







The land commonly called or known as Wasgomuwamukalana, Wasgomuwadammana, Eluwanekandamukalana, Kiriebbakola, Wiratapatahamukalana, Maharatatamukalana, Pattiyadammana, Dematagalamukalana, Malagomuwakele, Ranganekele, Kotawellamukalana, Kotawellakele, Dastotakele, Bomparagalamukalana (proposed game sanctuary reserve), situated in the Meda pattu korale of the Tamankaduwa district, in the North-Central Province; containing in extent 45,820 acres 1 rood and 32 perches, shown as lot 1 in topo preliminary plan No. 6 and in the annexed diagram; and bounded as follows: on the north by the Amban-ganga; on the east by the Mahaweli-ganga; on the south by the boundary of the Central Province (the Wasgomuwa-oya); on the west by the boundary of the Central Province
