BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. Board to keep a Register of all Dairymen and Milk Vendors.—The Board shall keep a register of the names and addresses of all dairymen and milk vendors selling or supplying milk to any person or persons resident within the limits of the Board, and of all dairy premises and milk stores used from time to time by each of them for the production, deposit, or distribution of such milk.

2. To cause Dairy Premises to be inspected.—The Board shall cause to be inspected all such dairy premises and milk stores, and the cattle, appliances, and utensils therein used for the production or distribution of milk.

3. Powers of the Government Agent to enter Dairy Premises or Milk Stores.—The Government Agent shall be at liberty to enter or authorize the entry of any person at all reasonable times into or upon any dairy premises or milk store for the purpose of making any inspection, and to take away or authorize the taking away of samples of the milk there found, and of the water of any well or other source of water supply therein or thereon, for the purposes of examination or analysis only.

4. Dairymen to keep Dairy Premises in a Sanitary Condition.—The Government Agent may require any dairyman or milk vendor, by notice in writing, to cleanse and maintain in a sanitary condition his dairy premises or milk store and any utensils therein used as aforesaid. Failure on the part of such dairyman or milk vendor to act in accordance with such notice shall constitute an offence punishable under section 107 of "The Local Boards Ordinance, 1898."

5. Dairymen to close Well, &c., if the Water is unwholesome.—The Government Agent shall require any dairyman or milk vendor, by notice in writing, to close any well or other source of water supply in or on his dairy premises or milk store, or used in connection therewith, which is so polluted or unwholesome as to be unfit for human consumption, and to wholly discontinue the use of the water thereof for any purpose whatsoever, for such period as the Government Agent shall direct, or to fill up the said well or source of water supply, and keep the same so filled up. Failure on the part of such dairymen or milk vendor to act in accordance with such notice shall constitute an offence punishable under section 107 of "The Local Boards Ordinance, 1898."

6. Dairymen and others to apply for Registration.—(a) Every dairyman and milk vendor engaged or intending to engage in the supply of milk to any person or persons within the limits of the Board shall apply to the Board to cause to be entered on the register his name and place of residence, and the situation of every dairy premises and milk store used or intended to be used by him, and thenceforward from time to time any change of such residence or discontinuance by him to use any former, or commencement by him to use any other, dairy premises or milk store.

(b) Immediately upon such registration, and whilst the same continues in force, every such dairyman and milk vendor shall in some conspicuous place affix to and maintain in legible letters his name and the words "Registered Dairyman" or "Registered Milk Vendor," as the case may be, upon every dairy premises or milk store in respect of which he is so registered, and to and upon every cart or other vehicle used by him for the distribution of milk.

7. Dairy Premises, &c., are to be kept in a Sanitary Condition.—No dairyman or milk vendor shall carry on business in any dairy premises or milk store which is in an insanitary condition, or in which the provisions for lighting, ventilation, drainage, lavatory, and privy accommodation, or water supply are not such as are necessary for health, or for the cleanliness of the appliances and utensils used therein, or for the protection of any milk therein against infection or contamination.

8. Unregistered Persons forbidden to sell Milk.—It shall not be lawful for any person to sell milk to any person or persons within the limits of the Board if his name and place of residence and dairy premises and milk store used for the purpose of the production, deposit, or distribution of any such milk are not entered upon the register of the Board.

9. Infectious Disease in Dairy Premises, &c., to be reported immediately.—On the appearance of any case of infectious disease in man or beast in any dairy premises or milk store, the occupier and also the medical practitioner attending the case shall immediately report in writing such case to the Board.

10. Dairymen to supply Names and Addresses of Customers.—Whenever it shall appear to the Government Agent, or be certified to the Board by any medical practitioner, that the spread of infectious disease is in his opinion attributable to the milk supplied by any dairyman or milk vendor, the Government Agent may require such dairyman or milk vendor wholly to discontinue such supply, distribution, and sale of milk, and furnish forthwith upon demand a full and complete list of names and addresses of all his customers, and to give such assistance to discover the residence of all or any of them as the Government Agent may deem necessary. Failure on the part of such dairyman or milk vendor to act in accordance with such notice shall constitute an offence punishable under section 107 of "The Local Boards Ordinance, 1898." 11. Persons suffering from Infectious Disease or having been recently exposed to Infection not to take part in Dairy Operations.—No person following the trade of a dairy farmer, cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or being the occupier of a milk store or milk shop, shall knowingly allow any person suffering from any infectious disease, or having recently been exposed to infection from a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk, or in any way to take part or to assist in the conduct of the trade or business of the dairy farmer, cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or occupier of any milk store or milk shop, as far as regards the production, distribution, or storage of milk, until he shall have shown to the satisfaction of the Government Agent that all danger of communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

12. Sale or Supply of unwholesome Milk forbidden.—It shall not be lawful for any person selling milk to any person or persons resident within the limits of the Board to store, keep, or deposit any milk in any room used for sleeping or dwelling in, or in any other place or way calculated to render such milk unwholesome or injurious to health, or to sell any milk which shall have been produced from any diseased animal, or which shall have been in any place or way exposed to infection from any person suffering from any infectious disease, or which shall have been upon or in any dairy premises or milk store from which the sale of milk has been directed to be discontinued on account of infectious disease as provided in section 11.

