Preaching or holding meetings in streets prohibited.

268 gg. No person shall preach or address any assembly or crowd or hold any meeting in any street within the Municipal limits of Kandy, except in pursuance of a permit from the Superintendent of Police or the Chairman of the Municipal Council, and within the times and limits specified in such permit. Any person who shall commit a breach of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty rupees.

HEREAS by Proclamation bearing date June 26, 1909, issued under the provisions of section 4 of the Ordinance No. 11 of 1891, intituled "An Ordinance to re-adjust the Customs Duties leviable on Firearms and to impose an Export Duty on certain Hides and Horns," the exportation of hides and cut horns of the spotted deer and sambur for commercial or trade purposes was prohibited for a period of seven years, as from and after September 1, 1909, till August 31, 1916 (both days inclusive):

And whereas it is expedient to continue the prohibition for a further period:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the powers in Us vested by section 4 of the above-named Ordinance, do hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, prohibit the exportation for commercial or trade purposes of hides and cut horns of the spotted deer and sambur for a further period extending to June 30, 1917, provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect the rights of the Crown.

ENTRANCE EXAMINATION FOR CANDIDATES WISHING TO ENTER THE EXCISE DEPARTMENT AS LEARNERS.

NOTICE is hereby given that a competitive examination for candidates wishing to enter the Excise Department as Learners with a view to appointments as Excise Inspectors will be held at the old Royal College by the Director of Education on July 20, 21, and 22, 1916, at 10 A.M. and 2 P.M. daily.

- 2. The number of places open for competition cannot now be definitely stated, perhaps 12 men can be taken on promptly and others later on.
- 3. Before admission to the entrance examination a candidate must send or personally deliver to the Excise Commissioner not later than 2 P.M. on July 6, 1916, the following:—
 - (a) An application (on a form obtained from the Excise Commissioner's Office) duly filled in by the applicant himself.
 - (b) A certificate or several certificates of his good character signed by one or more responsible persons to the satisfaction of the Excise Commissioner.
 - (c) A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth, showing him to be on the first day of the examination between the ages of 20 and 25 (unless the Excise Commissioner decides to make a special exception). Affidavits and horoscopes will not be accepted in proof of age. Baptismal certificates will be accepted if the baptism took place within four months of the date of birth.
- N.B.—Applicants who have already sent in forms duly filled in need not make fresh applications. Memoranda calling for birth certificates, &c., are sent to those whose applications have already been registered in the Excise Commissioner's Office.
- 4. If the application is considered satisfactory, a form of admission to the examination will be forwarded to the applicant by post. The applicant must then affix to it Ceylon stamps to the value of Rs. 5, and produce the form, duly stamped and with the stamps undefaced, to the officer conducting the examination. Stamps cut, torn, or in any way defaced will not be accepted. Any candidate failing to produce the form duly stamped, whatever may be the reason for doing so, will not be admitted to the examination.
 - 5. Rejected candidates will be duly informed of the non-acceptance of their applications.

- 7. There is no compulsory minimum of marks to be obtained in any subject, but candidates will be tested in reading and knowledge of colloquial English.
- 8. The candidates who obtain the highest aggregate marks in the examination will, subject to their other qualifications being considered satisfactory, be selected up to the number required for admission as Learners. Before any candidate is so selected, he must undergo and pass a medical examination as to his fitness for service in any part of the Island. The medical examination will be held by the Principal Civil Medical Officer, and a fee of Rs. 10 for such examination will be charged.
- 9. Such candidates will be required to undergo a course of training as Learners for a probationary period, which may perhaps be usually six months, part of which will be spent in office and part in outdoor work under Assistant Superintendents of Excise or experienced Excise Inspectors.
- 10. Learners will receive a subsistence allowance of Rs. 35 per mensem while attached to an office, and in addition a travelling allowance of Rs. 35 per mensem while attached for outdoor work to an Assistant Superintendent of Excise or Inspector.
- 11. The payment of the allowances is contingent on the satisfactory behaviour of the Learner. Any Learner who does not satisfy the Excise Commissioner as regards progress in the study of Excise work and good behaviour is liable to summary rejection at any time during the perod of training and forfeiture of his allowance, and any Learner so rejected will for the future be ineligible for service in the Excise Department.
 - 12. Before the end of the probationary period Excise Learners will be required to pass an examination in-

Excise work generally.
Preliminary Excise Law.
Colloquial Sinhalese or Tamil.

- 13. At the close of a period of training Learners who are considered satisfactory and have passed the examination prescribed in the preceding condition 12 will be appointed, on probation for three years, with salary at Rs. 50 per mensem and commuted allowance, as Excise Inspectors, as vacancies occur. During the period of waiting for appointment as Excise Inspector, Learners will continue to receive pay as specified in condition 10 supra.
- 14. Clerks of the Excise Department, irrespective of age who have put in two years' satisfactory service in the Department, may be nominated by the Excise Commissioner, subject to the approval of Government, for direct entry into the class of Learners. They must secure a pass in the examination prescribed by condition 12, and are then eligible (subject to the medical examination prescribed in condition 8) to one out of every four vacancies.
- 15. All persons passing into the Excise Department will be bound by such rules and regulations as have been or may hereafter be made for the Department.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended June 17, 1916.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 102 (1 European, 12 Burghers, 55 Sinhalese, 13 Tamils, 13 Moors, 3 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1916, viz., 255,354) was 20·9, as against 21·7 in the preceding week, 20·2 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.7 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 140 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 62 Sinhalese, 39 Tamils, 13 Moors, 3 Malays, and 11 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 28.7, as against 27.6 in the previous week, 29.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 140 total deaths, 31 were of infants under one year of age, as against 22 in the preceding

week, 35 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 4.

Principal Causes of Death.—Twenty deaths from Phthisis were registered, as against 9 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 7 were in Maradana (including 4 deaths of non-residents in hospitals, 5 in Kotahena, 3 in New Bazaar, 2 in Wellawatta, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in Kollupitiya.

2. Seventeen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 22 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 6 were in Wellawatta, 3 in Maradana (including a death of a non-resident in hospital), 2 in Kotahena, 2 in New Bazaar, 2 in Slave Island, and 2 in Kollupitiya. Four deaths from Bronchitis were registered.

3. Three deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, as against 4 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for

last year. Of these, I was in Pettah, I in St. Paul's, and I in New Bazaar.

Two deaths from Plague were registered, as against 4 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last Of these, I was in Maradana and I in Kollupitiya. Seven cases were reported, as against 3 in the previous week. 5. Two deaths from Cholera were registered (in Fort and Galle Face), as against 4 in the previous week. No

cases were reported. One was reported in the previous week. 6. One death from Smallpox, of a passenger on board ss. Cormorant, was registered at the Infectious Diseases

Hospital, Wellawatta. One death from Beri-beri, of a passenger on board ss. City of Corinth, was registered at the General Hospital, Maradana.

7. Eleven deaths from Infantile Convulsions were registered, 10 from Enteritis, 10 from Debility, 6 from Dysentery, and 53 from Other Causes.

8. There were reported 15 cases of Chickenpox, as against 41 in the previous week; and 19 of Measles, as against

26 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80·1°, against 80·2° in the preceding week and 82·1° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.803 in., against 29.747 in. in the preceding week and 29 805 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2.35 in., against 2.20 in. in the preceding week and 2.34 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
