## MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on July 15, 1916, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated July 11, 1916.

*Present* :—The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman ; Mr. E. Beven ; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene ; Mr. C. A. LaBrooy ; Dr. Allan de Saram ; Mr. H. F. Tomalin ; Mr. V. M. Saravanamuttu ; and Mr. J. C. Ratwatte.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on June 17 having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each Member were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

(a) Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from close of 1915 to June 30, 1916, on account of the Municipal Fund.

(b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.

(c) Health Officer's Report for June.

(d) Statement of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of June.

(e) The Reservoir Readings for June.

Resolved—That the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during June.

## 4. Correspondence :—

(1) Letter of July 14, 1916, from Mr. D. E. Weerasooria resigning his office as Member for division No. 4 of the Kandy Municipality.

Mr. Beven moved—That the Council desires to place on record its appreciation of the services to the Council of Mr. D. E. Weerasooria and to thank him for the same. Mr. LaBrooy seconded—Carried unanimously.

(2) Letter No. 23 of June 13, 1916, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary *re* expenses in connection with His Excellency the Governor's visit to Kandy.—Read.

(3) Letter No. 24 of June 16, 1916, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that Government is prepared to carry out the work of widening Malabar street if the Council will pay half the estimated cost of Rs. 21,500.—Resolved that the plan of the full scheme be called for.

(4) Letter No. 25 of June 17, 1916, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that the revocation of the by-law *re* driving of motor cars on Victoria Drive, Kandy, has been confirmed.—Read.

(5) Letter No. 26 of June 19, 1916, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that the by-law with regard to preaching in streets has been confirmed.—Read.

(6) Letter No. 27 of June 22, 1916, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary approving of the provisions of "The Schools Ordinance, 1906," being brought into operation within the whole area of the Kandy Municipality.—Read.

(7) Letter No. 28 of June 26, 1916, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary approving the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 90 to the three minor children of the late Mr. C. L. Jansz, Cemetery-keeper.

(8) Endorsement No. 3 of June 27, 1916, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary *re* grant of a long service allowance to Noor Samath, late latrine conservancy kangany.

Resolved—That the resolution of March 18, 1916, be rescinded, and a gratuity of Rs. 169 awarded in accordance with the opinion of the Colonial Auditor.

(9) Letter No. 29 of July 4, 1916, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary intimating that the approval of the Legislative Council for the grant of the loan applied for under "The Riots Damages Ordinance" is not necessary.

(10) Letter No. 30 of July 4, 1916, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary fixing the strength of the Police Force to be employed for general Municipal purposes within the town of Kandy and intimating that His Excellency the Governor is unable to accept any proposal for payment of loss than the cost.

Mr. Beven moved—That in view of the fact—

(i.) That the demand for increased payment is made subsequent to the passing of the Budget ;

(ii.) That the payment as demanded is Rs. 22,023·55 in excess of that provided in the Budget ;

(iii.) That to meet the Police bills on the full cost of the Police would mean an increase in the assessment rate of 3½ per cent., thus raising the total rate in Kandy to 16½ per cent., which, with conservancy charges, is equivalent to a total rate of 21 per cent. within the conservancy area (against a total rate of only 18 per cent. in Colombo) ;

(iv.) That the Municipal Council of Colombo now contributes nothing to the cost of the Police ; and

(v.) That a rate of 16½ per cent. would include no provision for new public works ; that Government be asked to re-consider the decision that the full cost of the Police be charged for, and that a reduced payment be allowed, at any rate for the duration of the war, as has been conceded in the case of Galle. Mr. Wijegoonewardene seconded—Carried.

(11) Letter No. 213 of July 11, 1916, from the Hon. the Government Agent, Central Province, requesting remittance of a sum of Rs. 274·22 due as compensation for land to be acquired for widening Trincomalee street.

Resolved—That the amount required be voted for the purpose.

5. Petition of May 29, 1916, from M. K. A. Mohamado Muttalibo *re* encroachment opposite his new building, Nos. 180 and 181, Colombo street.—Tabled.

6. Papers *re* the appointment of Mr. K. Abdue as assistant to the Superintendent of Municipal Works.

Resolved—That the period of probation be extended to the next examination for the Surveyor-General's license in surveying and levelling.

