the purposes of the Government on such occasions. All other passengers and goods (if any) carried on such special trips shall be conveyed at ordinary rates. Provided always that no penalty or other liability shall be imposed on or incurred by the Contractors by reason of their non-performance of the other provisions and requirements of this Contract, so far as the performance thereof may be prevented by their compliance with any requisition under this present clause.

In addition to the rates and charges to be received by the Contractors as aforesaid for the conveyance of passengers, merchandise, goods, and cargo as aforesaid by their Steamers which the Contractors shall retain for their own use, there shall be paid by way of subsidy to the Contractors by the Government, subject as hereinafter mentioned, the sum of £3,000 sterling per annum by equal quarterly payments, whereof the first payment shall become due on the expiration of three calendar months from the commencement of the first voyage of a Steamer from Colombo under this Contract, and each quarterly instalment thereof shall be paid within seven days after the Contractors shall have obtained from the Colonial Secretary a certificate that the terms of this Contract have been duly complied with by the Contractors up to the day on which such instalment shall have become due, and showing the amount payable to the Contractors after deducting any fines or penalties which may have been incurred by them and then remain unpaid or unsatisfied, and the payment of the said subsidy shall be conditional on such certificate being produced. In addition to the subsidy the Government will pay annually, during the continuance of this agreement, a sum of Rupees Six thousand (Rs. 6,000) per annum in quarterly payments of Rupees One thousand Five hundred (Rs. 1,500) by way of compensation for the Port and Harbour dues payable by the Company in respect of the services hereby agreed to be performed.

If vessel disabled or laid up, Contractors to provide another suitable vessel.

Contractors not to be exempt from Port or Harbour dues.

Power to the Governor to determine Contract in cases of breach of its provisions by Contractors.

Power to Contractors to assign Contract, but not to be thereby released from their personal liability, unless assignment made with assent of Governor.

Duration of Contract.

As to service of notice on Contractors.

Matters in dispute to be referred to arbitration.

Governor, members of Government, &c., not to be personally liable.

In the event of Arugam Bay being opened as a port, Steamer to call thereat. Supplementary agreement to be entered into to adjust time table, &c.

- 19. If and whenever any Steamer shall be disabled or laid up for repair for any period or periods exceeding in the whole six weeks in the course of any one year, the Contractors shall at their own cost provide, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, a suitable vessel to perform the voyages and services which ought to be performed under this Contract by the Steamer so disabled or laid up during the time that the same shall be so disabled or laid up over and above the period or periods aforesaid, and the vessel so provided shall during such period take the place of the Steamer so disabled or laid up as aforesaid for the purposes of these presents.
- 20. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to exempt the Contractors from the payment of Port and Harbour dues in respect of their Steamers, or in respect of any passengers, merchandise, goods, or cargo conveyed thereby, while engaged in the fulfilment of this Contract.
- 21. In case the Contractors fail to keep the Steamers properly found, manned, fitted, and equipped, and in good and seaworthy order and condition, or shall, except for some reasonable and sufficient cause, fail punctually to perform the stipulated number of voyages, or to observe the provisions of this Contract as to speed, detention at ports, or any other matter, it shall be lawful for the Governor of the Colony by notice under his hand absolutely to determine this Contract without prejudice to any other right or remedy of the Government in respect of such default.
- 22. The Contractors may at any time assign to any other person or persons, Company, or Corporation the benefit of this Contract and all their duties and rights hereunder. Provided always that no such assignment shall be deemed to release the Contractors from their personal liability under these presents or prejudice any right or remedy which the Government may have in respect of the premises, unless such assignment shall have been made with the assent in writing of the Governor of the Colony expressed by writing under his hand. In the case of any such assignment so assented to as aforesaid, the person or persons, Company, or Corporation to whom such assignment shall be made shall thenceforward be deemed to be substituted for the Contractors for all the purposes of these presents.
- 23. The period of duration of this Contract shall be five years from the First day of January, 1915.
- 24. All notices given to the Contractors for the purposes of this Contract shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been sufficiently given and served if either delivered to the Contractors or any or either of them, or to their Agent at Colombo personally, or left for or sent by post addressed to them or him at their usual place of business.
- 25. In case and so often as any difference shall arise between the Government and the Contractors or any of their agents concerning the subject-matter of these presents or any part thereof, the same shall be referred to the arbitration of two indifferent persons, one to be nominated in writing by each party and a third to be appointed in writing by the two so appointed, and the decision or award of any two shall be conclusive and binding upon both parties hereto. In default of either party nominating an arbitrator within seven days next after request in writing to do so, then the subject in difference may be referred by the other party to the arbitration of any indifferent person to be named by such last-mentioned party alone, and such person shall be as competent to act as if he had been appointed by all the parties. All costs and reasonable expenses attending any such reference, arbitration, and award as aforesaid shall be in the discretion of the arbitrator or arbitrators appointed as aforesaid.
- 26. The Governor, or any other member or officer of the Government of the Colony respectively, shall not be in anywise personally bound for the acts and obligations of the Government under these presents, or answerable for any default or omission in the observance, performance, or fulfilment of the acts, matters, or things which are hereby made obligatory on the Government.
- 27. It is hereby specially provided that in the event of Arugam Bay being opened as a port the Steamer shall call there on each voyage, and remain thereat during a period to be determined by the parties on the completion and utilization of the said port, and clauses 5, 7, and 8 of this agreement shall be amended accordingly by means of a supplementary agreement to be entered into by the parties for the purpose.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO PASSENGERS.

