MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on March 18, 1916, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated March 14, 1916.

Present :—The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene; Mr. D. E. Weerasooria; Mr. C. A. LaBrooy; Dr. Allan de Saram; Mr. H. F. Tomalin; Mr. V. M. Saravanamuttu; and Mr. J. C. Ratwatte.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on February 26, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from close of 1915 to February 29, 1916, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for February.
- (d) Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of February.
- (e) The Reservoir Readings for February.

Resolved—That the statement, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during February.

4. Correspondence :—

(1) Letter No. 11 of March 7, 1916, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary *re* charge for cost of Police within the Kandy Municipal limits.

Resolved—That the letter be referred to the Special Committee appointed to consider the adequacy or otherwise of the present strength of the Police employed on Municipal duties.

(2) Letter No. 12 of March 10, 1916, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government has been pleased to sanction the expenditure of a sum of Rs. 150 towards the cost of an address of welcome to the new Governor, Sir John Anderson.—Read.

(3) Letter No. 81 of March 7, 1916, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary to the Director of Education *re* dismissal of D. V. Laurenty, teacher, Municipal school, Kandy, for the information of the Chairman.—Read.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. Beven moved—That application be made to Government to relieve the Kandy Municipal riot area from the payment of compensation for riot damages, mainly on the ground that outsiders solely were responsible for and took part in the riots. Mr. LaBrooy seconded.

The motion was put to the Meeting and lost by 7 to 2, only the mover and seconder voting for it.

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. LaBrooy moved—That this Council do place on record its appreciation of the services of the Accountant, Mr. Pereira, who is severing his connection with the Council consequent on his having secured an appointment in the Colombo Municipal Council. Mr. Weerasooria seconded—Carried.

7. Pursuant to notice Mr. LaBrooy moved—That applications be called for for the appointment of Accountant rendered vacant by the resignation of Mr. Pereira. Mr. Weerasooria seconded—The motion was carried by 6 to 3 :—

8. The report of the Special Committee appointed to consider a scheme for the collection of compensation within the Kandy Municipal area under the Riot Damages Ordinance, No. 23 of 1915.

On the Chairman's motion the Council went into Committee to consider the report.

The Chairman pointed out that the report had been signed by 4 out of the 5 Members on the Special Committee, and that Mr. Beven had dissented from the report of the majority.

The Secretary read Mr. Beven's dissent.

Letter No. 1,396 of January 31, 1916, from the Superintendent of Police, Central Province, requesting that the Police and the Special Police Officers who did duty during the riots be exempted from the payment of any compensation was also considered, but the Council did not accede to the request.

The Council resumed.

The Chairman moved—That the scheme framed by the Special Committee (Mr. Beven dissenting) be passed and be submitted for the approval of the Governor in Executive Council, as required by section 32 (2) of Ordinance No. 23 of 1915. Mr. Ratwatte seconded—The motion was carried by 7 to 2.

The Chairman moved that application be made to Government to waive the charges under section 31 (2) of Ordinance No. 23 of 1915 for the costs of suppressing the riot. Mr. Ratwatte seconded—Carried.

The Chairman moved that application be made to Government, under section 33 of Ordinance No. 23 of 1915, for a loan of Rs. 34,821.10 to be liquidated on such terms as may be agreed upon hereafter. Mr. Wijegoonewardene seconded—Carried.

9. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

Law and General Subjects.

(1) That the proposed by-law regarding regulation of foot traffic along streets be referred back to the Council for recommendation.

The Chairman moved—That the Colombo Municipal Council by-law be adopted, and that the Superintendent of Police be asked departmentally to enforce it in such streets as the Council may determine from time to time. Mr. Saravanamuttu seconded.—This was carried, Mr. LaBrooy being the only dissident.

(2) That the following by-law be adopted :—

“No person shall preach or address any assembly or crowd or hold any meeting in any street or in any open public space within the Municipal limits of Kandy, except in pursuance of a permit from the Superintendent of Police or the Chairman of the Municipal Council, and within the times and limits specified in such permit. Any person who shall commit a breach of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 20.”

Resolved—That the recommendation be adopted.

(3) That the following by-law be cancelled :—

“No motor cars, except those going out of town or coming into town or going to or from a house in Victoria Drive, shall be driven on the said drive between the hours of 4.30 P.M. and 6.30 P.M.”

Mr. LaBrooy moved—That the by-law be not cancelled. Mr. Saravanamuttu seconded—The motion was lost by 6 to 3 :—

(5) That the post of Chief Inspector be abolished, and a Revenue Inspector be appointed instead on a salary of Rs. 480 per annum rising to Rs. 1,110 per annum by increments of Rs. 60, plus a commuted travelling allowance of Rs. 480 per annum, provided the officer has a suitable vehicle.

(11) That Rs. 24.25, salary of the late cemetery keeper, Mr. C. L. Jansze, be paid to the next of kin.
