Convention between the United Kingdom and the United States of America relative to the disposal of Real and Personal Property.

Şigned at Washington, March 2, 1899.

[Ratifications exchanged at Washington, July 28, 1900.]

HER Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the United States of America, desiring to improve the condition of the subjects and citizens of each of the respective countries in relation to the tenure and disposition of real and personal property situated, or being within, the territories of the other,

as well as to authorize the representation of deceased persons by the Consuls of their respective nations in the settlement of estates, have resolved to conclude a Convention for those purposes, and have named as their

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, the Right Honourable Sir Julian Pauncefote, Knight Grand Cross of the Orders of the Bath and of St. Michael and St. George, Ambassador

Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Great Britain;

And the President of the United States of America, the Honourable John Hay, Secretary of State of the United States of America;

Who, having exchanged their said full powers, found in due and proper form, have agreed to and signed the following Articles :-

ARTICLE I.

Where, on the death of any person holding real property (or property not personal), within the territories of one of the Contracting Parties, such real property would, by the laws of the land, pass to a subject or citizen of the other, were he not disqualified by the laws of the country where such real property is situated, such subject or citizen shall be allowed a term of three years in which to sell the same, this term to be reasonably prolonged if circumstances render it necessary, and to withdraw the proceeds thereof without restraint or interference, and exempt from any succession, probate, or administrative duties or charges other than those which may be imposed in like cases upon the subjects or citizens of the country from which such proceeds may be drawn.

ARTICLE II.

The subjects or citizens of each of the Contracting Parties shall have full power to dispose of their personal property within the territories of the other by testament, donation, or otherwise; and their heirs, legatees, and dones, being subjects or citizens of the other Contracting Party, whether resident or non-resident, shall succeed to their said personal property, and may take possession thereof either by themselves, or by others acting for them, and dispose of the same at their pleasure, paying such duties only as the citizens or subjects of the country where the property lies shall be liable to pay in like cases.

ARTICLE III.

In case of the death of any subject of Her Britannic Majesty in the United States, or of any citizen of the United States of America in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, without having, in the country of his decease, any known heirs or testamentary executors by him appointed, the competent local authorities shallat once inform the nearest Consular officer of the nation to which the deceased person belonged of the circumstance, in order that the necessary information may be immediately forwarded to persons interested.

The said Consular officer shall have the right to appear, personally or by delegate, in all proceedings on behalf

of the absent heirs or creditors until they are otherwise represented.

ARTICLE IV.

The stipulations of the present Convention shall not be applicable to any of the Colonies or foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty unless notice to that effect shall have been given, on behalf of any such Colony or foreign possession, by Her Britannic Majesty's representative at Washington to the United States' Secretary of State within one year from the date of the exchange of the ratifications of the present Convention.

It is understood that, under the provisions of this Article, Her Majesty can in the same manner give notice of adhesion on behalf of any British Protectorate or sphere of influence, or on behalf of the Island of Cyprus, in

virtue of the Convention of the 4th June, 1878, between Great Britain and Turkey.

The provisions of this Convention shall extend and apply to any territory or territories pertaining to or occupied and governed by the United States beyond the seas only upon notice to that effect being given by the Representative of the United States at London, by direction of the Treaty-making power of the United States.

ARTICLE V.

In all that concerns the right of disposing of every kind of property, real or personal, subjects or citizens of each of the High Contracting Parties shall, in the dominions of the other, enjoy the rights which are or may be accorded to the subjects or citizens of the most favoured nation.

ARTICLE VI.

The present Convention shall come into effect ten days after the day upon which the ratifications are exchanged, and shall remain in force for ten years after such exchange. In case neither of the High Contracting Parties shall have given notice to the other twelve months before the expiration of the said period of ten years of the intention to terminate the present Convention, it shall remain in force until the expiration of one year from the day on which either of the High Contracting Parties shall have given such notice.

Her Britannic Majesty or the United States shall also have the right separately to terminate the present Convention at any time, on giving twelve months' notice to that effect in regard to any British Colony, foreign possession, or dependency, as specified in Article IV., which may have acceded thereto.

ARTICLE VII.

The present Convention shall be duly ratified by Her Britannic Majesty and by the President of the United States, by and with the approval of the Senate thereof, and the ratifications shall be exchanged in London or in Washington.

In faith whereof We, the respective Plenipotentiaries, have signed this Treaty, and have hereunto affixed Our Seals.

