MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Chairman of the Municipal Council of Kandy will receive sealed tenders for the purchase of the under-mentioned Ferry Toll Rents of the Kandy Municipality from January 1, 1917, to December 31, 1917. The tenders, which must be in sealed envelopes, superscribed "Tender for Toll Rents," will be received at the Municipal Office until 8 A.M., on Saturday, September 16, 1916, when they will be opened, and all persons making tenders will be required to be present, and tender must be delivered in person.

2. 3.
