MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, October 6, 1916.

THE Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated September 29, 1916.

Present:—Mr. R. W. Byrde, Chairman; Mr. C. P. Dias; Major A. W. de Wilton; Mr. L. B. Fernando; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Mr. Arthur Alvis; Mr. H. L. de Mel; Mr. E. G. Jayewardene; Dr. D. P. Banajee; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. W. P. Rodrigo; Mr. J. A. Perera; Mr. T. L. Villiers; Mr. F. R. Senanayake; the Hon. Dr. G. J. Rutherford; Mr. W. C. S. Ingles; and Mr. Geo. Waddell.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of September 1 and of the Special General Meeting of September 14, 1916, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of September 1 and of the Special General Meeting of September

2. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman read the following:-

There have been 24 further cases of human plague and 4 cases of rat plague, bringing the totals for the year up to 216 human and 50 rat cases. The corresponding totals for last year were 76 human and 48 rat cases, while in the preceding year there were 333 cases of human plague. Of the 24 human cases 15 were bubonic and 9 spticcemic in character. All proved fatal except one bubonic case.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene asked the Chairman what decision has been arrived at with regard to the powers of this Council to regulate the price of beef and mutton in the private markets at Slave Island, licenses for which have been applied for by K. M. Mohideen Mastan and others.

The Chairman replied that a decision has not yet been arrived at. The question is a difficult one and is still under consideration of the Committees.

4. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. V. Ratnam asked the Chairman whether there is any truth in the report which appeared in the issue of the "Ceylon Independent" of the 14th ultimo that actions instituted against three coolies, named Kona Santa Crusy Fernando, Mayandi, and Stephen Fernando, employed under a stevedore for non-payment of Riot Tax.

were withdrawn and the coolies released, and, if so, under what circumstances?

The Chairman replied that the actions against these three coolies were withdrawn on his instructions, on it being represented to him that they were coolies employed in the Harbour. He mentioned that it was apprehended at one time that the work in the Harbour might be seriously affected. Therefore, in order that no cause for a panic might arise among the coolies employed there, it was arranged that cases should not be instituted against such coolies, but that their names should be noted and sent to the employer. The cases against these men were instituted through a mistake.

5. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. V. Ratnam asked the Chairman whether a man by the name of Santha Anthe, son of Tommay Juanay Fernando, also employed in the Harbour, was arrested on the 11th ultimo and fined Rs. 10, or a month's imprisonment?

The Chairman replied that he found that Santha Anthe, son of Tommay Juanay Fernando was arrested and fined Rs. 10, or a month's imprisonment, on the 11th September. If it had been brought to his notice that he was employed in the Harbour, he would have had the case withdrawn.

- 6. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved that Mr. Geo. Waddell be elected a Member of the following Special Committees, in place of the Hon. Mr. T. H. Chapman, resigned:—Municipal Commission Committee; Establishment Committee; Drainage Committee. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.
- 7. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved for a statement showing the number of notices served on the ratepayers of this City to fix push-taps in place of bib-taps from July 1, 1916, to September 30, 1916, the statement to give the following particulars:—

Mr. J. A. Perera seconded the motion, and in the course of his remarks, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo rose to a point of order as to whether the seconder was in order in criticizing the work of the Waterworks Engineer when the motion was for a statement.

The Chairman directed Mr. Perera to confine himself to the terms of the motion, and Mr. Perera continued his remarks.

The Chairman explained that the statement had been prepared by the Waterworks Engineer and was ready. It would be circulated to members. There had been no unusual activity in this direction on the part of the Waterworks Engineer, but he was merely pursuing his policy to prevent waste. It is necessary to look ahead and to educate the population with a view to prevent waste, so that the supply which is at present adequate may meet the increased consumption of the future. The question of the "push tap" and the "bib tap" and the height of the tap may be discussed by the Standing Committee on Municipal Works to whom he would refer it.—Carried.

8. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. G. Jayewardene moved to invite the attention of the Chairman to the confiscation and sale of the goods of basket women who are prosecuted in the Municipal Court for obstruction by exposing their wares for sale on the side of the streets, such confiscation and sale being in addition to the fines imposed on them. Mr. F. R. Senanayake seconded.

