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### PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of His Majesty GEORGE THE FIFTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir John Anderson, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

Requiring Returns to be made of Property in Enemy Territory belonging to British Subjects resident in Ceylon and Claims by such British Subjects against Enemy Persons and Enemy Governments.

### JOHN ANDERSON.

THEREAS in the interests of the British Empire it is of great importance that full information should be obtained with regard to property in enemy territory belonging to British subjects, and also with regard to the claims of British subjects against enemy persons and enemy Governments:

And whereas for the purpose of obtaining that information it is necessary that returns of such property and o claims should be made by British subjects to the officers appointed to receive the same:

Now, therefore, by command of His Majesty, We strictly command and enjoin all British subjects within the Colony of Ceylon who are entitled to property of any description whatsoever in enemy territory or to any interest in such property or have claims against enemy persons or enemy Governments, forthwith to make returns of their said property or claims to the officer in Ceylon appointed to receive the same:

Provided that it shall not be necessary to make such returns respecting property or claims, whereof returns have before the date of this Proclamation been voluntarily made to such officer as aforesaid in the form prescribed by him.

The officer appointed to receive such returns shall be the Custodian of Enemy Property, Office of the Controller of Revenue, Colombo.

The said returns shall be made in such form and with such particulars as the Custodian of Enemy Property may require.

For the purposes of this Proclamation :-

The expression "property" includes documents of title to property; the expression "enemy territory" means the territory of any State at war with His Majesty (including the Colonies and Dependencies thereof); they expression "enemy persons" includes all persons, firms, companies, and corporations residing or carrying on business in enemy territory; the expression "enemy Government" means the Government of tany State at war with His Majesty.

And We the said Governor do hereby proclaim that the above commands and injunctions are in force in the Colony of Ceylon as from the date hereof, and We do hereby require all His Majesty's subjects in the said Colony to take note thereof and to govern themselves accordingly:

And We do further give notice that all persons failing to comply with the above Proclamation will be liable to all such penalties and disabilities as may be hereafter prescribed in that behalf.

Given at Nuwara Eliya, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-sixth day of December, in the Year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Sixteen.

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NOW Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in the exercise of the powers vested in Us by "The Police Ordinance, 1865" (as amended by "The Police (Amendment) Ordinance, No. 39 of 1916"), and in pursuance of the necessary determinations and appointments made under section 34 of the said Ordinance, do hereby declare that for the purpose of the tax payable under the said section in respect of the expenses of the police payable by the town of Kurunegala (as defined by the Proclamation dated March 17, 1905, and published in the Government Gazette No. 6,045 of March 24, 1905), We do appoint the percentage of 3½ per cent. as the percentage payable as from the date hereof on the bona fide annual value of the houses, buildings, lands, and tenements liable under the said section, subject to the exceptions in the said section contained.

TENDERS are hereby invited for the removal of 40,000 cwt., more or less, at 10,000 cwt. per mensem, of salt lying at the Bundala Lewaya into Hambantota Stores.

2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the Assistant Government Agent, Hambantota.

3. The duplicate of tender should be posted by the tenderer to the Hon. the Controller of Revenue at the same time as he forwards the original to the Assistant Government Agent.

4. Tenders should be marked "Tender for removal of Salt" in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Office of the Assistant Government Agent not later than midday on January 19, 1917.

5. The tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the Hambantota Kachcheri, and no tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form.

6. A deposit of Rs. 20 will be required to be made either at the Treasury Office, Tangalla, or any Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for the same before any from of tender is issued. Should any person decline to enter into the contract and bond, or fail to furnish approved security, within ten days of receiving notice in writing from the Head of the Department, or his duly authorized representative, that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown. All other deposits will be returned upon signature of a contract.

7. Each tender must be accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given, engaging to become security for the due fulfilment of the contract.

8. Sufficient sureties will be required to join in a bond for the due fulfilment of each contract. The amount of security required will be Rs. 1,000. All other necessary information can be ascertained upon application at the office referred to in section 5.

9. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

TENDERS are invited for the conveyance of mails for three years from October 1, 1917, by motor conveyance as under, between Panadure, Bandaragama, and Horana Post Offices:—

- (a) Once daily each way.
- (b) Twice daily each way.
- 2. Separate tenders are invited for services (a) and (b).
- 3. The nature of the motor conveyance proposed should be stated, i.e., lorry, van, coach, car, or motor cycle and side car.
- 4. The hours of arrival and departure of the conveyances to be fixed from time to time by the Postmaster-General.

5. The contractor will be required to provide such number of conveyances as will, in the opinion of the Postmaster-General, be necessary for the services, and every such conveyance, before being employed in the service, will be subject to the approval of the Postmaster-General.

 The contractor will be required to provide extra conveyances at all times when necessary to meet the exigencies of the mail service without any charge.

7. Tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the Postmaster-General. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box in the Office of the Postmaster-General, or be sent to him through the post.

8. Tenders should be marked "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails between Panadure and Horana" in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Office of the Postmaster-General not later than midday on Tuesday, January 30, 1917.

9. Tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application to the Postmaster-General, and no tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form.

10. Any alteration in a tender must bear the initials of the tenderer, otherwise the tender may be treated as informal and rejected.

11. A deposit of Rs. 50 must be made with the Postmaster-General, and a receipt produced for the same before a tender form is issued. Should any person decline to enter into the contract and bond, or fail to furnish approved security, within ten days of receiving notice in writing from the Postmaster-General, or his duly authorized representative, that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown. All other deposits will be returned upon signature to the contract.

12. Security to the amount of one-tenth of the annual subsidy asked will be required in cash for each service.

13. Tenders for the above services, in the cases of cars and coaches, must be accompanied by a scale of the rates which it is intended to charge the public during the period of the service for the conveyance of passengers and luggage and parcels, and the quantity of luggage per passenger allowed to be conveyed free. When such scale has been accepted by Government, the contractor shall not, without the express permission of Government, increase the rates charged for the conveyance of passengers, luggage, and parcels above the amount shown in the scale, or reduce the allowance of free luggage below the amount therein stated.

14. The contract cannot be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Tender Board.
