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PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of His Majesty GEORGE THE FIFTH, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir John Anderson, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

NOW Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, do hereby proclaim that His Majesty has issued the Royal Proclamations published in the schedule hereto, and call upon His Majesty's subjects and all other persons being in the said Island to govern themselves accordingly.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Tenth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Seventeen.

SCHEDULE.

BY THE KING.

A PROCLAMATION for Prohibiting the Importation of certain Articles into the United Kingdom.

WHEREAS by section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation:

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain goods should be prohibited as hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows:—

As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following goods is hereby prohibited, viz.:—

Gold, manufactured or unmanufactured, including gold coin and articles consisting partly or or conteining gold.

All manufactures of silver other than silver watches and silver watch cases. Jewellery of any description.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to-

(a) Any such goods which are imported under license given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such license; or

(b) Gold consigned for delivery at, and sale to, the Bank of England.

The Prohibition of Import (No. 11) Proclamation, 1916, is hereby revoked.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No. 12) Proclamation, 1916.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Fifth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Sixteen, and in the Seventh year of Our Reign.

A PROCLAMATION for Prohibiting the Importation of Cocaine and Opium into the United Kingdom. GEORGE R.I.

Whereas by section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation:

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of cocaine or of opium should be prohibited, except as hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows:—

As from and after this date, subject as hereinafter provided, all cocaine and all opium shall be prohibited to be imported into the United Kingdom.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that nothing in this Proclamation shall apply to cocaine or opium imported under the license of one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and in accordance with the provisions of such license.

The word "cocaine" includes all preparations, salts, derivatives, or admixtures prepared therefrom or therewith and containing $0\cdot 1$ per cent. (one part in a thousand) or more of the drug, or any solid or liquid extract of the coca leaf containing $0\cdot 1$ per cent. or more of the drug.

The word "opium" means raw opium, powdered or granulated opium, or opium prepared for smoking, and includes any solid or semi-solid mixture containing opium.

The Cocaine and Opium (Prohibition of Import) Proclamation, 1916, is hereby revoked.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Cocaine and Opium (Prohibition of Import) No. 2 Proclamation, 1916.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Eleventh day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand Nine hundred and Sixteen, and in the Seventh year of Our Reign.

A PROCLAMATION relating to the Importation of certain Articles into the United Kingdom. GEORGE R.I.

Whereas by section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation:

And whereas by various Proclamations entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations the importation of certain goods has been prohibited accordingly:

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain other goods should be prohibited, and the existing prohibition imposed on the importation of certain goods removed:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows:—

(1) As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following goods is hereby prohibited, viz.:—

Automatic machines for the retail sale of any article.

Military rifles and carbines.

Miniature and cadet rifles and carbines.

Revolvers and pistols.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under license given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such license.

(2) As from and after the date hereof the prohibition imposed by the Prohibition of Import (No. 10) Proclamation, 1916, on the importation of the following goods shall be removed, and the said Proclamation amended accordingly, viz. :-

Cotton hosiery.

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No. 13) Proclamation, 1916.

A PROCLAMATION making certain Additions to and Amendments in the List of Articles to be treated as Contraband of War.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS on the 14th day of October, 1915, We did issue Our Royal Proclamation specifying the articles which it was Our intention to treat as contraband during the continuance of hostilities, or until We did give further

Whereas on the 27th day of January, 1916, the 12th day of April, 1916, the 27th day of June, 1916, the 3rd day of October, 1916, and the 23rd day of November, 1916, We did, by Our Royal Proclamations of those dates, make certain additions to and modifications in the said list of articles to be treated as contraband; and

Whereas it is expedient to make certain further additions to the said list:

Now, therefore, We do hereby declare, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, that during the continuance of the war, or until We do give further public notice, the following articles will be treated as absolute contraband, in addition to those set out in Our Royal Proclamations aforementioned :-

Oxalic acid and oxalates.

Formic acid and formates.

Metallic sulphites and thiosulphates.

Soda lime and bleaching powder.

