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## PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

IN the Name of His Majesty GEORGE THE FIFTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir JOHN ANDERSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by Our Proclamation issued the 18th day of November, 1915, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,756 of the 19th day of November, 1915, the exportation of certain articles from Ceylon to the Netherlands was prohibited with certain limitations in pursuance of a Royal Proclamation dated the 25th day of June, 1915:

And whereas the said Proclamation was amended by Us in pursuance of an Order of the Lords in Council dated the 15th day of November, 1915, by Our Proclamation of the 7th day of January, 1916, published in *Government Gazette* No. 6,769 of the 13th day of January, 1916, by the inclusion of the item "Tobacco" among the exceptions mentioned in column 2 in the schedule attached to the said Proclamation:

And whereas the Lords in Council have by their Order made on the 4th day of July, 1916, revoked their said Order of the 15th day of November, 1915:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, in pursuance of "The Necessaries of War Exportation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1914," do hereby revoke Our said Proclamation of the 7th day of January, 1916, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,769 of the 13th day of January, 1916, and call upon His Majesty's subjects and all other persons resident in the Colony to govern themselves accordingly.

## "THE NECESSARIES OF WAR EXPORTATION ORDINANCE, NO. 19 OF 1914."

In the Name of His Majesty GEORGE THE FIFTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

## P R O C L A M A T I O N.

By His Excellency Sir JOHN ANDERSON, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the said "The Necessaries of War Exportation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1914," We did, by Our Proclamation dated the 3rd day of July, 1916, published in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,804 of the 4th day of July, 1916, prohibit the exportation from Ceylon of certain articles to the extent therein specified:

And whereas by Our Proclamation dated the 28th day of July, 1916, published in the *Government Gazette* No. 6,816 of the 4th day of August, 1916, We did make certain amendments in and additions to the schedule thereto:

Now know Ye that We, the Governor, in pursuance of the aforesaid Ordinance and of Orders of the Lords in Council dated the 28th day of June and the 4th day of July, 1916, do hereby make the following further amendments in and additions to the said schedule:—

- (1) That the following headings should be deleted:—

Woods, the following:—

- (c) Lignum vitæ.  
(c) Mahogany.

- (2) That the following headings should be added:—

- (c) Bristles.  
(A) Cape garnets or rubies.  
(A) Copper stamps used for stamping woven piece goods.  
(A) Fire bricks and fire clay.  
(c) Insulating materials, the following:—  
Leatheroid.  
Oiled cloth and tape.  
Vulcanized fibre.

- (c) Rattan, woven.  
(c) Tea.  
(c) Varnishes, spirit, containing gum.  
(A) Vinegar containing not more than 6 per cent. of acetic acid.  
(A) Vinegar essence and similar preparations containing more than 6 per cent. of acetic acid.  
(A) Wire, barbed, and galvanized wire.

(3) That the headings "(A) Bags and sacks made of jute" and "(A) Jute wrappers (Surrat taes)" should be deleted, and there be substituted therefor the heading "(A) Bags, wrappers, or sacks made of jute, other than any such bags, wrappers, or sacks as constitute the coverings of goods to be shipped for exportation, and are allowed by the Principal Collector of Customs to be shipped as such coverings."

- (4) That the following headings should be deleted:—

Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:—

- (c) Meats of all kinds (except poultry and game), not including beef and mutton, fresh or refrigerated.  
(c) Resins and resinous substances (except such as contain caoutchouc).

- (5) That the following headings should be added:—

(c) Feathers and down.  
(c) Felspar.

Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:—

- (c) Meat of all kinds, not including beef and mutton, fresh or refrigerated.  
(c) Poultry and game.  
(A) Rennet powder, rennet extract, and other preparations of rennet.  
(c) Resins, resinous substances (except such as contain caoutchouc), and articles containing resins and resinous substances.  
(c) Tobacco.

SCHEDULE.

The Maritime Rights Order in Council, 1916.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 7th day of July, 1916.

