"THE RIOT DAMAGES ORDINANCE, No. 23 OF 1915."

IT is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in him by "The Riot Damages Ordinance, No. 23 of 1915," has been pleased, by order in Executive Council—

(a) To declare the Vidane Arachchis' divisions of—

(b) To direct the recovery from the persons resident and owning property within the said area of the sum of Rs. 110,800, being the amount of all riot damage, as assessed by the Special Commissioner, caused in such area on or after June 1, 1915, and of the costs of suppressing within such area the riots or disturbances within such area by which such damage was occasioned.

(c) To direct that such costs shall be deemed to be 8 per cent. of the amount of the assessed damage.

(d) To direct that credit be given in respect of so much of the amount of such damage as has already been paid by voluntary contributions, and that no costs shall be recoverable in respect of any sum so paid.

(e) To exempt from all liability under the said Ordinance all Europeans, Eurasians, Burghers, Tamils, Moors, Malays, and natives of India, and all persons who have made voluntary payments under the said Ordinance to the satisfaction of the Special Commissioner, and to direct that the allotment lists be prepared accordingly.

(f) To exempt all persons resident or owning property within such parts of the administrative division of Horana, Wewala, and Mahena as are included within the limits of the Horana Sanitary Board from all liability to which they would otherwise be subject by virtue of such residence or property in respect of the amounts apportioned to the said administrative division.

(g) To direct that the amount of such damage and costs be apportioned among the several administrative divisions of the said area in the proportions following:—

"THE RIOT DAMAGES ORDINANCE, No. 23 OF 1915."

THE following scheme framed by the Municipal Council of Galle, under section 32, sub-section (1), of the above Ordinance, and approved by the Governor in Executive Council, under section 32, sub-section (2), is hereby published in terms of the last-named sub-section.

Scheme framed by the Municipal Council of Galle under Ordinance No. 23 of 1915 at the General Meeting held on March 11, 1916.

Whereas under section 32 of Ordinance No. 23 of 1915, entitled "An Ordinance to provide Compensation for Losses by Riots," a Municipal Council may frame a scheme for the liquidation of the charges imposed upon its revenues under section 32 of the aforesaid Ordinance; and

Whereas it is necessary for the Municipal Council of Galle to frame a scheme for the liquidation of the amount, together with the cost of the collection thereof, of the assessment of the compensation due on the damages occasioned during the riots which occurred in the Municipality of Galle on June 2, 1915, and the following days:

It is hereby resolved, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, that—

1. (1) A tax of Rs. 6 per head per annum shall be imposed upon all persons liable to the labour tax, in accordance with the lists prepared for the year 1916 and the year 1917, under section 129 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, subject to the exemptions contained in the provisions of law mentioned in the aforesaid section, and subject further to the exemption—

- (a) Of any person who has suffered damage during the said riots as may be determined by the Chairman of the Municipal Council; and
- (b) Of any member of any Volunteer Corps who may under the order of the Military Authorities have assisted in the suppression of the aforesaid riots, on the production of a certificate under the hand of the Commanding Officer to the satisfaction of the Chairman of the Municipal Council.

And that any deficiency at the end of two years be made up by such an assessment rate on the annual value of all houses and buildings of every description and of all lands and tenements whatsoever within the Municipality of Galle as may be sufficient to cover such deficiency.

(2) The said tax shall be paid in four instalments of Rs. 3 each. The first instalment shall be paid on or before July 1, 1916, the second instalment on or before November 1, 1916, the third instalment on or before July 1, 1917, and the fourth instalment on or before November 1, 1917, and may be collected in the same manner as the commutation tax payable under section 129 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, is collected.

(3) It shall be lawful for any person liable to the payment of the said tax to apply in writing to the Chairman of the Municipal Council to be allowed to commute the payment of each instalment of the said sum of Rs. 3 due by him for the performance of labour upon such public works as the Superintendent of Works of the Galle Municipality shall appoint.

(4) Every such application shall be made at any time prior to June 15, 1916, in respect of the instalment due on July 1, 1916; prior to September 1, 1916, in respect of the instalment due on November 1, 1916; prior to May 1, 1917, in respect of the instalment due on July 1, 1917; and prior to September 1, 1917, in respect of the instalment due on November 1, 1917; and the Chairman of the Municipal Council shall make such order thereon as he may deem fit.

(5) If the application is allowed, such applicant shall sign at the Office of the Galle Municipality an undertaking in writing to perform nine days' labour within the limits of the Municipal Council of Galle in respect of each instalment, and to appear on such dates at the Pavilion on the Esplanade, as may be decided by the Superintendent of Works, to ascertain the time and place at which the labour is to be performed.

(6) No person shall be entitled to commute the money payment due by him unless he has signed the undertaking herein referred to before June 26, 1916, October 1, 1916, June 1, 1917, and October 1, 1917.