Platinum, osmium, ruthenium, rhodium, palladium, iridium, and the alloys and compounds of these metals.

Strontium salts and compounds thereof.

Sulphate of barium (barytes).

Bone black.

And We do hereby further declare that, as from this date, the following amendments shall be made in Schedule I. of Our Royal Proclamation of the 14th October, 1915, aforementioned :-

For item 8, "ethyl alcohol; methyl alcohol," there shall be substituted "alcohols," including fusel oil and wood spirit, and their derivatives and preparations."

For item 35, "aluminium, alumina, and salts of aluminium," there shall be substituted "aluminium and its alloys, alumina, and salts of aluminium."

For item 41, "wolframite, scheelite," there shall be substituted "fungsten ores."

And We do hereby further declare that, as from this date, the following amendments shall be made in Schedule II. of Our Royal Proclamation of the 14th October, 1915, aforementioned:

For item 5, "fuel, other than mineral oils," there shall be substituted "fuel, including charcoal, other than mineral oils."

WHEREAS in pursuance of the said "The Trading with the Enemy (Amendment No. 2) Ordinance, No. 13 of 1916," We did by Our Proclamation, published in the Government Gazette of the 25th day of August, 1916, publish the Royal Proclamations and Orders of the Lords in Council issued under "The Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915":

And whereas by Our Proclamations, published in the Government Gazettes on the 8th, 15th, and 29th days of September, 20th day of October, 10th day of November, and 8th day of December, 1916, and the 12th and 26th days of January, 1917, We did publish subsequent Orders of the Lords in Council:

And whereas the Lords in Council have issued a further Order dated the 5th day of January, 1917:

Know Ye that We, the Governor of Ceylon, in pursuance of "The Trading with the Enemy (Amendment No. 2) Ordinance, No. 13 of 1916," aforesaid, do hereby publish for general information the aforesaid Order in Council dated the 5th day of January, 1917, appearing in the schedule hereto.

Trading with the Enemy (Neutral Countries) Order (No. 24), 1916.

At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 5th day of January, 1917.

By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

. Whereas His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by section 1, sub-section 1, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom, from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the list contained in the last mentioned Proclamation:

And whereas by section I, sub-section 2, of the said Act, it is provided that any list of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State, such list as so varied or added to being in the last mentioned Proclamation referred to as the "Statutory List":

And whereas the list contained in the last mentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the following effect:—

That the "Statutory List" of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom trading is prohibited, should be further amended by the variation and addition of the names set forth in the schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Note (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having any dealings with any of the persons or firms mentioned in this list, or in any list issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3. A list consolidating all previous lists was published on the 22nd day of December, 1916 (the Consolidating List No. 15a), which, together with the list herewith annexed, contains all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

Note (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the list has more than one address in the same country, all dealings in that country with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses is specifically mentioned.

* Note (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of the 25th day of June and 10th day of November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia, or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

Note (4).—In order to minimize as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared, on application, to inquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph, he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants, in making inquiries, would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the list. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the list as they appear. The lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to His Majesty's Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

Limits of the Board of Improvement, Nuwara Eliya.

Any person contravening a prohibition made under this rule shall be guilty of an offence.

RULES REFERRED TO.

1. No person licensed to carry on the trade of a butcher at Periya Kiniyai shall slaughter any cattle at any place other than Adappanavayalkadu, bounded on the north by Crown land, east by sea bordering Mancholai (Mancholaikadal); south by Crown land called Alankernikadu, and west by Adappanavayal.

2. No cattle shall be slaughtered at the aforesaid place except on such days and between such hours as may be determined by the Assistant Government Agent, Trincomalee, notice of which shall be posted at the Kiniyai Dispensary and at the

Police Vidane's house.

3. No animal shall be slaughtered for human food until after the animal has been exposed for not less than 24 hours in the compound attached to the Periya Kiniyai Police Headman's dwelling house, and until after the animal has been inspected and approved by the Apothecary in charge of Kiniyai Dispensary as fit to be slaughtered for human food. Animals rejected as unfit for slaughter shall be immediately removed.