Every such claim shall be presented to the Principal Collector of Customs within six months of the last day of the period for which rebate is claimed, and only one claim for any such period will be allowed, unless the Principal Collector of Customs is satisfied that a further *bona fide* claim has been inadvertently omitted.

3. Every such claim shall be accompanied by an extract from the book kept under regulation 5 or 6, as the case may be. Where no oil is used in any month or months of the period covered by the claim, "nil" extracts for such month or months should be forwarded.

4. The Governor, on the recommendation of the Principal Collector of Customs, may appoint any person to inspect any engine described in any certificate, and to make any test or tests necessary for the verification of any statement in the certificate or extract accompanying such certificate, and the person making the claim for refund shall provide all labour, fuel, and other material necessary for the conduct of such test.

5. Any person claiming a rebate as aforesaid in the case of a stationary engine shall from day to day write in a book kept only for that purpose, in the form hereunder given, an account of the number of hours during which the engine was used in each day, and the quantity of oil consumed in such time, and shall whenever required produce such book for inspection to the Principal Collector of Customs or the person appointed under the 4th section of these rules :---

8. The Principal Collector of Customs, on being satisfied that the quantity of kerosine oil was actually used for the period stated as the source of motive power in such oil engine, shall refund the duty upon such quantity to the person claiming the refund.

9. The quantity on which rebate is claimed must be the quantity solely used for motive purposes. No rebate will be allowed on oil not used within one year of date of purchase.

10. For the purposes of the sale of kerosine oil under regulation 1, the Principal Collector of Customs shall at his discretion issue licenses to fit and proper persons desirous of selling kerosine oil. Such licenses shall be revocable at any time at the discretion of the Principal Collector.

11. If a licensed vendor is the owner of one or more oil engines or motor vehicles, he shall keep a register showing the daily receipts and issues of kerosine oil from his store in a form to be prescribed by the Principal Collector of Customs, and such register shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection by the Principal Collector of Customs, or by any person authorized by the Principal Collector of Customs.

Note.—(a) The definition of kerosine oil for the purpose of these regulations includes petrol and is as follows (vide section 2 of Ordinance No. 26 of 1916) :—

"Kerosine oil " shall include the liquids commonly known by the names of rock oil, Rangoon oil, Burma oil, kerosine, petroleum, paraffin oil, mineral oil, petroline, gasoline, benzol, benzoline, benzine, and any liquid that is made from petroleum, coal, schist, peat, or any other bituminous substance, or from any products of petroleum with a flashing point of less than 150° F., and any inflammable hydrocarbon (including any mixture of hydrocarbon and any liquid containing hydrocarbon) which is capable of being used for providing reasonably efficient motive power for a motor car.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended October 7, 1916.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 111 (1 European, 14 Burghers, 53 Sinhalese, 22 Tamils, 17 Moors, 3 Malays, and 1 Other). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1916, viz., 259,451) was 22.4, as against 18.7 in the preceding week, 23.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22.7 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 142 (1 European, 8 Burghers, 68 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 27 Moors, 4 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 28.6, as against 29.4 in the previous week, 25.5 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 142 total deaths, 24 were of infants under one year of age, as against 31 in the preceding week, 20 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths .- The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

Principal Causes of Death.—Eighteen deaths from Phthisis were registered, as against 14 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 3 were in St. Paul's, 3 in Kotahena, 3 in Maradana, 2 in San Sebastian, 2 in New Bazaar, 2 in Slave Island, 1 in Fort and Galle Face, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta.

2. Thirteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, as against 19 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 6 were in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 2 in New Bazaar, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in St. Paul's, 1 in Kotahena, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatte. Three deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered.

3. Ten deaths from *Plague* were registered, as against 8 in the previous week and 2 the weekly avearge for last year. Of these, 5 were in St. Paul's, 2 in Maradana, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in Kotahena, and 1 in New Bazaar. Nine cases were reported, as against 8 in the previous week.

4. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, as against 5 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 1 was in Kotahena, 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in Kollupitiya.

5. Three deaths from *Measles* were registered, as against 1 in the previous week. Of these, 2 were in New Bazaar and 1 in Kotahena. Thirty-seven cases were reported, as against 23 in the previous week.

6. Fourteen deaths from Infantile Convulsions were registered, 11 from Enteritis, 8 from Debility, 4 from Dysentery, 3 from Worms, 2 from Diarrhea, 1 from Tetanus, and 49 from Other Causes.

7. There were reported 2 cases of *Chickenpox*, as against 4 in the previous week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was $80 \cdot 2^{\circ}$, against $80 \cdot 7^{\circ}$ in the preceding week and $81 \cdot 8^{\circ}$ in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was $29 \cdot 854$ in., against $29 \cdot 871$ in. in the preceding week and $29 \cdot 831$ in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was $0 \cdot 35$ in., against $1 \cdot 20$ in. in the preceding week and $0 \cdot 02$ in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