Cabin Passengers.—The passage rates include messing, bedding, and linen only; wine, beer, and spirits may be obtained on board for payment. Should the vessel be detained in port beyond forty-eight hours after anchoring, and passengers mess on board, they will be liable to an extra charge of six rupees per day after the expiration of that time.

Passage Tickets.—These, both cabin and deck, can only be obtained from the Steamers' Agents on payment of the fare. No passenger will be received on board without a ticket. Children under five years of age allowed free, but charged Rs. 2'50 per day for messing, except infants of one year; children over five years and under ten, one-half rates, to include messing. Servants of cabin passengers, one-half deck passage rates, and Re. 1 per day for messing.

Baggage.—5 cwt. or 15 cubic feet measurement allowed to each person free; children liable to charge for passage, half that quantity; all in excess and furniture accompanying passengers to be charged freight as per agreement with Agent at the port of shipment.

Deck Passengers.—The passage rate includes water and deck accommodation only, which is restricted to that portion of the vessel before the funnel. Children under five years, free; over five and under ten, half the full rate.

Baggage.—1 cwt. or 5 cubic feet measurement, not being merchandise, allowed to each person free. Children liable to charge for passage, half that quantity; all in excess to be charged as freight.

Note.—Gangs of bona fide immigrant coolies will be carried to and from Paumben and Colombo as deck passengers on the Steamers' trips round the Island at the following rates, viz., adults, Re. 1 and 80 cents each; children between five and ten years, 90 cents each; under five years, free.

RATES TO BE CHARGED FOR HIRE OF STEAMERS ON SPECIAL OCCASIONS.

Conveyance of Troops.—On the Steamers' ordinary trips round the Island a limited number of Troops, not exceeding 25, including women and children, may be conveyed on the same terms and regulations as deck passengers, and officers on the same terms as cabin passengers.

Should the Steamer be required specially for Troops, and other duties will admit of this, the following rates will be charged:—

From Colombo to Trincomalee and back, including 24 hours' detention at Trincomalee, Rs. 1,800 for the trip one way, or Rs. 3,000 for the voyage there and back.

From Colombo to Galle and back, including 24 hours' detention at Galle, Rs. 960 for the trip one way, or Rs. 1,440 for the voyage there and back.

These rates include water and fuel, and the whole of the vessel's hold and 'tween decks for the use of the Troops.

Officers proceeding by the Steamer on these occasions will be charged the ordinary cabin fare extra.

Conveyance of Supreme Court.—The Officers comprising the Court will be conveyed at the usual rates of passage; and an extra charge of Rs. 240 for each day's detention of Steamer in ports where the Court may be held.

Pearl Fishery Duties.—When employed on these duties Rs. 240 per day and the cost of coals consumed will be charged.

Other Occasions.—If allowed to be employed on any other special occasion, the charge will be Rs. 600 per day and the cost of coals consumed.

Note.—When employed on special occasions, any available accommodation, after the wants of the service on which the Steamer for the time being is employed are supplied, will be otherwise made use of, if required.

"THE LOCAL BOARDS ORDINANCE, 1898."

IT is hereby notified that the following by-laws made by the Local Board, Badulla, in pursuance of section 56, sub-section (21), of the Ordinance No. 13 of 1898, have been submitted to and confirmed by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, acting with the advice of the Executive Council.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