4. The Apothecary in charge or some person authorized by the Assistant Government Agent, Trincomalee, may prohibit the slaughter of any animal, notwithstanding that it has been approved as aforesaid, if it be found before slaughter that the animal is deceased or otherwise unfit to be slaughtered for

human food.

5. If on any animal which has been approved as aforesaid being slaughtered the carcase shall appear diseased or unfit for human food, the said Apothecary or person authorized by the Assistant Government Agent, Trincomalee, shall cause the meat to be immediately destroyed or disposed of so as to prevent its being exposed for sale or used for human food.

6. The person in charge of the slaughtering place shall not permit the slaughter of any animal which has not been approved as aforesaid as fit to be slaughtered for human food, or the slaughter of any animal which the Apothecary or the person authorized by the Assistant Government Agent, Trincomalee, has prohibited as

provided for in rule 4.

7. No person shall remove from the place appointed for slaughter, except under the directon of the Apothecary or person authorized by the Assistant Government Agent, any meat which the latter has declared to be unfit for human food.

8. It shall not be lawful for any person to slaughter any animal in the public

slaughtering place in the presence of other animals.

9. The person in charge of the slaughtering place shall keep a register in the form annexed of all cattle brought to be slaughtered and forward monthly to the Assistant Government Agent, Trincomalee, on the first day of the following month a true copy of the same:

Every license holder shall on or before the 7th day of every month forward to the Assistant Government Agent, Trincomalee, a true and accurate report of the age, sex, colour, marks, and description of all cattle slaughtered by him in the preceding month, and the names and places of abode of the persons from whom the same were purchased or obtained.

The amount of the bond, and all other necessary information, can be obtained upon application at the office referred to in section 6. A further security in cash of 5 per cent. of the value of contract will be required of the contractor when entering into the bond.

12. Tenderers should read and note a draft contract which is available in the Forest Office, Nuwara Eliya, before they obtain tender forms.

- 13. A penalty of 25 cents for every cubic yard of firewood not felled or stacked or delivered at the monthly rates specified in the schedule below will be exacted from the contractor.
- 14. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.
- 15. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and of accepting any portion of a tender.

16. A rate per cubic yard delivered must be quoted,

written both in words and figures.

17. For any further information application should be made to the Assistant Conservator of Forests, Nuwara Eliya Division, Nuwara Eliya.

SCHEDULE.

Service A.—Conical Hill and Pattipola.

(a) To fell all trees (except enumerated trees), unless otherwise required, standing in blocks demacated adjacently to the railway at Conical Hill and Pattipola, containing approximately 40 and 25 acres respectively, or in extensions thereof not exceeding 20 per cent., or in additional adjoining blocks of not greater length to be demarcated

(b) All felled trees, together with every other fallen tree whatsoever, to be split and converted into firewood so as to yield 12,000 and 8,000 cubic yards more or less at Conical Hill and Pattipola respectively. Each piece of wood to be 3 feet in length and of 2 inches minimum diameter. Billets over 9 inches in diameter should be split. All gum trees should be felled by saw in such a manner as to ensure coppice shoots. All gum firewood should be barked. All wood over 12 inches in girth to be billeted in 3 feet lengths by handsaw or cross-cut saw only. All felling and all

splitting of logs to be completed by March 15, 1918.

(c) All firewood immediately after conversion to be stacked alongside the block reservations or the railway at the minimum rate of 1,150 and 770 cubic yards per month at Conical Hill and Pattipola respectively. This work to be

completed by March 31, 1918.

(d) Firewood to be delivered to the specials at the rate of 1,000 and 670 cubic yards per month at Conical Hill and Pattipola respectively, unless otherwise required. Final delivery to be made on the last Sunday in April, 1918, in which month an additional delivery of 500 and 350 cubic yards respectively to be made.

Service B.—Kandapola.

(a) To fell every tree (excepting enumerated trees), unless otherwise required, standing in a block demarcated in the vicinity of the new service road, Kandapola, 5 acres more or less in extent.

