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### NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906."

THE following Specifications have been accepted:—

"An improvement in tapping tools for cutting and shaving bark from rubber trees and the like."

**Abstract.**—The form of the blade of this tapping tool is of an ordinary push cut type, namely, of the flat type with flanged edges; but the tapping tool is characterized by the fact that the flanged edges are additional cutting edges and do not form, by projecting them beyond the cutting edge, guards for regulating the thickness of shaving. The regulation of the thickness of shaving is provided for by a T-shaped additional member projecting beyond the cutting edges of the blade: adjustable by slots in regard to the extent of its forward projection, and adjustable in regard to the distance of its under surface from the plane of the cutting edges of the blade, by inserting washers or metal slips or strips between it and the shank of the tool, to which it is fixed by bolts passing through the slots and so regulating the thickness of shaving that is cut by the forward flat cutting edges. There is no adjustment of the thickness of shaving cut by the flanged cutting edges which is regulated only by the width of the projecting T-headed guard.

The claims are:—

1. In tapping tools for rubber trees and the like, a guard characterized by two projecting horns, and a guard holder provided with slotted holes to attach the guard of the blades of tapping tools, the horns of the guard can be placed parallel to but not on the same plane as the cutting edges of the blades, substantially as illustrated in the attached sheet of drawings.

2. In tapping tools for rubber trees and the like, a blade characterized by two sets of cutting edges, each set at right angles to the other, the blade arranged to be fastened to a holder by one bolt, substantially as illustrated in the attached sheet of drawings.

3. In tapping tools for rubber trees and the like, a guard characterized by claim in claim 1 and a blade as characterized in claim 2 in combination, the underside of the projecting horns of the guard and the underside of the cutting edges of the blade being parallel but not in the same plane, thereby an adjustment of the cutting depth is possible by introducing metal slips between guard holder and blade, substantially as illustrated in the attached sheet of drawings.

"Improvements to friction pads and rollers for the carriers of aerial ropeways."

**Abstract.**—This invention relates to improvements in the means of obtaining sufficient frictional adhesion between the carrier and the moving rope of an aerial ropeway. Unless that frictional adhesion is sufficient, the loaded carrier hung on the moving rope may fail to travel with the rope up an incline, or may slip down an incline. Pairs of pads or pairs of rollers, more or less gripping the rope and that will not slip are accordingly provided to rest on the travelling rope and carry the travelling load.

Various designs of rollers and pads to exemplify the invention are described and illustrated, and the materials used and the manufacture by winding and assembling the parts under heat and pressure and impregnating with a waterproof binding substance for the purpose of obtaining a high coefficient of friction are described and claimed. A waterproofing binding mixture for impregnating the materials is specified.

The materials are specified in the claims.

The claims are:—

1. In friction pads and rollers for the carriers of aerial ropeways, winding at a suitable tension, tape or string of coir, hemp, jute, cotton, or other suitable fibrous materials, into the form of a friction pad or roller, said tape or string and the interspaces in the windings being impregnated with a waterproof, tough binding substance, substantially as described for the purpose of giving a high coefficient of friction to the pad or roller when lying on the wire rope.

2. In friction pads and rollers for the carriers of aerial ropeways, assembling under pressure or pressure and heat, pieces or discs manufactured from fibrous fabric or from paper, cardboard, tuckite, linoleum, waterproofed leather or other suitable material in a perforated or unperforated state, substantially as described and illustrated, such pieces or discs being impregnated or treated with a waterproof, tough binding substance as in claim 1 for the purpose of giving a high coefficient of friction to the rollers or pad when it lies on the wire rope.

3. In friction pads and rollers for the carriers of aerial ropeways, a washer or disc, made from hard material, having a deeply nicked or serrated outside circumferential edge and used to project the ends of the pads and rollers (used on the carriers of aerial ropeways) from deformation, substantially as described.
