"Improvements in rain shields for rubber trees and the like."

Abstract.—The invention consists of two parts: a collar and an apron. Both collar and apron are formed out of sheet metal of any suitable kind. The collar is formed from a rectangular sheet by folding it lengthwise along the longitudinal centre line and slitting the edges to enable it to be bent round the tree, to which it is secured by wires attached to its ends. Some or all of the outer downwardly hanging sections formed by the slits are bent outwards and upwards to form hooks on which the apron is suspended. The apron is formed from a rectangular sheet by folding over one edge after it has been slit at that edge to enable it to be bent round the tree, to which it is attached by wires as in the case of the collar, and hooked on to the collar by means of the downwardly hanging sections formed by the slits, which are folded inwards for the purpose.

The claims are:

1. In rain shields for rubber trees and the like a collar made of a strip of metal folded, split, and hooked, and bent round the tree and fastended by wires, substantially as hereinbefore described and illustrated by figures 1, 2, 3, 4, and 8.

In rain shields for rubber trees and the like a metal apron folded, split, and bent round the tree and fastened by wires, substantially as hereinbefore described and illustrated by figures 5, 6, 7, 9, and 10.

In rain shields for rubber trees and the like a collar or cowl as described in claim (1) and an apron as claimed in claim (2) in combination, substantially as hereinbefore described and illustrated by figures 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, and 10. Five sheets of drawings.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on September 16, 1916, at 8.30 a.m., in accordance with Notice dated September 12, 1916.

Present: The Hon. Mr. C. S. Vaughan, Chairman; Mr. E. Beven; Mr. E. L. Wijegoonewardene; Mr. C. A. LaBrooy; Dr. Allan de Saram; Mr. H. F. Tomalin; Mr. V. M. Saravanamuttu; and Mr. L. H. S. Pieris.

- 1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on August 19, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

 - (b) Progress Report of Works brought up to the same date.

 - (e) The Reservoir Readings for August.

Resolved—That the statement (a), together with the minutes of proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the Government Gazette.

- , (1) Letter No. 33 of September 4, 1916, from the Hon. the Colonial Secretary stating that no provision for the construction of a branch Post Office at Kandy has been included in the Estimates for 1916-17.

Resolved—That inquiry be made as to whether the estimate for the proposed Post Office has been prepared by the Public Works Department.

- (2) Letter No. 262 of August 19, 1916, from the Hon. the Government Agent, Central Province, asking the Council to nominate an Unofficial Member of Council as a representative on the Excise Advisory Committee for the Kandy Municipal area for the next Financial year.
 - Mr. Beven proposed that Mr. LaBrooy be nominated. Dr. de Saram seconded.
 - Mr. Wijegoonewardene proposed that Mr. Pieris be nominated. Mr. Saravanamuttu seconded.
 - The amendment was put to the meeting and lost.
 - The original motion was then put and declared carried.
- (3) Letter No. 2,444 of August 17, from the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, intimating that in the next issue of the Railway Time Tables it is proposed to convey passengers of all classes by the Up and Down Night Mails similar to the old arrangements.—Read.
- (4) Letter of September 2, 1916, from the "Touring Electric Bioscope Company" applying for the use of a site on the Victoria Esplanade for about a month for their Bioscope show.

Resolved—That the application be declined and that the applicant be offered a site on the Bogambara recreation ground on usual terms.

5. Papers re grant of a gratuity to Noor M. Samath, late latrine conservancy kangany.

Resolved—That the gratuity of Rs. 169 recommended at the July meeting of Council be altered to Rs. 197.70 in accordance with the computation furnished by the Colonial Auditor.

6. Recommendations of Standing Committees:-

Law and General Subjects.

(1) That the cancellation of vehicle licenses be withdrawn, if the vehicles are fit for use, on payment of the following fines by the licensees:—

For every rickshaw, Re. 1; for every vehicle other than a rickshaw, Rs. 2.50.

(2) That the fee for a tomb 9 feet by 4 feet be fixed at Rs. 50, and in proportion for additional space.

Municipal Works.

- (3) That a water service be allowed on usual terms to No. 5, Peradeniya road, M. de Fonseka (lessee). Resolved—That the recommendations be adopted.
- 7. Papers re proposed parapet wall over the existing stone wall in front of Dharamarajah College.
- Mr. Tomalin submitted the three following designs, all of which are architecturally correct for the proposed wall:-
- Type No. 1.—After the style of the Demala-Maha-Seya at Polonnaruwa.
- Type No. 2.—After the style of the Hetadage at Polonnaruwa.
- Type No. 3.—After the style of the Watadage at Polonnaruwa.

The three designs were approved and it was resolved that the Principal be asked to choose any one of them, the Council being in favour of Type No. 1 if he had no preference for any one design.

It was also resolved that Mr. Tomalin be thanked for the trouble he had taken in preparing the designs.