Mr. C. P. Dias, Mr. J. A. Perera, and Mr. Arthur Alvis supported the motion. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo and Mr. T. L.

Villiers also spoke to the motion.

The Chairman explained that these cases were not instituted by the Municipal Officers, but by the Police, and that he would see the Superintendent of Police, Colombo, on the subject. He further stated that he could not interfere with the decisions of the Municipal Magistrate, but as Mayor of the City he would see what could be done to prevent any hardship.

The motion was put to the meeting and declared carried.

9. The Chairman moved, with the leave of the Council, that the matter of the appointment of a Superintendent for the Filtration Works at Labugama be considered. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

Mr Arthur Alvis moved that the recommendation of the Waterworks Engineer, namely, that Mr. Y. S. David be appointed to the post, be adopted. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do go into Committee to consider items Nos. 10 to 12 on the agenda. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.—Carried.

10-12. The following extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committees on Finance and Law and General Subjects (meeting together), extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works, and of the Standing Committee on Finance, having been previously printed and circulated, were laid before the Council in Committee.

Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Law and General Subjects (meeting together) of August 25, 1916.

(2) To consider the question of the refund of rents to A. L. Sheik Ismail.—The majority of the Committees is of opinion that there should not be a refund of the rents. Four Members voted against a refund and two for it.

Resolution of Council of September 1, 1916.

With reference to the above item, Dr. E. V. Ratnam moved that the papers be circulated and that the consideration of the matter be deferred. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo seconded.—Carried.

Mr. Arthur Alvis moved that the recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted, viz., that there should not be a refund of the rents. Mr. L. B. Fernando seconded.

Mr. J. A. Perera and Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader opposed the motion. Dr. Rodrigo supported the motion.

The Chairman explained the circumstances of the case and cited the law affecting the case.

The Chairman put the motion to the meeting and declared it carried, 12 voting for it and 5 against.

- (7) To recommend the acceptance of the estimate of Rs. 1,325 from Messrs. Walker, Sons & Co., Ltd., for the supply and erection of a Petter Oil Engine, 3½ to 5 H. P., for Coagulant Feed Apparatus at Labugama.—Recommended.
- (10) To recommend the adoption of an amended estimate of Rs. 26,500 showing an increase of Rs. 4,914·15 for Front street improvements, making provision for a double track instead of a single track for which the original estimate was sanctioned.—Recommended.

Resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance of September 29, 1916.

(2) To consider a petition from the daily-paid Conservancy Overseers.—It is recommended that a rate of Re. 1 40 per diem be provided in the next Budget.

(3) To consider the question of training drivers for the new Motor Fire Tender, now on order for the Fire Brigade.—Recommended that a fee of Rs. 40 for each man be paid to Mr. T. W. Collette for the training of the men, and that the payment be made from Vote G. 9. (Motor 1st aid Hose Escape Tender.)

(6) To recommend the transfer of a sum of Rs. 94 from G. 2 (allowances) to G. 1 (salaries) to meet the acting pay of Mr. H. R. Pentin, the Acting Superintendent of the Fire Brigade, from September 23 to December 31, 1916.—Recommended.

(8) To consider the Colonial Auditor's Report for the financial period of six months ending December 31, 1915, and the Acting Financial Assistant's comments thereon.—Considered. To be submitted to Council.

(9) To recommend the sale by public auction of premises No. 26-3 Skinner's road south, vested in the Council.— Recommended that the property be put up for sale by public auction at an upset price of Rs. 4,000.

(10) To recommend the re-transfer to L. Don Marthelis of premises No. 634-12A, Timbirigasyaya, vested in the Council.—Recommended.

(11) To recommend the transfer of a sum of Rs. 500 from vote D. 16 (store expenses) to D. 13 (tin plates, badges, &c.), to meet enhanced cost due to the war.—Recommended.