Present :

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 20th day of August, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to declare that during the present hostilities the provisions of the Declaration of London should, subject to certain additions and modifications therein specified, be adopted and put in force by His Majesty's Government :

And whereas the said Declaration was adopted as aforementioned in common with His Majesty's Allies :

And whereas it has been necessary for His Majesty and for His Allies from time to time to issue further enactments modifying the application of the articles of the said Declaration :

And whereas Orders in Council for this purpose have been issued by His Majesty on the 29th day of October, 1914, the 20th day of October, 1915, and the 30th day of March, 1916 :

And whereas the issue of these successive Orders in Council may have given rise to some doubt as to the intention of His Majesty, as also as to that of His Allies, to act in strict accordance with the law of nations, and it is therefore expedient to withdraw the said Orders so far as they are now in force :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Declaration of London Order in Council No. 2, 1914, and all Orders subsequent thereto amending the said Order are hereby withdrawn :

And His Majesty is pleased further to declare, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and it is hereby declared, that it is and always has been His intention, as it is and has been that of His Allies, to exercise their belligerent rights at sea in strict accordance with the law of nations :

And whereas on account of the changed conditions of commerce and the diversity of practice doubts might arise in certain matters as to the rules which His Majesty and His Allies regard as being in conformity with the law of nations, and it is expedient to deal with such matters specifically :

It is hereby ordered that the following provisions shall be observed :—

- (a) The hostile destination required for the condemnation of contraband articles shall be presumed to exist, until the contrary is shown, if the goods are consigned to or for an enemy authority, or an agent of the enemy State, or to or for a person in territory belonging to or occupied by the enemy, or to or for a person who, during the present hostilities, has forwarded contraband goods to an enemy authority, or an agent of the enemy State, or to or for a person in territory belonging to or occupied by the enemy, or if the goods are consigned "to order," or if the ship's papers do not show who is the real consignee of the goods.
- (b) The principle of continuous voyage or ultimate destination shall be applicable both in cases of contraband and of blockade.
- (c) A neutral vessel carrying contraband with papers indicating a neutral destination, which, notwithstanding the destination shown on the papers, proceeds to an enemy port, shall be liable to capture and condemnation if she is encountered before the end of her next voyage.
- (d) A vessel carrying contraband shall be liable to capture and condemnation if the contraband, reckoned either by value, weight, volume, or freight, forms more than half the cargo.

And it is hereby further ordered as follows :—

- (i.) Nothing herein shall be deemed to affect the Order in Council of the 11th March, 1915, for restricting further the commerce of the enemy or any of His Majesty's Proclamations declaring articles to be contraband of war during the present hostilities.
- (ii.) Nothing herein shall affect the validity of anything done under the Orders in Council hereby withdrawn.
- (iii.) Any cause or proceeding commenced in any Prize Court before the making of this Order may, if the Court thinks just, be heard and decided under the provisions of the Orders hereby withdrawn so far as they were in force at the date when such cause or proceeding was commenced, or would have been applicable in such cause or proceeding if this Order had not been made.

This Order may be cited as "The Maritime Rights Order in Council, 1916."

And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and each of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the President of the Probate, Divorce, and Admiralty Division of the High Court of Justice, all other Judges of His Majesty's Prize Courts, and all Governors, Officers, and Authorities whom it may concern, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

BY-LAWS *re* FISH STALLS.

1. Every fish stall in a Sanitary Board town in the Galle District shall be well ventilated and well lighted, and the walls thereof shall be plastered and cement washed. The floor shall be of smooth cement having a proper fall leading to a masonry drain built in cement and cement rendered, which shall empty itself into a bucket. The drain and bucket shall be washed with disinfectant at least twice a day, and the bucket shall not be allowed to overflow. The stall shall always be kept clean and free from stains of blood and dust, and the walls and floor kept in a state of repair.
2. Instead of the drain referred to in the last preceding rule, a fishmonger may use a large zinc sheet or concrete counter having a fall towards its centre, and so arranged that washings shall fall into the bucket.
3. Every table used in a fish stall shall be zinc covered or marble topped, or of other non-absorbent material. Such tables and chopping blocks and all implements shall be kept scrupulously clean. They shall be washed with water and scrubbed with a hard clean brush immediately after use. All hooks for hanging fish shall be polished and free from rust.
4. Fish baskets shall be washed daily and kept exposed to the sun and air on shelves outside the stall and not be kept inside the fish shop.
5. Every fish stall holder shall provide himself with a movable covered non-absorbent receptacle for waste materials.
6. All refuse and dirt in and about the premises of a fish stall shall be removed at least once a day, and the drains well flushed.
7. No person suffering from any loathsome, contagious, or infectious disease shall be employed in a fish stall.
8. Every fish stall and the management and the conduct of the business shall be at all times open and subject to inspection and examination by the Chairman or by any person acting under his authority.
9. A copy of these by-laws shall be framed and hung up in a prominent place in every fish stall.