WHEREAS His Majesty King Edward the Seventh did by a Warrant under His Royal Sign Manual, bearing date at His Court at Saint James's, the Seventh day of July, One thousand Nine hundred and Nine, institute and create a new medal to be styled the King's Police Medal:

Now, therefore, We do by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs, and Successors abrogate so much of the fifth clause of the said Warrant as ordains that the riband by which the medal is suspended should be dark blue with a narrow silver stripe on either side, and in lieu thereof We ordain that the riband shall be dark blue with a narrow silver stripe on either side and a similar silver stripe in the centre.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's, the Third of October. One thousand Nine hundred and Sixteen, in the Seventh Year of Our Reign.

(6) Servants of the contractor will be provided with suitable quarters with water supply in the camp at a rent of 4 per cent. on the capital cost of the building. They will be entitled to medical advice at the rates shown in rule 3 of the rules published in the Government Gazette No. 6,816 of August 4, 1916, under the Medical Wants Ordinance, No. 9 of 1912. Drugs will be supplied at cost prices. (7) Water laid on and supplied free.

(8) Approved utensils for the transport and distribution of diets to be supplied by the contractors.

(9) Samples of rice, sugar, ghee, dhall, and pepper to be supplied with the tender.

(B) The supply of travelling diets to all estate coolies on their departure from the camp to Ceylon. A diet sheet will be supplied with the form of tender. (C) The supply of tin plates to all estate coolies and 3rd

class passengers.

- (10) Sample plates with their respective rates must accompany each tender. They must not be less than 7 in. diameter at the bottom and 2 in. in depth.
 - (D) The supply of cloths to all estate coolies.
- (11) Sample materials (cloths for men. women, boys, and girls) with a statement showing the respective sizes and rates must accompany each tender.
- (E) The privilege of selling tea, coffee, fruits, tobacco, betel, milk, aerated waters, and other sundry provisions at authorized rates to the inmates of the camp.
- (12) Schedule of rates and amount tendered should be stated.

(13) For further particulars apply to the Chairman, Plague Committee, Colombo.

(14) All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Office of the Controller of Revenue, Colombo.

(15) Tenders should be deposited in the tender box in the Office of the Controller of Revenue, or be sent through the post.

(16) Tenders should be marked "Tender for Supplies to Mandapam Camp" in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Office of the Controller of Revenue not later than midday, January 16, 1917.

(17) Tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the Office of the Chairman, Plague Committee (H. M. Customs, Colombo), and no tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. Alterations must be initialled, otherwise the tenders may be treated as informal and rejected.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 16, 1916.

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Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 121 (8 Burghers, 72 Sinhalese, 10 Tamils, 24 Moors, 2 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1916, viz., 259,451) was 24·4, as against 27·2 in the preceding week, 23·7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 22·7 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 154 (1 European, 7 Burghers, 76 Sinhalese, 24 Tamils, 27 Moors, 5 Malays, and 14 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 31.0, as against 25.4 in the previous week, 19.3 in the corresponding week of last year, and 25.8 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 154 total deaths, 31 were of infants under one year of age, as against 30 in the preceding week, 16 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 6.

Principal Causes of Death.—Twenty-five deaths from Pneumonia were registered, as against 15 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 6 were in Maradana, 6 in Slave Island, 5 in Kotahena, 3 in St. Paul's, 1 in Pettah, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in New Bazaar, 1 in Kollupitiya, and 1 in Wellawatta. Two deaths from Bronchitis were registered.

- 2. Thirteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 14 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 4 were in Maradana (including 2 deaths of non-residents in hospitals), 3 in Kotahena, 2 in St. Paul's, 1 in Pettah, 1 in San Sebastian, 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in Wellawatta.
- 3. Four deaths from *Plague* were registered, as against 6 in the previous week and 2 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2 were in Maradana, 1 in Pettah, and 1 in St. Paul's. Seven cases were reported, same as in the previous week.
- 4. Four deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, as against I in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 2 were in Wellawatta, 1 in Kotahena, and 1 in Slave Island.
- 5 Two deaths from *Measles* were registered in Maradana; none were registered in the previous week. There were reported 40 cases of *Measles*, same as in the previous week; and 20 cases of *Chickenpox*, as against 17 in the previous week.
- 6. Eleven deaths from Infantile Convulsions were registered, 10 from Debility, 7 from Enteritis, 5 from Worms, 2 from Tetanus, 1 from Dysentery, and 68 from Other Causes.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 78.7°, against 79.3° in the preceding week and 79.0° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.886 in., against 29.864 in. in the preceding week and 29.872 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 1.70 in., against 0.28 in. in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.