(b) All felled trees, together with every other fallen tree whatsoever in this area, to be converted into firewood so as to yield 1,800 cubic yards more or less. Each piece of wood to be 2 feet in length, and not less than 9 inches nor more than 24 inches in girth. All wood to be billeted into lengths of 2 feet by handsaw or cross-cut saw only.

(c) Firewood to be transported, stacked, and delivered at the Kandapola Railway Station wood stages at the minimum rate of 150 cubic yards per month. Final

delivery to be made on or before April 30, 1918.

Service C .- Galboda.

(a) To supply 4,000 cubic yards more or less of barked gum firewood alongside the Railway Station between 951 and 96¹/₄ mileposts from the Galboda plantations.

(b) The trees to be felled by saw so as to ensure coppice shoots, to be barked, to be cut into lengths of 3 feet, and all billets over 9 inches to be split. Final delivery to be made

by April 30, 1918.

(c) All firewood so felled to be stacked at the minimum rate of 370 cubic yards per month alongside the railway and delivered to the specials at the rate of 330 cubic yards per month and not more or less, unless otherwise required, so as to leave a monthly surplus undelivered against emergency. 500 cubic yards to be delivered in the month of April, 1918.

Services A and B.—To cut all nellu, bamboo, thorns, and undergrowth; to heap the same, together with all wood refuse, in continuous lines half a chain in breadth and separated from each other and adjoining reservations by properly cleared lines half a chain in breadth. This work

to be completed by April 10, 1918.

Services A and B.—To burn off the refuse thus heaped by March 15, 1918. To root out and completely clear of green growth all patches not cleared by firing, and to leave the area in a complete state of fitness throughout for planting by April 30, 1918.

The demaracted blocks will be pointed out by the Assistant Conservator of Forests, Nuwara Eliya, or the Forester, Nuwara Eliya. Any further information can be

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Weekly Health Report of the City of Colombo for the Week ended February 10, 1917.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 146 (1 European, 9 Burghers, 88 Sinhalese, 13 Tamils, 20 Moors, 10 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth-rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on January 1, 1917, viz., 263,629) was 28.9, as against 23.3 in the preceding week, 27.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 21.6 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 147 (11 Burghers, 80 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 22 Moors, 2 Malays, and 5 Others). The death-rate per 1,000 per annum was 29·1, as against 24·1 in the previous week, 28·1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 27·1 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 147 total deaths, 24 were of infants under one year of age, as against 30 in the preceding week, 26 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 25 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Principal Causes of Death.—Twenty deaths from Pneumonia were registered, as against 9 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 12 were in Maradana (including 6 deaths of non-resident in hospitals), 5 in Kotahena, 2 in New Bazaar, and 1 in Slave Island. Two deaths from Bronchitis were registered.

- 2. Twelve deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, as against 8 in the previous week and 16 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 5 were in Maradana (all non-residents in hospitals), 2 in St. Paul's, 2 in Kollupitiya, 1 in Kotahena, 1 in Slave Island, and 1 in Wellawatta.
- 3. Six deaths from *Plague* were registered, as against 3 in the previous week and 4 the weekly average for last year. Of thes⁵, 2 were in St. Paul's, 2 in Wellawatta, 1 in Kotahena, and 1 in New Bazaar. Nine cases were reported, as against 11 in the previous week.
- 4. Two deaths from Enteric Fever were registered, as against 5 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year. Of these, 1 was in Maradana (a non-resident in hospital) and the other in Slave Island.
- 5. One death from *Measles* was registered in New Bazaar. None was registered in the previous week. There were reported 46 cases of *Measles*, as against 34 in the previous week; and 71 cases of *Chickenpox*, as against 49 in the previous week.
- 6. Thirteen deaths from Enteritis were registered, 7 from Infantile Convulsions, 6 from Diarrhæa, 6 from Dysentery, 6 from Debility, 4 from Worms, 1 from Tetanus, and 61 from Other Causes.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79.0°, against 77.5° in the preceding week and 78.1° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.940 in., against 29.849 in. in the preceding week and 29.840 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.36 in., against 0.45 in the preceding week and nil in the corresponding week of the previous year.