(7) If any person shall fail or neglect to pay the said sum of Rs. 3 by July 1, 1916, November 1, 1916, July 1, 1917, and November 1, 1917, respectively, or if any person who may have signed an undertaking to perform labour in lieu of the payments of the said sum of Rs. 3 shall fail or neglect to attend at the time and place appointed for the performance of labour, or shall fail or neglect to perform the labour appointed in pursuance of such undertaking, the Chairman of the Municipal Council may file or cause to be filed before the Municipal Magistrate an information against the said person.

(8) On the receipt of the said information the Municipal Magistrate shall issue a warrant for the arrest of such person.

(9) Any person arrested under the warrant issued by the Municipal Magistrate shall be taken without delay before the said Municipal Magistrate according to the terms of the warrant and subject to such bail as may be directed by the Municipal Magistrate in his discretion to be taken, and the Municipal Magistrate before whom

such person shall be brought shall inquire into the default in respect of which such person was arrested, and upon being satisfied that the person arrested is the person against whom the warrant was issued, and that the default mentioned in such warrant was committed by such person, shall and is hereby required by warrant to commit such person to prison, there to be detained at hard labour for the period of one month. Provided that the Municipal Magistrate before whom any such person shall be brought may, in his discretion, in lieu of committing such person to prison, adjudge him to pay a penalty of Rs. 10, and, if such sum be paid forthwith or within such time as the Municipal Magistrate may allow, such person shall not be committed to prison, but otherwise he shall; and the Municipal Magistrate may, if such person shall have been released prior to the payment of such fine when inflicted, issue if necessary a warrant for his arrest. Provided that, if after the commitment of such person such penalty shall be paid, it shall be lawful for such Magistrate to discharge such person out of prison. Provided also that from any decision of the Municipal Magistrate under this scheme there shall be no appeal.

IT is hereby notified for general information that the Governor in Executive Council has sanctioned the levy of the following rates of royalty under clause 4 (1) of the Ordinance No. 18 of 1890 from and after June 10, 1916 :—

Live chanks (i.e., live chanks of various sizes and weights so mixed together and bagged that they can be entered for *ad valorem* import duty at the Calcutta Customs at an all over value of Rs. 80 per 1,000): Rs. 6 per 1,000 chanks.

Dead chanks (i.e., dead chanks of various sizes and weights so mixed together and bagged that they can be entered for *ad valorem* import duty at the Calcutta Customs at an all over value of Rs. 40 per 1,000): Rs. 3 per 1,000 chanks.

Inferior chanks (i.e., the “wormed” or otherwise damaged live and dead chanks of whatever size and such small live and dead chanks as will pass through a circular gauge 6½ inches in circumference): Rs. 2 per 1,000 chanks.

Kataragama Pilgrimage.

IN terms of rule No. 12 of regulations framed under Ordinance No. 13 of 1896 for the conduct of the Kataragama pilgrimage, it is hereby notified for general information that any person proceeding to Ruhunu Maha Kataragama Dewale at Kataragama during Ehela and Imaha Kachchi Festivals without first obtaining a permit from the Government Agents or Assistant Government Agents of the respective districts will be liable, under section 2 of the aforesaid Ordinance, to a fine not exceeding Rs. 1,000, or to rigorous or simple imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year.

"THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE, 1896."

THE following rules and orders made by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, under Ordinance No. 13 of 1896, entitled "An Ordinance relating to Pilgrimages," for the conduct of the Kataragama pilgrimage and festival, where special precautions have been and are necessary, are published for general information in lieu of the rules promulgated annually for several years.

Rules.

1. For sanitary reasons the duration of the Kataragama Ehela festival and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama shall be and it is hereby limited to 16 days, namely, July 30 to August 14, 1916, inclusive. Pilgrims arriving before the day first named or staying beyond the period here prescribed shall be guilty of an offence.

2. It shall be lawful for the Police authorities or any Police Magistrate at any place on the line of march to prohibit from proceeding all persons who, by reason of disease, infirmity, weakness, advanced age, youth, want of supplies, or other sufficient cause, are considered unfit to undertake the journey, or who appear likely to fall ill and endanger the health of others; and to require such persons to find security to ensure their obedience to the orders so given. In default of such security being found, it shall be lawful for the said Police authorities or Police Magistrate to detain such persons in custody for a period not exceeding three days.

3. In the event of an epidemic breaking out at Kataragama during the festival, it shall be lawful for the officers appointed to enforce the observance of orders to declare the festival at an end, and to direct pilgrims at once to leave the village and proceed to their homes, and to prescribe the roads they have to travel.

4. The officers appointed to enforce the observance of orders shall have power on the line of march to and from Kataragama and at Kataragama—

- (a) To appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water and drinking, and for natural offices.
- (b) To appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims.
- (c) To prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims.
- (d) To regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims.
- (e) To fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them, and to detain them if unfit to travel.

Any person disobeying an order given by the appointed officers shall be guilty of an offence.