- 1. No person shall commence the manufacture of aerated waters within the limits of the Local Board for the purposes of sale without giving one month's previous notice in writing to the Chairman of the Board.
- 2. No aerated water factory shall be situated within less than 150 feet from any gala, stable, or other building used for keeping animals by day and night, or of any latrine or cesspit. No part of the factory shall be used as a dwelling house.
- 3. All premises used for manufacture of aerated waters must be well lighted and ventilated, must have cemented floors, must be provided with suitable built drains to carry off waste material, and must be kept clean and free from dirt and dust. The preparation of the syrups must be carried out in a separate fly-proof room. All chemicals and other materials used in the manufacture of the waters must be of good quality. All utensils and machinery employed in the manufacture must be kept scrupulously clean.
- 4. The water used in the manufacture shall be obtained from a source adequately protected from contamination and approved of by the Chairman of the Board. It shall be transported to the factory by means which shall ensure that no pollution occurs in transit. It shall be stored at the factory in properly constructed tanks or reservoirs connecting with the aerating apparatus.
- 5. All water used in the manufacture of aerated waters shall be passed through a Jewell or other filter approved by the Chairman and connected with the plant, provided that the Chairman shall have power to exempt from the operation of this rule water derived from an approved public supply.
- 6. Whenever the Supervisor or Inspector of the Board is satisfied that any aerated water, either manufactured within the limits of the Board or introduced into such limits from outside, is of such bad quality as to be unfit for human consumption, he may seize such waters and produce them before the Health Officer, and if it appears to such Health Officer that such waters are unfit for human consumption, he may order the same to be destroyed. Any person manufacturing any aerated water which shall be proved to the satisfaction of the court to be unfit for human consumption shall be guilty of an offence.
- 7. All bottles used in the manufacture of aerated waters shall be washed with filtered water and shall be kept scrupulously clean.
- 8. Every bottle containing serated water shall bear a label setting out the description of the water and the place of manufacture, the name of the person or firm owning the factory, and the number assigned to the factory by the Chairman of the Board
- 9. No person under 12 years of age shall be employed in any aerated water factory, nor any person suffering from any cutaneous or contagious disease.
- 10. All employés engaged in the filling of bottles with gas shall wear fine-meshed wire face- and neck-shields and leather gloves.

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ANNOUNCEMENTS REFERRED TO.

MERCHANTS and others are reminded that where a letter of credit is issued for the financing of merchandise shipped either from the United Kingdom or from overseas to a neutral country in Europe, or where documents relating to the shipment of such goods are handled in any form by banks or other institutions in this country, the banks and institutions are required before undertaking the business to insist upon the production of a declaration signed by the consignee and countersigned by the consignee's banker in the neutral country that the goods are for consumption only in the country to which they are shipped. The form of declaration may be obtained from any banker in the United Kingdom. The absence of such declarations has caused prejudicial delays.

Goods for Denmark.

In the case of articles coming within the scope of the Agreement of the 19th November, 1915, between His Majesty's Government and the Merchants' Guild of Copenhagen and the Danish Chamber of Manufacturers, a declaration that the goods in question are duly covered by a guarantee given either by the Merchants' Guild of Copenhagen or by the Danish Chamber of Manufacturers, as the case may be, is required in lieu of the usual declaration.

New Passport Regulations.

On and after 1st March the following regulations will apply to the passenger traffic from France to the United Kingdom:—

All passengers must obtain a visa to their passports from the British Bureau de Contrôle in Paris (18, Rue Chauveau Lagarde, Boulevarde Malesherbes), subject to the following exceptions:—

(1) Residents in the Departments of Pas de Calais, Somme, Seine Inférieure, Calvados, and Manche may apply for a visa to the British Consular officers at Havre or Dieppe.

(2) Residents in Brittany who are subjects of Allied States may apply for a visa to the British Vice-Consul at St. Malo.

(3) British subjects who disembark at Marseilles from vessels arriving from ports east of Suez or from Egypt, and who are proceeding direct to the United Kingdom, may obtain a visa from the British Consul-General at Marseilles.

>(4) Persons who have obtained permission from the Military Authorities to embark at Calais or Boulogne should apply to the British Consular officers at those ports.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended April 8, 1916.

-The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 90 (8 Burghers, 53 Sinhalese, 12 Tamils, 10 Moors, 6 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1916, viz., 255,354) was 18·4, as against 22·3 in the preceding week, 25·1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22·7 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 121 (3 Europeans, 6 Burghers, 55 Sinhalese, 21 Tamils, 23 Moors, 2 Malays, and 11 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 24 · 8, as against 28 · 3 in the previous week, 25 · 5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 121 total deaths, 24 were of infants under one year of age, as against 19 in the preceding week, 34 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 3.

Principal Causes of Death.—Seventeen deaths from Pneumonia were registered, as against 22 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 5 were in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 4 in Kotahena, 3 in St. Paul's, 3'in Slave Island, and 2 in San Sebastian. Three deaths from Bronchitis were registered.

- 2. Seventeen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 13 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 6 were in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 4 in Kotahena, 4 in New Bazaar, 2 in St. Paul's, and 1 in Kollupitiya.
- 3. Three deaths from Plague were registered, as against 4 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 1 was in Pettah, 1 in St. Paul's, and 1 in Maradana. Three cases were reported, as against 7 in the previous week.
- 4. Two deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 3 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 1 was in Pettah and the other in Maradana.
- 5. One death from Chickenpox was registered in Maradana. One hundred and seventy-one cases were reported, as against 206 in the previous week.
- 6. One death from *Measles* was registered in Slave Island. Forty-nine cases were reported, as against 67 in the previous week.
- 7. Thirteen deaths from Infantile Convulsions were registered, 8 from Debility, 6 from Enteritis, 3 from Worms, 2 from Diarrhæa, 1 from Tetanus, and 44 from Other Causes.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 81.8°, against 82.1° in the preceding week and 83.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.839 in., against 29.825 in. in the preceding week and 29.922 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.64 in., against 0.83 in. in the preceding week and 0.67 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