## 7. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

*Law and General Subjects.*

(1) That the Council's lawyer be paid a fixed sum of Rs. 500 a year as his remuneration, with effect from January, 1915.

*Finance and Assessment.*

(2) That the bill of costs, Rs. 36·93, in land acquisition case No. 258, be paid. (Land acquired for a public latrine in Peradeniya road).

*Municipal Works.*

(3) That the new rickshaw stand in King street be proclaimed as required under by-law No. 254.

(4) That the following estimate be sanctioned :—

Additional night soil cart for market latrine, Rs. 722·09.

(5) That the following application for water service be allowed on usual terms :—

18, Huduhumpola, E. H. Ponniah.

Resolved—That the recommendations be adopted.

on Saturday, July 8, 1916.

THE Council met this day at 2 P.M. pursuant to notice dated July 3, 1916.

*Present* :—The Hon. Mr. R. B. Hellings, Chairman ; Mr. D. G. Goonewardena ; Mr. D. W. Subesingha ; Dr. C. B. Lourensz ; Mr. C. E. de Vos ; and Mr. E. H. Vanderstraaten.

1 The Minutes of the General Meeting of Council held on June 10, 1916, a copy of which was sent to each Councillor, were taken as read.

Resolved—That the Minutes of the General Meeting of Council of June 10, 1916, be confirmed.

2. Letter No. 13 of June 24, 1916, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary, *re* payment of allowances of Rs. 500 per annum from 1917 for the services of the Municipal Magistrate.

Laid on the table.

3 and 4. Extracts from the Minutes of the Meetings of the Standing Committees on Municipal works and regulation of markets and sanitation of July 8, 1916 :—

3.—*Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of July 8, 1916.*

(3) Applications to lay private water service to No. 113A, Circular road, and No. 29, Lighthouse street.—Approved and recommended to Council.

(4) Application to extend the present water service at No. 160, Templar's road.—Approved and recommended to Council.

(5) Papers *re* upkeep of Victoria park.—Approved the Chairman's suggestion to hand over the upkeep of the Victoria park to the Honorary Secretary of the Galle Golf Club at a cost of Rs. 50 per mensem, subject to cancellation of the arrangement on a month's notice being given by either side.

4.—*Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on the Regulation of Markets and Sanitation of July 8, 1916.*

(2) Papers *re* hand ambulance cart and first aid box returned by the Police.

Resolved—(1) That the hand ambulance cart be given in charge of the Medical Officer of the Mahamodera Hospital on the terms sanctioned by Council on October 12, 1912 ; and (2) that the first aid box be used in connection with the Fire Brigade.

(3) Tenders for sale of mutton from August 1, 1916, to December 31, 1917.

Resolved—That the tender of P. A. Vethemanickan Nader be accepted.

(4) Papers *re* upkeep of Victoria park.—Approved the Chairman's suggestion to hand over the upkeep of the Victoria park to the Honorary Secretary of the Galle Golf Club at a cost of Rs. 50 per mensem, subject to the cancellation of the arrangement on a month's notice being given by either side.

3 and 4. Resolved—That the extracts from the Minutes of the Meetings of the Standing Committees on Municipal works and the regulation of markets and sanitation be approved.

5. With the permission of Council the Chairman brought up the following subjects :—

- (1) The total collections made up to July 7, 1916, towards the first instalment of the riot compensation tax.
- (2) The visit of His Excellency the Governor to Galle on July 24, 1916.

As regards (2), the Council resolved—(1) That an address enclosed in a suitable casket be presented to His Excellency, and that the reception be held in the Pavilion ; (2) that a sum of Rs. 750 be voted towards the expenses necessary for the purpose. The Chairman undertook to draft the address and circulate it for the approval of Councillors.

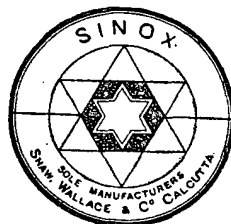

## NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

THE following Specifications have been accepted :—

"Improvements in apparatus for pressing tea leaf and like products."

*Abstract.*—The object of this invention is to provide apparatus in connection with a screw press for subjecting tea leaf and the like to a predetermined limit of pressure, and so that no more than that predetermined limit of pressure can be applied by the press. Also means is provided for discharging the leaf or the like from the press after pressing.

