NOW Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in exercise of the powers vested in Us by section 6 (1) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, as from and after the date hereof, establish as a general cemetery the parcel of land called Wijemanahena, situated in the town of Rambukkana, in Kinigoda korale of Kegalla District, in the Province of Sabaragamuwa, containing in extent 3 acres 2 roods and 9 perches belonging to the Crown, and delineated as lot 2 in block survey preliminary plan 109, for the burial or cremation of the dead, within the limits of the Sanitary Board town of Rambukkana.

#### "THE RIOT DAMAGES ORDINANCE, No. 23 OF 1915."

T is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in him by "The Riot Damages Ordinance, No. 23 of 1915," has been pleased, by order in Executive Council-

- (a) To declare the wasama of Mahara in Three Korales, in the division of Panawal pattu west, in the Kegalla District of the Province of Sabaragamuwa, to be a riot area under the said Ordinance, with effect from June 7, 1915.
- (b) To direct the recovery from the persons resident and owning property in the said area of the sum of Rs. 3,250, being the amount of the riot damage, as assessed by the Special Commissioner (subject to a remission granted by way of special terms), caused in such area on or after June 2, 1915.

  (c) To exempt from liability all Europeans, Eurasians, Burghers, Moors, Malays, Tamils, and natives
- of India resident or owning property in the said area, and all persons who have made voluntary contributions to the satisfaction of the Special Commissioner, and to direct that the allotment lists be prepared accordingly.

(d) To direct that in the recovery credit shall be given for such sums as have already been paid by voluntary contributions.

(e) To declare the said sum to be a charge payable by the said administrative division.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 12, 1916.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 92 (2 Europeans, 14 Burghers, 47 Sinhalese, 10 Tamils, 11 Moors, 5 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1916, viz., 259,451) was 18.5, as against 18.3 in the preceding week, 15.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.7 the weekly average for lost year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 147 (2 Europeans, 13 Burghers, 67 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 26 Moors, 4 Malays, and 6 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29.6, as against 26.4 in the previous week, 29.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 147 total deaths, 24 were of infants under one year of age, as against 21 in the preceding week, 21 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

-The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 7.

Principal Causes of Death.—Twenty deaths from Phthisis were registered, as against 14 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 7 were in Maradana (including 5 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 5 in New Bazaar, 3 in Kotahena, 1 in Pettah, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta.

- 2. Thirteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 14 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in Kotahena, 2 in Wellawatta, 1 in Pettah, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Kollupitiya. One death from *Bronchitis* was registered.
- 3. Eight deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, as against 4 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 1 in Pettah, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in Kotahena, and 1 in Wellawatta.
- 4. Three deaths from *Plague* were registered, as against 6 in the previous week and 2 the weekly avearge for last year. Of these, 2 were in New Bazaar and 1 in Maradana. Four cases were reported, as against 9 in the previous week.
- 5. No deaths from *Measles* and *Chickenpox* were registered. One death from *Measles* was registered in the previous week. There were reported 39 cases of *Measles*, as against 47 in the previous week; and 22 of *Chickenpox*, as against 14 in the previous week.
- 6. Thirteen deaths from Enteritis were registered, 8 from Debility, 7 from Infantile Convulsions, 4 from Dysentery, 4 from Worms, 1 from Tetanus, and 65 from Other Causes.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was  $80 \cdot 7^{\circ}$ , against  $80 \cdot 3^{\circ}$  in the preceding week and  $81 \cdot 2^{\circ}$  in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was  $29 \cdot 891$  in., against  $29 \cdot 872$  in, in the preceding week and  $29 \cdot 834$  in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was  $0 \cdot 19$  in., against  $0 \cdot 53$  in. in the preceding week and  $0 \cdot 03$  in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