5. The Police are empowered and required to seize and destroy all food condemned as unwholesome on the march or in camp by the Medical Officer, or, if there be none, by the Chief Officer of Police; and any persons resisting or obstructing the Police in the discharge of this or of any other duty prescribed by these rules shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

6. Any person bringing any cattle or cart bulls within three miles of the camp shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

7. Any person selling meat in camp in any other place than that assigned for the purpose by the officer in charge of the camp, and any other person selling food condemned as unwholesome by the Medical Officer, or in his absence by the Chief Officer of Police, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

8. Any person who shall, during the occupation of the camp, use any other place for offices of nature than that provided for the purpose by Government, or failing to cover the deposit with earth or sand, and any person who shall during the same period bathe in or enter the river above the spot appointed by the officer in charge of the camp, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

9. Any person suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and not reporting the same to the Medical Officer, or in his absence to the Chief Officer of Police, and any person abetting or assisting in the concealment of such disease, shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

10. All persons shall take up the quarters assigned to them by the Chief Officer of Police at the halting places and in the camp, and any pilgrim declining or neglecting to do so shall be deemed guilty of an offence.

11. The number of pilgrims for the pilgrimage of the year 1916 is restricted to 1,750.

12. No person shall proceed on the pilgrimage in the year 1916 without having first obtained ticket from the Government Agent of the Western Province for the Colombo band, or from the Government Agent of the North-Central Province for the Anuradhapura band, or from the Government Agent of the Southern Province for the Galle band, or from the Government Agent of the North-Western Province for the Kurunegala band, or from the Government Agent of the Eastern Province for the Batticaloa band, or from the Government Agent of the Northern Province for the Jaffna band, or from the Government Agent of the Province of Uva for the Badulla band, or from the Government Agent of the Province of Sabaragamuwa for the Ratnapura band, or from the Government Agent of the Central Province for the Kandy band.

13. Every person proceeding on the pilgrimage shall show his ticket when required to do so by any officer of Police, or by any officer appointed to enforce the observance of orders under the Ordinance aforesaid.

14. The transfer of a ticket by the person named in it and the use of it by any other person are forbidden.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 3, 1916.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 92 (4 Burghers, 60 Sinhalese, 11 Tamils, 14 Moors, 2 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1916, viz., 255,354) was 18·8, as against 17·6 in the preceding week, 7·2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22·7 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 158 (2 Europeans, 8 Burghers, 77 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 21 Moors, 6 Malays, and 19 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 32·4, as against 28·3 in the previous week, 28·2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25·8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 158 total deaths, 22 were of infants under one year of age, as against 27 in the preceding week, 26 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 5.

Principal Causes of Death.—Eighteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 24 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 9 were in Maradana (including 5 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in Slave Island, 2 in Kotahena, 1 in Pettah, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta.

2. Seventeen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 24 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 10 were in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in Kotahena, 2 in Wellawatta, 1 in St. Paul's, and 1 in Slave Island. Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

3. Six deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 5 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 1 was in Pettah, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in Kotahena, 1 in Maradana, 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in Wellawatta.

4. Fifteen deaths of passengers on military service on board ss. Hong Kong were registered at the Infectious Diseases Hospital, Wellawatta, of *Cholera*. No cases were reported.

5. Three deaths from *Plague* were registered at St. Paul's, as against 1 in the previous week. Eleven cases were reported, though there were none in the previous week.

6. Eleven deaths from *Debility* were registered, 8 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 6 from *Enteritis*, 5 from *Dysentery*, 2 from *Diarrhoea*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 62 from *Other Causes*.

7. Twenty-five cases of *Chickenpox* were reported, as against 53 in the previous week; 19 of *Measles*, against 22 in the previous week; and 2 of *Smallpox*, against nil in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 82·3°, against 81·4° in the preceding week and 85·2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·786 in., against 29·720 in. in the preceding week and 29·779 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 3·82 in., against 3·94 in. in the preceding week and 0·36 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

“THE NECESSARIES OF WAR EXPORTATION ORDINANCE, No. 19 OF 1914.”

IN the Name of His Majesty GEORGE THE FIFTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir JOHN ANDERSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

JOHN ANDERSON.

WHEREAS it is desirable to consolidate, with certain amendments, Our Proclamations issued under “The Necessaries of War Exportation Ordinance, No 19 of 1914,” herein named :

Know Ye that We, the Governor, in pursuance of the said “The Necessaries of War Exportation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1914,” do hereby revoke Our Proclamations dated the 10th day of February, the 3rd day of March, the 27th day of March, the 19th day of April, and the 4th day of May (published in the *Government Gazettes* Nos. 6,777, 6,783, 6,786, 6,790, and 6,792 of the 11th day of February, the 10th day of March, the 31st day of March, the 20th day of April, and the 5th day of May, 1916, respectively), and do hereby prohibit the exportation from Ceylon of the articles specified in Schedules A, B, C, and D hereto to the extent therein specified.

And We do hereby further call upon His Majesty's subjects and all other persons being in the said Island to govern themselves accordingly.

Given at Kandy, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Thirtieth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Sixteen.