For limiting the pressure the apparatus consists in arranging a cylindrical or volute spring or springs (of the buffer spring type) between the top frame of the press and a flange formed at the bottom of the nut of the main screw. That nut is rotatable, and can move longitudinally in compressing the spring. The nut is described as rotated by means of a wormwheel and worm and a belt and pulley. And a bell crank lever connected to the belt shifting gear is so arranged as to be operated by contact with the flange of the nut and to shift that belt on to a loose pulley when the predetermined compression of the spring has been reached. By the same operation another belt is moved from a loose pulley on to a fixed pulley which reverses the rotation of the nut and causes the main screw and the head of the press to ascend. By adjusting the position of the fulcrum of that bell crank lever the limit of the compression of the spring and the corresponding limit of the pressure applied to the tea leaf or the like can be adjusted. Similar belt shifting gear to operate by contact with the head of the press when it reaches its uppermost position is provided to reverse again the rotation of the nut and cause the main screw and the head of the press to descend.

The compressed leaf or the like is discharged from the press by constructing the table in halves and by means of a right and left handed screw causing those two halves to move longitudinally in opposite directions to allow of the leaf to fall between into a truck or the like placed below.

The claims are :—

1. In a screw press for tea leaf and the like, automatic means substantially as described and illustrated for disconnecting the driving power at a predetermined point when pressing the leaf.
2. In a screw press for tea leaf and the like, automatic means substantially as described and illustrated for disconnecting the driving power at a predetermined point when opening the press.
3. In a screw press for tea leaf and the like, means for discharging the leaf comprising a table dividing in halves running on rollers or other antifriction devices said table forming the bottom of the pressing chamber, and a right and left handed screw shaft for opening and closing said table.
4. In a screw press for tea leaf and the like, a volute or other spring or springs arranged and applied substantially as described and illustrated and means substantially as described and illustrated for adjusting the compression of such spring or springs for the purpose of predetermining the pressure to be exerted on the leaf as set forth.

"Improvements in or relating to the treatment of timber."

*Abstract.*—This invention relates to the treatment of timber, and has particular reference to processes in which timber is seasoned and toughened by impregnating the fibres with a sugary or saccharine solution, to which a solution of a metallic salt is sometimes added.

The characteristic of the invention consists in using a "mixed" carbohydrate solution instead of only a sugary or saccharine solution with an added metallic salt. A sample of such a "mixed" carbohydrate solution suitable for use with newly felled oak or walnut wood is given as :—To an aqueous sugary or saccharine solution having a specific gravity of about 1080° is added 5 % of dextrine,  $\frac{1}{2}$  % of gum tragacanth, and 3 % of arsenic.

The Specification as accepted contains the following statement as an amendment to the original Specification left at the British Patent Office :—"In the Specification of my prior Ceylon Patent No. 935/07 a method of treating timber is described, in which the wood is immersed in an aqueous solution of a carbohydrate, such as cane or beet sugar, glucose, dextrine, molasses or the like to which has been added one or more of such substances as are suitable for seasoning or improving the quality of the wood and preserving it against fungoid growths and insect attacks, as, for example, lime, lead acetate, arsenic creosotes, boracic acid, and the like. It has been found in practice that benefits and improvements in the timber are produced if instead of using, say, a solution of sugar or of dextrine with or without the metallic salts, &c., a mixed carbohydrate solution is employed, that is, a solution which is not merely a sugary or saccharine solution, but also contains one or more other carbohydrates, such as starch, dextrine, or gum. The employment of such a "mixed" carbohydrate solution is the primary feature of the present invention."

The claims are :—

1. A process for treating timber by impregnating it with a sugary or saccharine solution also containing another carbohydrate, such as starch, dextrine, or gum.
2. A process for treating timber consisting in subjecting it to the action of a "mixed" carbohydrate solution, and then allowing it to dry or drying it artificially.
3. A solution for the treatment of timber consisting of an aqueous solution of sugar and another carbohydrate, such as starch, dextrine, or gum.
4. A solution for the treatment of timber containing sugar, dextrine, and gum tragacanth with or without the addition of arsenic substantially as specified.
5. The herein described process for the treatment of timber with a solution of mixed carbohydrates.
6. Timber treated by impregnating it with a solution of mixed carbohydrates in the manner described.