## NOTICES CALLING FOR TENDERS.

**T**ENDERS are hereby invited for the work of repairing quarters at Karaitivu occupied by the officers of the Salt Department.

2. The tender should be enclosed in a sealed envelope, on the left corner of which must be written the words "Tender for repairing the Quarters at Karaitivu occupied by the Officers of the Salt Department."

3. The tender should be sent to the Assistant Government Agent, Puttalam, so that he may receive it before 1 P.M. on September 14, 1916.

4. Before sending his tender to the Assistant Government Agent, the intending tenderer should deposit a sum of Rs. 10 at any Kachcheri under the head of "Tender Forms," and should annex to his tender the receipt obtained for the deposit of the sum.

5. This sum of Rs. 10 will be held as a security for his entering into a contract with the Assistant Government Agent for carrying out the work—in the event of his tender being accepted—in a satisfactory manner; and it will be confiscated if he fails to enter into such a contract within a reasonable time after his tender was accepted.

The fences enclosing the premises should all be repaired.

Wherever necessary a new lock and key should be fixed to the door.

Wherever necessary a new door shutter should be fixed.

The white anthills in the wall of the house occupied by the Supervisor should be removed, and the defaced parts of the wall should be rebuilt. The two gable walls in Patrol Bastian's house should be pulled down and rebuilt.

A new latrine should be built adjoining the Salt Inspector's bungalow.

## VITAL STATISTICS.

### Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 26, 1916.

**Births.**—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 94 (3 Europeans, 8 Burghers, 50 Sinhalese, 13 Tamils, 18 Moors, and 2 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1916, viz., 259,451) was 18·9, as against 22·0 in the preceding week, 21·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22·7 the weekly average for last year.

**Deaths.**—The total deaths registered were 135 (1 European, 11 Burghers, 63 Sinhalese, 34 Tamils, 19 Moors, 3 Malays, and 4 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 27·2, as against 35·3 in the previous week, 23·7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25·8 the weekly average for last year.

**Infantile Deaths.**—Of the 135 total deaths, 24 were of infants under one year of age, as against 32 in the preceding week, 29 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

**Stillbirths.**—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 3.

**Principal Causes of Death.**—Twenty deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 14 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 8 were in Maradana (including 3 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 4 in Kotahena, 3 in Slave Island, 2 in San Sebastian, 2 in Wellawatta, and 1 in St. Paul's.

2. Fifteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 19 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 5 were in Kotahena, 3 in Maradana (including 1 death of a non-resident in hospital), 3 in Slave Island, 2 in New Bazaar, and 2 in Kollupitiya. One death from *Bronchitis* was registered.

3. Eight deaths from *Plague* were registered, as against 5 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in New Bazaar, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in Maradana, and 1 in Slave Island. Twelve cases were reported, as against 10 in the previous week.

4. Seven deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 10 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 3 were in Wellawatta, 2 in Maradana (including one death of a non-resident in hospital), 1 in Pettah, and 1 in Kollupitiya.

5. Two deaths from *Measles* were registered, as against 1 in the previous week. Of these, 1 was in Kotahena and the other in Maradana. Twenty-eight cases were reported, as against 29 in the previous week. There were also reported fifteen cases of *Chickenpox*, as against 18 in the previous week.

6. Ten deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 10 from *Debility*, 7 from *Infantile Convulsions*, 6 from *Worms*, 4 from *Dysentery*, 1 from *Diarrhæa*, and 44 from *Other Causes*.

**State of the Weather.**—The mean temperature of air was 79·8°, against 81·7° in the preceding week and 81·7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·852 in., against 29·891 in. in the preceding week and 29·826 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 2·48 in., against 0·05 in. in the preceding week and 0·05 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