(15) To recommend the acceptance of the estimate of Rs. 1,325 from Messrs. Walker, Sons & Co., Ltd., for the supply and erection of a Petter Oil Engine, 3½ to 5 H. P., for Coagulant Feed Apparatus at Labugama.—

Recommended

(17) To recommend the transfer of a sum of Rs. 450 from vote E. 23 (purchase of bulls) to vote E. 9 (furniture) to meet the cost of the record shelf for the Veterinary Department, estimate for which has been sanctioned by Council on September 1, 1916.—Recommended.

(19) To consider the case of Mr. R. A. Ekanayake, Head Clerk of the City Sanitation Department.—Recommended that Mr. R. A. Ekanayake's salary be fixed at Rs. 1,980 from January 1, 1917, and that he receive an increment of Rs. 84 in 1918 and Rs. 96 in 1919, so as to bring his salary up to the maximum of Rs. 2,160, and that a sum of Rs. 444 be paid to him to cover any discrepancy which may exist, so as to deal with the case for the present, and that, when the question of the establishment is finally settled, the case be considered and Mr. Ekanayake be given the option of accepting the terms of the new Scheme and of waiving any claims he may consider that he hasunder the condition under which he joined the Council.

(21) To recommend the payment of Rs. 16, being balance due to Mr. Bahawoodeen for acting as Interpreter of the Municipal Court, from May 12 to July 31, 1916, at Re. 1 per diem.—Recommended.

(25) To recommend a supplementary vote of Rs. 250, being the contribution from the Council for six months ending December 31, 1916, to the Law Library.—Recommended.

(28) To recommend the retirement of Fireman L. Adjie of the Fire Brigade and the grant to him of a pension of Rs. 90 per annum.—Recommended.

(30) To consider a letter from the Colonial Auditor with regard to the rate charged for water supplied to the Home for Vagrants.—Recommended that a refund be made, as it is considered that the point raised by the Colonial Auditor is correct.

(35) To recommend the adoption of an amended estimate of Rs. 26,500 showing an increase of Rs. 4,914·15 for Front street improvements, making provision for a double track instead of a single track, for which the original estimate was sanctioned.—Recommended.

(36) To recommend a gratuity of Rs. 768 to the widow and 3 minor children of the late Mr. Nicholas de Silva, Clerk, Conservancy Branch of the Works Department: 3 months pay to widow, Rs. 384, 1 month's pay to each of the 3 minor children, Rs. 384.—Recommended.

(39) To recommend that a bicycle allowance of Rs. 10 per mensem be allowed to Overseer C. A. de Fransz of the City Sanitation Department.—Recommended.

(41) To recommend the transfer of Rs. 200 from vote I. 8 (Miscellaneous) to vote I. 4 (Train and Tram fare allowances).—Recommended.

(42) To recommend, under section 147 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the re-transfer of premises Nos. 3,848/194 and 3,849/194, Modera street, vested in the Council, the arrears of rates on which have been paid.—

Recommended.

(43) To recommend a supplementary sum of Rs. 2,000 under vote C. 2 (Secretariat) Legal Expenses.—Recommended.

With regard to item No. 8, Dr. W. P. Rodrigo moved that the consideration of the matter be deferred. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

With regard to item No. 19, Mr. L. B. Fernando moved that the consideration of the matter be postponed until the circulation of the papers is completed. Dr. W. P. Rodrigo seconded.—Carried.

With regard to item No. 30, Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved that the consideration of the matter be deferred and that the papers be circulated. Mr. H. L. de Mel seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that the recommendations of the remaining items of the Standing Committee be adopted.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved that the Council do resume and that the resolution of Council in Committee, as amended, be adopted. Mr. E. G. Jayewardene seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman formally moved in Council that the resolutions of Council in Committee, as amended, be adopted. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.

- 13. Mr. Arthur Alvis moved that, in terms of section 102 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the Chairman's Administration Report for the financial period July 1, 1914, to December 31, 1915, be forwarded to His Excellency the Governor, in due course. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.
- Mr. F. G. Jayewardene moved that the following items on the agenda, viz., Nos. 14 to 16, be adopted. Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried.
