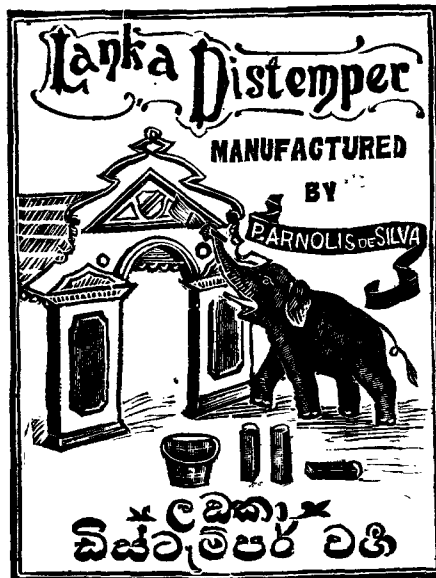

## MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

## MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on May 20, 1916, at 8:30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated May 16, 1916.

*Present* :—The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene; Mr. C. A. LaBrooy; Mr. V. M. Saravanamuttu; and Mr. J. C. Ratwatte.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on May 6, 1916, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

(a) Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from close of 1915 to April 30, 1916, on account of the Municipal Fund.

(b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.

(c) Health Officer's Report for April.

(d) Statement of Cases instituted by several Inspectors, and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of April.

(e) The Reservoir Readings for April.

Resolved—That the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during April.

4. Correspondence :—

(1) Letter No. 189 of May 8, 1916, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that the by-law regarding regulation of foot traffic along streets has been confirmed by the Governor.—Read.

It was agreed that posters be put up on the notice boards calling attention to the by-law, and that the by-law be enforced only in such streets as were decided upon in consultation with the Superintendent of Police.

(2) Letter No. 19 of May 10, 1916, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary returning draft by-law with regard to preaching in streets and stating that it should be brought into line with that of the Colombo Municipal Council.

Resolved—That the by-law be amended accordingly.

(3) Letter No. 2,299 of May 13, 1916, from the Director of Education *re* proclaiming the whole of the Municipality under the Town Schools Ordinance.—Read.

(4) Letter No. 20 of May 16, 1916, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary enclosing for observations copy of a draft Ordinance to amend "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910."

Resolved—That the draft Ordinance be approved, and that Government be asked to consider at the same time the question of amending the principal Ordinance in respect of the two following points which have been the subject of previous correspondence :—

(i.) Restoration of section 40 A of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887 regarding nominated members of a Municipal Council.

(ii.) The by-law making powers of a Municipal Council regarding by-laws for waterworks.

(5) Letter No. 157 of March 1, 1916, from the Provincial Engineer, Central Province (North), forwarding tracing showing proposed widening of Malabar street.

Resolved—That the plan be approved and the Provincial Engineer be informed that the Council is prepared to pay compensation for the land required if necessary.

5. Applications for the post of Accountant.

On the Chairman's motion the Council went into Committee.

Out of the 49 applicants the following were selected for final consideration :—Messrs. S. W. de Silva, E. B. Peiris, C. E. P. de Silva, W. E. de Pinto, and C. Pereira.

The Chairman proposed that Mr. E. B. Peiris be selected. Mr. Saravanamuttu seconded.—Carried.

The Council resumed, and it was resolved that Mr. E. B. Peiris be appointed.

6. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

*Market and Sanitation.*

(1) That Pitche and Abdeen be awarded compensation of Rs. 20 and Rs. 15, respectively, for the loss of two goats from the Municipal exposing shed.

*Finance and Assessment.*

(2) That a gratuity equal to one month's pay for each of the three children of the late Cemetery-keeper, Mr. C. Jansz, be paid to his mother, Mrs. Emily Jansz.

(3) That the Assistant to the Supervisor of Conservancy be allowed two pairs of boots a year.

(4) That the tom-tom beater be given an increase of 50 cents a month.

(5) That half the initial salary of the post of Accountant available from March 15 be divided between Messrs. S. W. de Silva and M. C. Jawad proportionately to their salaries.

(6) That Podi Singho be paid Rs. 5 as reward for giving information during the last smallpox epidemic.

*Municipal Works.*

(7) That P. N. M. Alli, the tinker, be paid the following rates until the end of the year :—New buckets, Rs. 8 each; repairs to buckets, Re. 1 each.

(8) That lamp No. 156 opposite the entrance to Lady Torrington road be kept alight all night.

(9) That the following applications for water service be allowed on usual terms :—(i.) No. 241, Colombo street, K. H. Mohamado; (ii) Nos. 223 and 224, Colombo street, Messrs. Fernando, Carwallo & Co.; (iii.) Nos. 166 and 167, Colombo street, Messrs. M. G. Aponso & Company.

(10) That the following estimate be sanctioned :—

Ward street improvements, Rs. 10,217.13.

Resolved—That the recommendations be adopted, with the exception of (10), Ward street improvements, which was to lie over.
